SUNDAY, APRIL 30 3rd Sunday of Pascha, Holy Myrrhbearing Women; Holy Apostle James, the brother of St. John the Theologian

"Lord I Call..." Tone 2

Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! Hear <u>me</u>, O Lord! <u>Lord</u>, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! Receive the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call</u> upon You!// Hear me, O Lord!

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>in</u>cense, and <u>let</u> the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice!// <u>Hear me</u>, O Lord!

V. (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your name!
V. (9) The righteous will surround me; for You will deal bountifully with me.

Tone 2 *(for the Resurrection)*

Come, let us worship the <u>Word</u> of God begotten of the Father before all <u>ages</u>, and in<u>car</u>nate of the Virgin <u>Mary</u>! Having en<u>dured</u> the Cross, He was buried as He Him<u>self</u> desired.// And having risen from the dead, He saved me, an <u>er</u>ring man.

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

Christ our <u>Sav</u>ior nailed to the Cross the bond against us, He <u>void</u>ed it and destroyed the do<u>min</u>ion of death.// We fall down before His Resurrection on the <u>third</u> day.

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

With the Arch<u>ang</u>els let us praise the Resur<u>rec</u>tion of Christ! He is our <u>Sav</u>ior, our Re<u>deem</u>er. He is coming with awesome glory and mighty <u>pow</u>er// to judge the <u>world</u> which He made.

V. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

Tone 2 *(from the Pentecostarion, by Anatolius)*

Early in the morning,

the myrrhbearing women brought spices to the <u>tomb</u> of the Lord. They <u>found</u> the stone unexpectedly <u>rolled</u> away, and they <u>asked</u> among themselves: "Where are the <u>seals</u> of the tomb? <u>Where</u> are <u>Pilate's guards?</u>" The radiant Angel came to the wondering women and pro<u>claimed</u> to them: "Why do you seek with tears the Life Who gives life to the <u>hu</u>man race? Christ our <u>God</u> has risen from the dead as al<u>mighty</u>,// granting us incorruption, life, enlightenment, and great <u>mer</u>cy!"

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

O women dis<u>ciples</u>, why do you mingle <u>myrrh</u> with your tears? The <u>stone</u> is gone; the tomb is <u>emp</u>ty. Behold, corruption de<u>stroyed</u> by life! The seals witness that the guards of the godless have <u>watched</u> in vain. Mortal <u>na</u>ture has been saved by the <u>flesh</u> of God. Hell is <u>wail</u>ing. Go with joy, and proclaim to the A<u>pos</u>tles: "<u>Christ</u> has slain death as the <u>first</u>-born of the dead.// He awaits you in <u>Gal</u>ilee!"

V. (4) *From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!*

The Myrrhbearers came early to Your <u>tomb</u>, O Christ, seeking You to anoint Your most pure <u>Bo</u>dy. En<u>light</u>ened by the <u>Ang</u>el's words, they proclaimed joyous tidings to the A<u>pos</u>tles: "The Leader of our sal<u>va</u>tion has been raised; <u>He</u> has <u>cap</u>tured death,// granting the world eternal life and great <u>mercy</u>!"

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and *He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.*

Tone 4 (from the Menaion, for St. James) (As one valiant among the martyrs)

You drew men up from the depths of <u>van</u>ity with a fisherman's <u>rod</u> of grace. You o<u>beyed</u> the commands of the Teacher, O <u>worthy</u> James, Who enlightened <u>all</u> your thoughts and revealed you as an Apostle and <u>holy preacher</u>,// for you expounded His incomprehensible divinity, O most <u>bless</u>ed one.

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

The illumination of the Spirit descended on you in the <u>form</u> of fire and made you a divine vessel, O <u>bless</u>ed one, dis<u>pel</u>ling with power the darkness of <u>god</u>lessness; enlightening the world with the brightness of your all-<u>wise</u> words, O preacher of mysteries, O leader of the A<u>pos</u>tles,// James, the eye-<u>wit</u>ness of Christ.

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

You illumined those lying in the darkness of <u>ignorance</u> with the lightning flash of your preaching, O <u>glo</u>rious James. You re<u>vealed</u> them to be sons through faith of the <u>Mas</u>ter and God Whose passion and death you did <u>im</u>itate with zeal. You became an heir of <u>glo</u>ry, O <u>wise</u> one,// as one speaking from God, and a most faithful dis<u>ci</u>ple.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 6 *(from the Pentecostarion)*

The myrrhbearing women <u>reached</u> Your tomb and saw the seals of the tomb <u>broken</u>. Not finding Your most pure Body, they lamented, <u>say</u>ing: "Who has <u>stolen</u> our hope? Who has taken the dead One, naked and a<u>noint</u>ed, the sole consolation of His <u>Moth</u>er? How can the Life of the <u>dead</u> have died? How can the Capturer of hell have been <u>bur</u>ied?// But arise in three days as You said, O Savior, and <u>save</u> our souls!"

Tone 2 (*Theotokion – Dogmatikon*)

The shadow of the Law passed when <u>grace</u> came; as the Bush burned, yet was <u>not</u> consumed, so the <u>Virgin</u> gave birth, yet remained a <u>Virgin</u>. The Righteous Sun has risen instead of a <u>pil</u>lar of flame.// Instead of Moses, Christ, the Sal<u>va</u>tion of our souls.

Aposticha

Tone 2 *(for the Resurrection)*

Your Resurrection, O Christ our <u>Sav</u>ior, has enlightened the whole <u>u</u>niverse, re<u>call</u>ing Your creation.// Glory to You, O al<u>mighty</u> Lord!

(Then the Paschal Stichera with their verses from Psalm 67)

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 1 (from the Menaion, for St. James)

You <u>fol</u>lowed Christ and de<u>spised</u> the world, keeping His teachings in your treasury, O <u>god</u>ly James. You were re<u>vealed</u> to be His A<u>pos</u>tle. Therefore, going to the nations with the com<u>mand</u>ments of the <u>Sav</u>ior, you en<u>light</u>ened the souls in the darkness of delusion and <u>pas</u>sion,// that they might believe in the consubstantial <u>Trin</u>ity.

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 5 *(from the Pentecostarion)*

Joseph, together with Nicodemus, took You down from the Tree, Who <u>clothe</u> Yourself with light as with a <u>gar</u>ment. He gazed on Your body – dead, naked, and unburied, and, in grief and tender compassion, he lamented: "<u>Woe</u> is me, my sweetest <u>Je</u>sus! A short while ago, the sun beheld You hanging on the Cross, and it hid itself in darkness. The earth quaked in fear at the sight. The <u>veil</u> of the Temple was <u>torn</u> in two. Lo, now I see You willingly submit to death for our sake. How shall I bury You, O my God? How can I wrap You in a shroud? How can I touch Your most pure Body with my hands? What songs can I sing for Your exodus, O compassionate One? I magnify Your Passion. I glorify Your burial, and Your holy Resurrection, crying, 'O Lord, glory to You!'"

"Christ is risen from the dead, trampling down death by death, and upon those in the tombs bestowing life!" *(once)* (at Great Vespers)

Tone 2 Troparion (*Resurrection*)

When You de<u>scend</u>ed to death, O Life Im<u>mor</u>tal, You slew hell with the splendor of Your <u>God</u>head. And <u>when</u> from the depths You <u>raised</u> the dead, all the powers of <u>heav</u>en cried out:// "O Giver of life, Christ our <u>God</u>, <u>glory</u> to You!"

Tone 8Troparion (St. James)

(at the Divine Liturgy)

Tone 2Troparion(Resurrection)

When You de<u>scend</u>ed to death, O Life Im<u>mor</u>tal, You slew hell with the splendor of Your <u>God</u>head. And <u>when</u> from the depths You <u>raised</u> the dead, all the powers of <u>heav</u>en cried out:// "O Giver of life, Christ our <u>God</u>, <u>glory</u> to You!"

Tone 2Troparion (Pentecostarion)

The noble Joseph,

when he had taken down Your most pure <u>Body</u> from the Tree, <u>wrapped</u> it in fine linen and anointed it with <u>spices</u>, and placed it in a <u>new</u> tomb. But You <u>rose</u> on the <u>third</u> day, O Lord,// granting the world great mercy.

Tone 8 Troparion (*St. James*)

You were <u>called</u> to be a dis<u>ciple</u> and <u>war</u>rior of Christ, one of the exalted choir of A<u>pos</u>tles.

With your <u>brother John</u>, you a<u>ban</u>doned all to follow the <u>Mas</u>ter, O James; you were <u>filled</u> with the <u>Holy Spirit</u> and pro<u>claimed</u> Him to all.

You bowed your <u>head</u> to the <u>sword</u>, the first of the twelve to <u>shed</u> your blood!// We cele<u>brate</u> your <u>memory</u>, O <u>bless</u>ed one!

Tone 2 Kontakion (*St. James*)

O James, when you heard the voice of the Word calling you,

you abandoned your father's love and ran to Christ, together with your <u>broth</u>er John.

With <u>him</u> you were accounted <u>wor</u>thy// to behold the divine Transfiguration of Christ.

Tone 2Kontakion (Pentecostarion)

You com<u>mand</u>ed the Myrrhbearers to rejoice, O <u>Christ</u> God. By Your Resurrection, You stopped the lamentation of Eve, the first <u>moth</u>er. You com<u>mand</u>ed them to preach to Your A<u>pos</u>tles:// "The <u>Sav</u>ior is <u>ris</u>en from the tomb!"

Note: The Kontakion of Pascha is not sung on this day.

Tone 6 Prokeimenon

O Lord, save Your people, / and bless Your inheritance! (Ps. 27:9a)

V. To You, O Lord, will I call. O my God, be not silent to me! (Ps. 27:1a)

Tone 8Prokeimenon(St. James)

Their proclamation has gone out into all the earth, / and their words to the ends of the universe. (*Ps.* 18:4)
