Midfeast of Pentecost, Apostle Simon the Zealot

"Lord I Call..." Tone 4

Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! <u>Hear</u> me, O Lord! <u>Lord</u>, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! Receive the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call</u> up<u>on</u> You!// Hear me, O Lord!

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>in</u>cense, and <u>let</u> the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice!// Hear me, O Lord!

- V. (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your name!
- **V**. (9) The righteous will surround me; for You will deal bountifully with me.
- V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!
- V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!
- **V.** (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

Tone 4 (from the Pentecostarion) (You ascended the Cross)

The middle of the <u>days</u> has come, beginning with the Savior's Resur<u>rec</u>tion, and <u>sealed</u> by the holy <u>Pen</u>tecost.

The first and the last glisten with <u>splen</u>dor. We rejoice in the <u>un</u>ion of <u>both</u> feasts, as we draw near to the Lord's As<u>cen</u>sion:// the sign of our coming glorification.

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

Be glad, O Zion!

Hear the announcement of Christ's Resur<u>rec</u>tion!

Let her <u>faithful</u> sons rejoice!

The filth of the daughter of Zion is washed away.

Jerusalem, stained with the blood of God's murder, is <u>cleansed</u> by the <u>Spirit.//</u> With songs of joy she celebrates the middle of the feast.

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

As it is <u>writ</u>ten, the abundant outpouring of divine gifts is <u>drawing</u> near. The <u>cho</u>sen day of the Spirit is <u>half</u>way come. The true promise of Christ to the Dis<u>ci</u>ples after His death, burial, and Resur<u>rec</u>tion,// heralds the coming of the <u>Com</u>forter.

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

Tone 4 (from the Menaion, for St. Simon) (You have given a sign)

The wondrous Simon, boast of the A<u>pos</u>tles, passed across the earth like a brilliant <u>light</u>ning bolt. He di<u>spelled</u> the darkness of i<u>dol</u>atry with his saving, brilliant and divine <u>teachings</u>. He enlightened all people to glorify one <u>God</u> in three <u>Per</u>sons,//indivisible and undi<u>vid</u>ed.

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

Like a rolling wheel, the blessed <u>Si</u>mon ran swiftly through the <u>ends</u> of the earth. He burned a<u>way</u> the madness of idolatry from <u>all</u> the land, lighting brilliant beacons with <u>pi</u>ety, he kindled luminous fires of <u>grace</u> for the <u>faithful</u> that they may worship one God in three <u>Per</u>sons,//indivisible and undivided.

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

The most radiant and all-wondrous Apostle <u>Si</u>mon, the teacher of the nations, the <u>net</u> of God, draws us <u>up</u> from the depth of per<u>di</u>tion with the height of the<u>ology!</u>
The true preacher now wisely leads all to the <u>know</u>ledge of Christ. He sets before us his accom<u>plish</u>ments// as a pleasing feast of all <u>good</u> things.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 2 (from the Menaion, for St. Simon)

You were called the namesake of zeal, O admirable <u>Simon</u>, for with zeal you imitated the all-<u>powerful</u> God. He re<u>vealed</u> you to be filled with divine <u>mir</u>acles, for having unusual zeal, O <u>blessed</u> one, you were aptly called the <u>zeal</u>ot, and obtained a calling consistent with your <u>character</u>. Therefore, as you dwell on high with the choirs of <u>heaven</u>, entreat the Word, O <u>seer</u> of God,// that He grant us great <u>mercy!</u>

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 6 *(from the Pentecostarion)*

We have as<u>sem</u>bled, O Christ, to praise the miracle of Your <u>mys</u>teries: the midfeast of Your Resurrection and the coming of Your Holy <u>Spir</u>it.// Send down on us great <u>mer</u>cy!

Tone 1 *Idiomela (from the Pentecostarion, by John the Monk)*

The <u>mid</u>dle of the fifty <u>days</u> is here, wherein Christ manifested His divine <u>power</u>. He <u>healed</u> the paralytic, raising him from his <u>bed</u> by a word. In the flesh He worked <u>signs</u> and <u>won</u>ders,//granting mankind eternal life and great <u>mer</u>cy.

V. Remember Your congregation, which You have gotten of old! (Ps. 73:2)

You <u>came</u> to the Temple, O <u>Wis</u>dom of God, in the <u>mid</u>dle of the feast to <u>teach</u> and edify the Jews, the Scribes, and the <u>Phar</u>isees. "Let him who thirsts come to Me and <u>drink</u> the <u>wa</u>ter of life! He will <u>nev</u>er <u>thirst</u> again! Whoever believes in Me, streams of living water shall <u>flow</u> from him." Tone 2

Tone 6 (from the Menaion, for St. Simon)

Most holy Simon, Disciple and Apostle of Christ, like a high-flying eagle you soared over creation. You burned up the falsehood of idolatry with the fiery sound of your teachings, leading the nations out of the depths of ignorance into the knowledge of God.//
Now pray to Christ that He be merciful to us on the Day of Judgment!

Tone 8 *(from the Pentecostarion)*

O <u>Sav</u>ior, while You were teaching the Jews in the <u>midst</u> of the feast, they murmured: "How can this man be learnéd, who never <u>stud</u>ied?" They would not believe that You are the <u>Wis</u>dom Who created the world.// O Lord, <u>glo</u>ry to You!

Tone 3 Troparion (St. Simon)

O holy Apostle <u>Simon</u>, pray to the <u>mer</u>ciful God that he will <u>grant</u> to our souls // remission of our transgressions!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 8 Troparion (Midfeast)

In the middle <u>of</u> the <u>feast</u>, O <u>Sav</u>ior, fill my thirsting <u>soul</u> with the <u>wa</u>ters of piety, as You <u>cried</u> to all: "If anyone <u>thirst</u>, let him <u>come</u> to <u>Me</u> and drink!"// O Christ God, <u>Fountain</u> of our <u>life</u>, <u>glory</u> to You!

(at the Divine Liturgy)

Tone 8 Troparion (*Midfeast*)

In the middle <u>of</u> the <u>feast</u>, O <u>Savior</u>, fill my thirsting <u>soul</u> with the <u>waters</u> of piety, as You <u>cried</u> to all: "If anyone <u>thirst</u>, let him <u>come</u> to <u>Me</u> and drink!"// O Christ God, Fountain of our life, glory to You!

Tone 3 Troparion (St. Simon)

O holy Apostle <u>Simon</u>, pray to the <u>mer</u>ciful God that he will <u>grant</u> to our souls // re<u>mis</u>sion of our trans<u>gres</u>sions!

Tone 2 Kontakion (St. Simon)

With <u>praise</u> let us all bless Simon, the <u>her</u>ald of God, who established the doctrines of wisdom securely in the souls of the <u>pi</u>ous! Now he <u>stands</u> before the throne of <u>glo</u>ry,// and, rejoicing with the Angels, he un<u>ceasingly prays</u> for us all.

Tone 4 Kontakion (*Midfeast*)

Christ God, the Creator and Master of all, cried to all in the midst of the feast of the Law: "Come and draw the water of immortality!"
We fall before You and faithfully cry://
"Grant us Your mercies, for You are the Fountain of our life!"

Tone 3 Prokeimenon (Midfeast)

Great is our Lord, and abundant in power, / His understanding is beyond measure. (*Ps.* 146:5)

V. Praise the Lord! For it is good to sing praises to our God! (Ps. 146:1)

Tone 8 Prokeimenon (St. Simon)

Their proclamation has gone out into all the earth, / and their words to the ends of the universe. (Ps. 18:4)
