"Lord I Call..." Tone 6*

Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! <u>Hear</u> me, O Lord! Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! Receive the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call</u> upon You!// Hear <u>me</u>, O Lord!

V. **(3)** *For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.*

Beholding Your Ascension on the holy <u>mountain</u>, O Christ, the brightness of the Father's <u>glory</u>, we hymn the radiant appearance of Your <u>coun</u>tenance; we worship Your <u>Pas</u>sion, we honor Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion, as we glorify Your glorious As<u>cen</u>sion.// Have <u>mer</u>cy on us!

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

Lord, when You had fulfilled the mystery of Your dispen<u>sation</u>, You took Your Dis<u>ciples</u> with You, up onto the Mount of <u>Olives</u>; and behold! For my sake You became <u>poor</u> like me, and ascended to the place from where You were never <u>part</u>ed.// Send forth Your All-holy Spirit to il<u>lu</u>mine our souls!

Tone 6 *(from the Pentecostarion)*

Not parted from the Father's bosom, O sweetest Jesus, and having lived among those on <u>earth</u> as man, today You have been taken up in glory from the Mount of Olives, and in Your compassion exalting our fallen <u>na</u>ture, You have seated it with the Father. Therefore the heavenly ranks of the Bodiless Powers were amazed at the wonder, and beside themselves with fear; and seized with trembling, they magnified Your love for mankind. With them, we on earth also give glory for Your condescension to us and Your Ascension from us; and we supplicate You, <u>saying</u>: "At Your Ascension You filled with boundless joy the Disciples and the Theotokos who bore You; by their prayers make us also worthy of the joy of Your elect through Your great mercy!"

Tone 1 Idiomela (from the Pentecostarion)

Having as<u>cend</u>ed to heaven from where You had de<u>scend</u>ed, do not leave us <u>orph</u>ans, O Lord! May Your Holy <u>Spir</u>it come, bringing <u>peace</u> to the world; show the sons of men the <u>works</u> of Your <u>pow</u>er,// O Lord Who love mankind!

You as<u>cend</u>ed, O Christ, to Your <u>Fa</u>ther, Who is without be<u>gin</u>ning, though <u>You</u> were never parted from His uncircumscribed <u>bos</u>om, and the heavenly Powers accepted no addition to the thrice-<u>holy hymn</u> of praise, but <u>recognized You</u>, O Lord, as one Son, only-begotten of the <u>Fa</u>ther even after be<u>com</u>ing man.// In the abundance of Your compassion, have <u>mer</u>cy on us! Your <u>Ang</u>els, O Lord, said to the A<u>pos</u>tles: "Men of Galilee, why do you stand gazing up into <u>heav</u>en? This is Christ <u>God</u> Who has been taken from you into <u>heav</u>en. He it <u>is</u> Who will <u>come</u> again in like <u>man</u>ner as you have seen Him going to <u>heav</u>en:// worship Him in holiness and <u>right</u>eousness!"

Tone 4

When You came, O Christ, to the Mount of <u>Ol</u>ives to accomplish the good pleasure of the <u>Fa</u>ther, the <u>Ang</u>els of <u>heav</u>en were amazed, and the demonic powers were <u>seized</u> with fear; the Disciples stood by trembling with joy as You <u>spoke</u> to them; and aloft, a waiting cloud was pre<u>pared</u> as a throne; heaven flung wide its gates and appeared in its <u>beau</u>ty, and the earth re<u>veals</u> its <u>hid</u>den vaults, so that Adam's descent was made known, and his a<u>scent</u> again. But Your footsteps were raised up, as <u>if</u> by a hand, while Your mouth was heard pronouncing a <u>great bles</u>sing; a cloud received You, and heaven <u>wel</u>comed You in. This great and marvelous work You per<u>formed</u>, O Lord,// for the sal<u>vat</u>ion of our souls.

The nature of <u>Ad</u>am,

which had descended to the nethermost parts of the earth, You renewed in Yourself, O God, and today, You took it up above every Principality and Power, for loving it, You seated it with Yourself; and having compassion on it, You united it with Yourself; and united with it, You suffered with it; and You Who are passionless have <u>glo</u>rified <u>it</u> with Yourself. But the Bodiless Powers were <u>asking</u>: "Who is this Man of beauty? Not man only, but both God and man, the two natures together made manifest. And so exultant Angels, flying about the Disciples in shining robes cried out: "O Men of Galilee, He Who is gone from you, this Jesus, both <u>Man</u> and God will come again as God and Man, the Judge of the living and the dead,// granting the faithful forgiveness of sins and His great mercy!"

When You ascended in glory, O <u>Christ</u> our God, while the Dis<u>ci</u>ples looked on. The <u>clouds</u> received <u>You</u> with Your flesh; the gates of heaven were <u>lift</u>ed up; the choirs of Angels rejoiced with gladness; the higher Powers cried out, <u>say</u>ing: "Lift up your gates, you <u>princes</u>, and the King of <u>Glory will</u> come in!" But the Disciples said in a<u>maze</u>ment: "Do not be parted from us, O good <u>Shep</u>herd, but send us Your all-<u>holy Spirit</u>,// to guide and illumine and <u>sanc</u>tify our souls!"

Tone 2Idiomela(from the Pentecostarion)

You were born, as You Your<u>self</u> did will; and appeared as You Your<u>self</u> desired; You <u>suffered</u> in the <u>flesh</u>, O our God; and rose from the dead, having <u>trampled</u> on death. You were taken up in glory, <u>fill</u>ing all things, and You <u>sent</u> us the Divine <u>Spirit</u>,// that we may praise and glorify Your Godhead.

V. *Oh, clap your hands, all you peoples. Shout to God with loud songs of joy! (Ps. 46:1)*

As You were taken up, O Christ, from the Mount of <u>Ol</u>ives, the Powers saw it and cried to one another: "<u>Who</u> is this?"
