- Remember, O Lord, and have mercy on the hungry, the homeless, the unemployed, the lonely, the destitute, the despairing, the discouraged and depressed. Have mercy, O Lord, on the dying, especially those who are dying alone.
- Remember, O Lord, and have mercy on all those in need of your saving mercy and strength, guidance, direction and consolation.
- Remember, O Lord, and have mercy on those who have fallen asleep in the hope of resurrection and life-everlasting, particularly our spiritual leaders, the founders and members of this parish, and our family members.
- Remember, O Lord, and have mercy on this country, its president, congress, supreme court, governors, civil authorities, armed forces and all of its people. Let your will be done through them for the good of all.
- Remember, O Lord, and have mercy on those who hate us and judge us, those whom we have hated and judged, those who oppose us and those for whom we show no love. Let them not perish through our sinfulness. Give us grace and power to love them with all our hearts.
- Remember, O Lord, and have mercy on those who have asked us, in our unworthiness, to pray for them. Consider their needs, and grant that which is good for their salvation.
- Remember, O Lord, and have mercy on all those whom we have not remembered, for you know each person, his calling, his temptations and needs.

Remember, O Lord, and have mercy on the whole world and all its people. Grant the leaders godly wisdom, and the nations peace.

And remember us, O Lord, who offer these petitions; and have mercy on us!

ALL: Lord have mercy. (3x)

PRIEST: For to you are due all glory, honor and worship: to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever, and to ages of ages.

ALL: Amen.

PRIEST: Forgive, O Lord, those who hate us and those who have wronged us. Do well to those who do well. Grant to our brethren and kin those prayers which are good for salvation and life eternal. Visit the sick and grant them healing. Journey with those who travel by land, sea or air. Direct and help our civil authorities. To those who have served us and been kind to us grant forgiveness of their sins. Have mercy on those who have asked us, in our unworthiness, to pray for them. Remember, O Lord, our parents and brethren who have fallen asleep before us; and give them rest where the light of your countenance shall visit them. Remember, O Lord, those who are in captivity; and release them from the difficulties which beset them. Remember, O Lord, those who bring offerings and the benefactors of your holy churches. Grant them those petitions which are good for their salvation and life eternal. Remember also, O Lord, us, your humble, sinful and unworthy servants. Illumine our minds with the light of your wisdom, and guide us in the way of your commandments, through the prayers of our most holy Lady, Theotokos and ever-virgin Mary, and of all your saints, for you are blessed to ages of ages.

ALL: Amen. Amen.
