SUNDAY, MAY 28 7th Sunday of Pascha, Holy Fathers of the First Ecumenical Council Afterfeast of the Ascension

"Lord I Call..." Tone 6

Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! <u>Hear</u> me, O Lord! Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! Receive the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call</u> upon You!// Hear me, O Lord!

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>in</u>cense, and let the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice!// Hear <u>me</u>, O Lord!

V. (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name!

Tone 6 *(for the Resurrection)*

Possessing victory over <u>hell</u>, O Christ, since You are <u>free</u> among the dead, You as<u>cend</u>ed the Cross raising with Yourself those who sat in the <u>shades</u> of death.// Drawing life from Your light, O almighty Savior, have <u>mer</u>cy on us!

V. (9) The righteous will surround me, for You will deal bountifully with me.

Today Christ <u>tramples</u> on death, for He is <u>risen</u> as He said! Let us all <u>sing</u> this song, for He has granted joy to the world: O Light unapproachable, O <u>Foun</u>tain of life!// O Savior almighty, have <u>mer</u>cy on us!

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

TONE 6

Where shall we sinners flee from You, Who are in all cre<u>a</u>tion? In <u>heav</u>en You dwell! In hell You <u>trampled</u> on death! In the <u>depths</u> of the sea? Even there is Your hand, O <u>Mas</u>ter! To You we flee, and falling be<u>fore</u> You, we pray:// O You Who rose from the dead, have <u>mer</u>cy on us!

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

Tone 6 *Idiomela (from the Pentecostarion, for the Ascension)*

The Lord has ascended into <u>heav</u>en that He might send the <u>Com</u>forter into the world. The heavens prepared His throne, and the <u>clouds</u> His mount. Angels marvel to see a Man high a<u>bove</u> them. The Father receives Him Whom He holds, co-eternal, in His <u>bos</u>om. The Holy Spirit commands all His <u>Angels</u>: "Lift up your gates, you <u>princes</u>! All you nations, <u>clap</u> your hands:// for Christ has gone up to where He was before!"

V. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

The Cherubim were amazed at Your As<u>cen</u>sion, O Lord, beholding You, the God Who sits en<u>throned</u> upon them, ascending up<u>on</u> the clouds; and we glorify You, for Your <u>mer</u>cy is good.// <u>Glo</u>ry to You!

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

Beholding Your Ascension on the holy <u>mountain</u>, O Christ, the brightness of the Father's <u>glo</u>ry, we hymn the radiant appearance of Your <u>countenance</u>; we worship Your <u>Passion</u>, we honor Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion, as we glorify Your glorious As<u>cension</u>.// Have <u>mer</u>cy on us!

V. **(4)** *From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!*

Tone 6 (from the Pentecostarion, for the Fathers) (Despairing for her life)

You were begotten from the Father before the <u>Morning Star</u>, but Arius taught wrongfully that You were cre<u>a</u>ted: in his ignorance he designated You as a <u>crea</u>ture, yet the Fathers of the Council proclaimed You as <u>Son</u> of God,// co-enthroned with the Father and the Holy <u>Spir</u>it.

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

O Savior, who has torn Your <u>gar</u>ment? Who has challenged the unity of the triune <u>God</u>head? It is Arius, for he denied that You are equal to the <u>Fa</u>ther. Those who follow him do not believe that God took <u>flesh</u> for our sake, but the Fathers of the Council proclaimed You as <u>Son</u> of God,// co-enthroned with the Father and the Holy <u>Spir</u>it.

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

Arius fell into the a<u>byss</u> of sin, pretending blindness that he might <u>not</u> see the Light. By his purpose he became the image of <u>Ju</u>das. But the Council at Nicea proclaimed You as <u>Son</u> of God,// co-enthroned with the Father and the Holy <u>Spir</u>it.

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

The foolish Arius blasphemed the All-holy <u>Trin</u>ity, dividing the Persons into three different unequal <u>sub</u>stances, but the God-bearing Fathers denounced his con<u>fu</u>sion: they assembled with the zeal of E<u>lij</u>ah, destroying error with the sword of the <u>Spirit</u>,// as they were directed by the inspi<u>ration of God</u>.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 6 *(from the Pentecostarion, for the Fathers)*

Today let us praise the mystical trumpets of the <u>Spir</u>it, the God-bearing <u>Fa</u>thers, who stand in the midst of the Church, singing true the<u>ology</u>, praising the changeless <u>Trin</u>ity! They laid low the errors of <u>Ar</u>ius and upheld the <u>Orth</u>odox Faith.// They always entreat the Lord to have <u>mer</u>cy on our souls. now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 6 (*Theotokion – Dogmatikon*)

Who will not bless you, O most holy <u>Virgin</u>? Who will not sing of your most pure <u>child</u>bearing? The only-begotten Son shone timelessly from the <u>Fa</u>ther, but from you He was ineffably in<u>car</u>nate. God by nature, yet <u>Man</u> for our sake, not two persons, but one known in two <u>natures</u>. Entreat Him, O pure and all-blessed <u>Lady</u>,// to have <u>mercy</u> on our souls!

Tone 6 *(for the Resurrection)*

Your Resurrection, O Christ our <u>Sav</u>ior, the Angels in <u>heav</u>en sing! Enable <u>us</u> on earth// to glorify You in <u>pur</u>ity of heart!

V. The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty!

Destroying the <u>gates</u> of hell, breaking the <u>chains</u> of death, You resurrected the fallen human race as al<u>mighty</u> God!// O Lord, Who rose from the dead, <u>glo</u>ry to You!

V. For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved.

Desiring to return us to <u>Par</u>adise, Christ was nailed to the Cross and <u>placed</u> in a tomb. The Myrrhbearing Women sought Him with tears, <u>cry</u>ing, "Woe to us, O <u>Sav</u>ior! How do You deign to de<u>scend</u> to death? What place can hold Your life bearing <u>body</u>? Come to us as You <u>prom</u>ised! Take away our <u>wail</u>ing and tears!" Then the Angel ap<u>peared</u> to them: "Stop your lamen<u>ta</u>tions! Go, proclaim to the A<u>pos</u>tles: 'The Lord is <u>ris</u>en,// granting us purification and great <u>mer</u>cy!"

V. Holiness befits Your house, O Lord, forevermore!

Having been <u>cru</u>cified as You willed, by Your burial You captured <u>death</u>, O Christ, rising on the third day as God in <u>glo</u>ry,// granting the world unending life and great <u>mer</u>cy!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 4 *(from the Pentecostarion, for the Fathers)*

Come, all Orthodox Churches,

let us celebrate today in faith and true <u>wor</u>ship the <u>year</u>ly commemoration of the divinely-arrayed <u>Fa</u>thers who gathered at Nicea from through<u>out</u> the world! There they refuted the godless <u>teaching</u> of <u>Ar</u>ius, banishing him from the catholic Church by a decree of the <u>coun</u>cil. They taught all to confess openly the <u>Son</u> of God, consubstantial and co-e<u>ter</u>nal with the <u>Fa</u>ther, proclaiming this with precision and true worship in the <u>Sym</u>bol of Faith. Therefore, as we faithfully follow their divine <u>doc</u>trines, let us worship the Father, the Son, and the most <u>Holy Spirit</u>,// the consubstantial Trinity in one <u>God</u>head!

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 4 *(from the Pentecostarion, for the Ascension)*

Fulfilling, O Lord, in Your <u>good</u>ness, the mystery hidden from ages and gener<u>a</u>tions, You <u>came</u> with Your Disciples to the Mount of <u>Olives</u>, together with the Mother who bore You, the Maker and Cre<u>a</u>tor of all; for it was fitting that she who as a mother had been grieved beyond <u>all</u> at Your <u>Pas</u>sion, should also be filled with exceeding joy at the <u>glo</u>ry of Your flesh. In this joy we <u>also</u> partake at Your ascent into <u>heav</u>en, O <u>Mas</u>ter,// and we glorify Your great mercy that has <u>come</u> upon us.

(at Great Vespers)

Tone 6 Troparion (*Resurrection*)

The Angelic <u>Pow</u>ers were at Your tomb; the guards became as <u>dead</u> men. Mary <u>stood</u> by Your grave, seeking Your most pure <u>body</u>. You captured hell, not being <u>tempt</u>ed by it. You came to the Virgin, <u>grant</u>ing life. O Lord, Who <u>rose</u> from the dead,// <u>glory</u> to You.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit,

Tone 8 Troparion (Fathers)

You are most <u>glo</u>rious, O <u>Christ</u> our God! You have established the <u>Ho</u>ly Fathers as <u>lights</u> on the earth. Through them You have <u>guid</u>ed us to the <u>true</u> Faith.// O greatly com<u>pas</u>sionate <u>One</u>, <u>glo</u>ry to You!

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 4 Troparion (Ascension)

You ascended in glory, O <u>Christ</u> our God, granting joy to Your Disciples by the promise of the Holy <u>Spir</u>it. Through the blessing, <u>they</u> were assured that You are the <u>Son</u> of God,// the Re<u>deem</u>er of the world! (at the Divine Liturgy)

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Tone 8 Kontakion (*Fathers*)

The Apostles' <u>preach</u>ing and the <u>Fa</u>thers' doctrines have established one <u>Faith</u> for the Church.

Adorned with the <u>robe</u> of truth, <u>wo</u>ven from heavenly the<u>ology</u>,// It defines and <u>glo</u>rifies the great <u>mys</u>tery of <u>pi</u>ety.

Tone 6 Kontakion

When You had fulfilled the dispen<u>sa</u>tion for our sake, and u<u>nit</u>ed earth to <u>heav</u>en: You ascended in glory, O <u>Christ</u> our God, not being <u>part</u>ed from those who <u>love</u> You, but remaining with them and <u>cry</u>ing:// "I am <u>with</u> you, and there is no one a<u>gainst</u> you!" **Tone 4Prokeimenon**(Song of the Three Holy Children)

Blessed are You, O Lord God of our fathers, / and praised and glorified is Your Name forever! (*Song of the Three Holy Children, v. 3*)

V. For You are just in all that You have done for us! (v. 4)
