6th Sunday of Pascha, Blind Man

Holy Equals-to-the-Apostles Emperor Constantine and his mother, Helen

"Lord I Call..." Tone 5

Lord, I call upon You, hear me! Hear me, O Lord! Lord, I call upon You, hear me! Receive the voice of my prayer, when I call upon You!// Hear me, O Lord!

Let my prayer arise in Your sight as incense, and let the lifting up of my hands be an evening sacrifice!//
Hear me, O Lord!

- **V.** (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name!
- **V**. (9) The righteous will surround me, for You will deal bountifully with me.
- V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

Tone 5 *(for the Resurrection)*

By Your <u>pre</u>cious <u>Cross</u>, O Christ, You have put the <u>dev</u>il to shame. By Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion, You have blunted the <u>sting</u> of sin and <u>saved</u> us from the <u>gates</u> of death.// We glorify You, O <u>only</u> begotten One.

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

<u>Christ</u> was led as a sheep to the <u>slaugh</u>ter in order to grant Resurrection to the <u>hu</u>man race. The <u>princes</u> of hell were <u>fright</u>ened by this, for the <u>gates</u> of sorrow were <u>lift</u>ed. Christ the King of glory had <u>en</u>tered, <u>say</u>ing to those in <u>chains</u>: "Go forth!"// And to those in <u>darkness</u>: "Come to the light!"

V. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

O great wonder!

The Creator of the invisible suffered in the flesh in His <u>love</u> for man and <u>rose</u> again im<u>mor</u>tal.

Come, O sons of nations,

let us worship Him,

for delivered from error by His compassion,//

we have learned to sing of one <u>God</u> in three <u>Per</u>sons!

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

Tone 2 *Idiomela (from the Pentecostarion)*

The man blind from birth <u>asked</u> himself:

"Was I born blind because of my parents' sins?

Or am I a living sign of the people's <u>faith</u>lessness?

I am not content to continue asking whether it is <u>night</u> or day.

My feet can no longer endure <u>trip</u>ping on the stones.

I have seen <u>nothing</u>: neither the sun shining, nor the image of my <u>Maker.//</u> But I entreat You, O Christ God, look upon me and have mercy on me!"

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

Jesus, passing by the Temple, met a man <u>blind</u> from birth.

He had compassion on him and put spittle on his eyes,

saying: "Go, wash in the pool of Siloam!"

He washed himself and then gave glory to God.

His neighbors <u>asked</u> him:

"Who opened your eyes, which no one could heal before?"

He cried out: "A man called Jesus <u>said</u> to me:

'Wash in Siloam!' and now I see;

He is <u>truly</u> the Christ, the Messiah Whom Moses fore<u>told</u> in the Law.//

He is the <u>Savior</u> of our souls!"

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

Tone 4 (for Sts. Constantine and Helen) (You have given a sign)

You gave Your precious Cross to the <u>Emperor</u> as a most powerful <u>weapon</u>.

Through <u>it</u> he reigned righteously on earth, shining with <u>god</u>liness. By Your compassion he was counted worthy of Your heavenly <u>King</u>dom. Therefore with him we glorify Your dispensation, O al<u>migh</u>ty <u>Je</u>sus,// the Savior of our souls and the Lover of man.

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

As the King of kings, the Lord Who <u>reigns</u> over all, You, O Lover of man, granted Your servant the wisdom of <u>Sol</u>omon, the <u>meekness of David</u>, and the Orthodox faith of the A<u>pos</u>tles.

Therefore we glorify Your dispensation, O al<u>mighty Jesus,//</u> the Savior of our souls and the <u>Lover of man</u>.

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

O ever-memorable **Emperor**,

you were the first willingly to submit the royal <u>pur</u>ple to Christ, <u>rec</u>ognizing Him as true God and <u>King</u> of all, the great Benefactor and Source of <u>vic</u>tory.

You saw Him set above every principality and <u>power</u>.

Therefore Jesus made the kingdom prosper for you, O lover of <u>vir</u>tue, for he is the Savior of our souls and the Lover of man.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 5 *(from the Pentecostarion)*

Passing by the way, O Lord,

You met a man blind from birth.

Your Disciples were <u>puz</u>zled and asked:

"Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?" Jesus answered: "It was not that this man sinned, or his parents, but that the works of God might be revealed in him.

I must <u>work</u> the works of Him Who sent me, which no one <u>else</u> can do." As He said this, He spat on the ground and made clay of the <u>spit</u>tle, and a<u>noint</u>ed the man's eyes with the clay and <u>said</u> to him:

"Go, wash in the pool of Siloam!"

He went and washed, and was made whole, crying: "Lord, I believe!"// He worshipped You, and we <u>cry</u>: "Have <u>mer</u>cy on us!"

Tone 5 (*Theotokion – Dogmatikon*)

In the Red Sea of old, a type of the Virgin Bride was prefigured. There Moses divided the waters; here Gabriel assisted in the miracle. There Israel crossed the sea without getting wet, here the Virgin gave birth to Christ without seed. After Israel's passage, the sea remained impassable; after Emmanuel's birth, the Virgin remained a Virgin. O ever-existing God Who appeared as Man,// O Lord, have mercy on us!

Tone 5 *(for the Resurrection)*

We <u>magnify</u> You in <u>songs</u> of praise,
O incarnate Christ and <u>Sav</u>ior.
By ac<u>cepting</u> the Cross and <u>death</u> for our sake, as the <u>Lord</u> and <u>Lover</u> of man,
You overthrew the <u>gates</u> of hell,//
and arose on the <u>third</u> day, <u>sav</u>ing our souls.

(Then the Paschal Stichera with their verses from Psalm 67)

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 8 (for Sts. Constantine and Helen)

Brightly shining moon and star of evening, you were turned from unbelief to faith in the true God, and were led to sanctify the people and city.

Beholding the figure of the Cross in the sky, you heard from above:

"Conquer with this Cross, in which lies victory over your enemies!"

Receiving wisdom from the Holy Spirit, you were anointed as holy emperor, establishing and supporting the Church of God.

O father of Orthodox emperors,

Constantine, Equal to the Apostles, whose relics pour forth healings://ever intercede for our souls!

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 8 *(from the Pentecostarion)*

O <u>Christ</u> God, Sun of <u>Right</u>eousness, by Your touch You en<u>light</u>ened all. Give sight <u>now</u> to our <u>spir</u>itual eyes, and show us to be <u>sons</u> of the day! Great is Your ineffable <u>good</u>ness towards us!// O Lover of man, <u>glory</u> to You!

"Christ is risen from the dead, ... (once)

(at Great Vespers)

Tone 5 Troparion (Resurrection)

Let <u>us</u>, the faithful, praise and <u>wor</u>ship the Word, co-eternal with the Father and the <u>Spirit</u>, <u>born</u> for our salvation from the <u>Virgin</u>; for He <u>willed</u> to be lifted up on the <u>Cross</u> in the flesh, to en<u>dure</u> death, and to <u>raise</u> the dead// by His <u>glorious</u> Resurrection.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit,

Tone 8 Troparion (Sts. Constantine and Helen)

Your servant, <u>Constantine</u>, O <u>Lord</u> and only <u>Lover</u> of man, beheld the <u>figure</u> of the <u>Cross</u> in the <u>heavens</u>. Like Paul, not <u>having received</u> his <u>call</u> from men, but as an a<u>postle</u> among <u>rulers</u> set by Your hand over the royal <u>city</u>,// he preserved <u>lasting peace</u> through the prayers of the Theo<u>to</u>kos.

Tone 8 Resurrectional Dismissal Theotokion

For our sake You were <u>born</u> of <u>the Virgin</u> and endured cruci<u>fix</u>ion, O <u>Good</u> One, destroying <u>death</u> by death.

Revealing the <u>Resurrection</u> as God, do not despise the <u>work</u> of Your hand!

Reveal Your <u>love</u> for <u>man</u>, O Merciful One, and accept the Theotokos <u>pray</u>ing for us,//

and save the despairing <u>people</u>, O our <u>Savior!</u>

(at the Divine Liturgy)

Tone 5 Troparion (*Resurrection*)

Let <u>us</u>, the faithful, praise and <u>wor</u>ship the Word, co-eternal with the Father and the <u>Spir</u>it, <u>born</u> for our salvation from the <u>Virgin</u>; for He <u>willed</u> to be lifted up on the <u>Cross</u> in the flesh, to en<u>dure</u> death, and to <u>raise</u> the dead// by His glorious Resurrection.

Tone 8 Troparion (Sts. Constantine and Helen)

Your servant, <u>Constantine</u>, O <u>Lord</u> and only <u>Lover of man</u>, beheld the <u>figure of the Cross</u> in the <u>heavens</u>.

Like Paul, not <u>having received</u> his <u>call</u> from men, but as an a<u>pos</u>tle among <u>rul</u>ers set by Your hand over the royal <u>city</u>,// he preserved <u>lasting peace</u> through the prayers of the Theo<u>to</u>kos.

Tone 3 Kontakion (Sts. Constantine and Helen)

Today <u>Con</u>stantine and his mother Helen reveal the <u>pre</u>cious Cross, the weapon of Orthodox Christians against their <u>en</u>emies,// for it is manifest for us as a great and <u>fear</u>ful sign in <u>struggle</u>.

Tone 4 Kontakion (Pentecostarion)

I come to You, O Christ, blind from birth in my <u>spir</u>itual eyes, and call to You in re<u>pent</u>ance://
"You are the most radiant Light of those in darkness."

Note: The Kontakion of Pascha is not sung on this day.

Tone 8 Prokeimenon (Pentecostarion)

Pray and make your vows / before the Lord, our God! (Ps. 75:10a)

V. In Judah God is known; His name is great in Israel. (Ps. 75:1)

Tone 8 Prokeimenon (Sts. Constantine and Helen)

Their proclamation has gone out into all the earth, / and their words to the ends of the universe. (Ps. 18:4)
