"Lord I Call..." Tone 3

Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me. Hear <u>me</u>, O Lord. Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me. Receive the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call</u> upon You.// <u>Hear me</u>, O Lord.

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>in</u>cense, and let the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice.// <u>Hear me</u>, O Lord.

V. (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your name!
V. (9) The righteous will surround me; for You will deal bountifully with me.

Tone 3 *(for the Resurrection)*

By Your Cross, O Christ our <u>Sav</u>ior, death's dominion has been <u>shat</u>tered; the devil's de<u>lu</u>sion destroyed. The race of man, being <u>saved</u> by faith,// always <u>offers You</u> a song.

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

All has been enlightened by Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion, O Lord. Paradise has been <u>opened again</u>. All creation, <u>prais</u>ing You,// always <u>offers You</u> a song.

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

I glorify the power of the <u>Fa</u>ther and the Son. I praise the authority of the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit: the undivided, uncreated <u>Godhead</u>,// the consubstantial Trinity which <u>reigns</u> for<u>ev</u>er.

V. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

Tone 1 *Idiomela* (from the Pentecostarion)

With Your pure <u>hand</u>, You cre<u>a</u>ted man, and You came to heal the sick, O com<u>pas</u>sionate Christ. By Your <u>word</u> You raised the paralytic at the <u>Sheep's</u> Pool, and cured the pain of the <u>wo</u>man with the <u>is</u>sue of blood. You had <u>mer</u>cy on the daughter of the Canaanite <u>wo</u>man, and did not reject the request of the cen<u>tu</u>rion. <u>There</u>fore we <u>cry</u> to You:// "Glory to You, O al<u>mighty</u> Lord!"

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

The Paralytic was like an unburied corpse. He saw You and shouted: "Lord, have mercy on me! My bed has become my grave! Why should I live? What use is the Sheep's Pool to me? I have no one to put me into the pool when the waters are stirred, but I come to You, O Fountain of healing. Raise me up, that with all I may cry to You:// 'Glory to You, O almighty Lord!'"

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

Tone 6^{*} (from the Menaion, for St. Alexis)

Come, all who <u>love</u> the saints, let us honor the new <u>Man</u> of God, a fruitful branch of Christ, the <u>True</u> Vine, a defender of the <u>Orth</u>odox Church, the thrice-blessed Priest A<u>lex</u>is,// our father and <u>teach</u>er!

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

Zealous for the <u>Law</u> of God, King Josiah taught Israel to serve <u>only</u> the Lord. Our divinely-wise Father A<u>lex</u>is guided his people to the <u>Orth</u>odox Faith, teaching them to <u>cry</u> aloud:// "O Lord, have <u>mer</u>cy on us!"

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

Our holy Father A<u>lex</u>is, guided by the <u>Spir</u>it of Truth, exposed the error of <u>ignorance</u> and led his people to the <u>True</u> Faith. In humility concealing his virtues from <u>others</u>,// he thereby received a heavenly crown.

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

Today the Church celebrates a <u>feast</u> of great joy, for the holy Priest Alexis guides his sheep back to the <u>know</u>ledge of the Truth, watering them with the ever-flowing fountain of his <u>teach</u>ings, and in<u>struct</u>ing them to sing:// "Glory to God for His great <u>mer</u>cy!"

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; **Tone 5** (from the Pentecostarion)

Jesus went up to Je<u>ru</u>salem.

He came to the Sheep's Pool, called in Hebrew "Be<u>thes</u>da." It had five <u>porch</u>es, each filled with a <u>mul</u>titude of the sick, for at certain <u>times</u> an angel of the Lord stirred up the <u>wa</u>ter, and granted strength to those who ap<u>proached</u> in faith. <u>There</u> the Lord saw a man who for many years had been af<u>flict</u>ed. He <u>said</u>: "Do you <u>want</u> to be whole?" The sick man re<u>plied</u> to the Lord: "I have no <u>man</u> to lower me into the pool when the <u>wa</u>ter is stirred. I have <u>spent</u> all my wealth on phy<u>sic</u>ians, but have not been granted <u>mer</u>cy!" Then the Phy<u>sic</u>ian of souls and bodies <u>said</u> to him: "Take <u>up</u> your <u>bed</u> and walk!// Proclaim My power and great <u>mer</u>cy to the <u>ends</u> of the earth!"

Tone 3 (*Theotokion – Dogmatikon*)

How can we not <u>won</u>der at your mystical childbearing, O exalted <u>Mother</u>? For without receiving the <u>touch</u> of man, you gave birth to a Son in the flesh, O immaculate <u>Virgin</u>. The Son born of the Father before e<u>ter</u>nity was born of you at the fullness of time, O honored <u>La</u>dy. He underwent no mingling, no change, no di<u>vi</u>sion, but preserved the fullness of each <u>na</u>ture. Entreat Him, O Lady and Virgin, and <u>Mo</u>ther, to save the souls of those who, in the Orthodox manner, con<u>fess</u> you// to be the <u>Theoto</u>kos.

Tone 8 *(from the Pentecostarion)*

<u>Sol</u>omon's porch was <u>filled</u> with the sick.
In the <u>mid</u>dle of the feast,
Christ found a man who had been <u>paralyzed</u> for <u>thirty-eight years</u>.
He shouted to him in a com<u>mand</u>ing voice:
"Do you <u>want</u> to be healed?"
The sick man replied: "Lord, when the water is stirred, I have no man to <u>low</u>er me <u>into</u> the pool."
The Lord <u>said</u> to him:
"Pick <u>up</u> your bed!
Now that you are <u>healed</u>, see that you <u>sin</u> no more!"

The mystery of all e<u>ter</u>nity, unknown even by <u>Ang</u>els, through you, Theotokos, is revealed to <u>those</u> on earth: God incarnate by union without con<u>fu</u>sion. He voluntarily accepted the <u>Cross</u> for us, by which He resurrected the first-cre<u>a</u>ted man,// saving our <u>souls</u> from death.

(at the Divine Liturgy)

Tone 3 Troparion (*Resurrection*)

He called back sheep who had been <u>led</u> astray and <u>brought</u> them by his <u>preaching</u>// to the <u>Heav</u>enly <u>King</u>dom.

Tone 3 Kontakion (Pentecostarion)

By Your di<u>vine</u> inter<u>ces</u>sion, O Lord, as You raised up the Para<u>lyt</u>ic of old, so raise up my soul, paralyzed by sins and <u>thought</u>less acts; so that being saved I may <u>sing</u> to You:// "Glory to Your <u>pow</u>er, O com<u>pas</u>sionate Christ!"

Note: The Kontakion of Pascha is not sung on this day.

Tone 1Prokeimenon(Pentecostarion)

Let Your mercy, O Lord, be upon us / as we have set our hope on You! (Ps. 32:22)

V. Rejoice in the Lord, O you righteous! Praise befits the just! (Ps. 32:1)

Tone 7Prokeimenon(St. Alexis)

The righteous shall rejoice in the Lord / and shall hope in Him. (Ps. 63:11a)
