#### "Lord I Call..." Tone 8

Lord, I call upon You, hear me! Hear me, O Lord!
Lord, I call upon You, hear me!
Receive the voice of my prayer, when I call upon You!//
Hear me, O Lord!

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>incense</u>, and let the lifting <u>up</u> of <u>my</u> hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice!// Hear <u>me</u>, O Lord!

V. (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name!

#### **Tone 8** *(for the Resurrection)*

We <u>offer</u> to <u>You</u>, O Christ, our evening song and reasonable <u>ser</u>vice, for You <u>willed</u> to have <u>mer</u>cy on us// by Your Resurrection.

V. (9) The righteous will surround me; for You will deal bountifully with me.

Lord, <u>Lord</u>, do not cast us a<u>way</u> from Your face! For You willed to have <u>mer</u>cy on us// by Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion.

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

Rejoice, O holy Zion: Mother of the churches, the a<u>bode</u> of God, for you were the first to re<u>ceive</u> re<u>mis</u>sion of sins// by the Resurrection.

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

#### (Resurrection stichera by Anatolius)

The <u>Word</u> of God the <u>Fa</u>ther, begotten before the <u>ages</u>, in the latter times willed to be in<u>car</u>nate of the <u>Virgin</u> and endured cruci<u>fi</u>xion unto death. He has <u>saved</u> mortal man// by His Resurrection.

V. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

We glorify You, O Lord, for You voluntarily endured the Cross for our sake. We fall down in worship before You, O almighty Savior. Do not cast us away from Your face but hear us and save us, O Lover of man,//by Your Resurrection!

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

<u>Glo</u>ry to You, O <u>Sav</u>ior Christ, Only-begotten Son of God, who was <u>nailed</u> to the Cross// and resurrected from the tomb on the <u>third</u> day!

**V.** (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

**Tone 6** (from the Pentecostarion) (Having placed all their hope)

The Savior's inspired Dis<u>cip</u>les became instruments of the <u>Spir</u>it through faith. They were scattered to the <u>ends</u> of the earth, sowing the glad tidings of the <u>True</u> Faith. From their divine garden the army of martyrs <u>blos</u>somed in grace. They became images of Christ's saving <u>Pas</u>sion, enduring every kind of torture, <u>scourging</u>, and fire.// Now they boldly <u>pray</u> for our souls.

**V.** (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

The noble martyrs, burning with <u>love</u> of the Lord, laughed at the fires and were consumed as <u>burn</u>ing coals. Through Christ, they burned the withered arrogance of <u>er</u>ror. They stilled the roaring of beasts with the <u>voice</u> of their prayers. Beheaded, they decapitated the de<u>mon</u>ic hosts.//
By the shedding of their own blood they watered the <u>Church</u> with faith.

#### V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

The heroic martyrs wrestled with beasts and were <u>torn</u> by their claws. They were dismembered, slashed with swords, and shot with <u>ar</u>rows; they were consumed in the flames and pierced with <u>lances</u>. All this they <u>willingly</u> endured, for already they saw their unfading crowns, and the <u>glo</u>ry of Christ,// before Whom they boldly <u>pray</u> for our souls.

## **V.** (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

Come, let us praise the <u>he</u>roes of our faith:
Apostles, martyrs, holy priests, and noble <u>wom</u>en!
They fought for the faith in every <u>part</u> of the earth.
Though born of earth, they were united with the <u>heav</u>enly hosts.
Through their sufferings, they triumphed over evil by the <u>grace</u> of Christ. As unfading lights, they il<u>lum</u>ine our hearts,//
and with boldness they <u>pray</u> for our souls.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

# **Tone 6** *(from the Pentecostarion)*

O divine choir of <u>mar</u>tyrs, you are the pillars of the Church and the fulfillment of the <u>Gos</u>pel. By your deeds you have fulfilled the <u>Sav</u>ior's words. You have closed the gates of hell and defended the Church. The shedding of your blood has dried up the libations poured out to <u>id</u>ols. Your sacrifice has nourished the body of the <u>faithful</u>. Standing crowned before God, you amazed the <u>Angels</u>.// Pray unceasingly to Him that our <u>souls</u> may be saved!

## **Tone 8** (*Theotokion – Dogmatikon*)

The <u>King</u> of heaven, because of His <u>love</u> for man, appeared on earth and <u>dwelt</u> with men. He took <u>flesh</u> from the pure <u>Virgin</u> and after assuming it, He came <u>forth</u> from her. The Son is one: in two natures, yet one <u>Per</u>son. Proclaiming Him as perfect <u>God</u> and <u>per</u>fect Man, we confess <u>Christ</u> our God!//
Entreat Him, O unwedded Mother, to have <u>mer</u>cy on our souls.

#### **Tone 1** *(from the Pentecostarion)*

In <u>one</u>ness of be<u>lief</u>, let us spiritually celebrate the universal <u>fest</u>ival of faith, the me<u>mo</u>rial of <u>all</u> the Saints who from all <u>ages</u> have been <u>pleasing</u> to God: the venerable <u>or</u>der of the Patriarchs, the assembly of the <u>Proph</u>ets, the adornment of the Apostles, the company of the <u>Mar</u>tyrs, and our <u>pride</u> and joy, the As<u>cetics</u>; for they ceaselessly intercede that <u>peace</u> be <u>granted</u> to the world// and to our souls great mercy!

#### Come, all believers,

with psalms and hymns and spiritual songs let us praise the all-glorious memory of all the Saints, blessing reverently the Baptist of our Savior, the Apostles, Prophets, and Martyrs, the Hierarchs, Teachers, and the Holy Ones, the Ascetics, the Righteous, and the God-loving assembly of holy Women! With one voice let us cry aloud:

"O Christ our God, supremely good, by their intercessions, bestow peace upon Your Churches, victory over enemies to those who love God,// and on our souls great mercy!"

<u>Come</u>, let us all spiritually rejoice in the commemor<u>ation of the Saints</u>; for behold, it has come, bringing us bountiful gifts! And <u>now</u>, O Prophets, Apostles, and <u>Mar</u>tyrs, together with the Ascetics, earnestly entreat Him Who crowned you,

that He <u>grant</u> deliverance from enemies, both visible and in<u>vis</u>ible,// to those who in faith and love celebrate your ever-venerable memory!"

## **Tone 5** *(from the Pentecostarion)*

Let us assemble, O faithful, for the present festival; for a spiritual table and a mystical chalice is set before us, filled with the delightful foods of gladness, the virtues of the Martyrs! Steadfast in soul, from the ends of the earth, they brought to God as a reasonable sacrifice, the various tortures applied to their bodily limbs in the prime of their lives. Some underwent beheading, others the severing of their arms and of every joint; and together, all the Saints became partakers of Christ's sufferings. But, O Lord, Who gave them crowns as rewards for their torments, count us worthy to live according to their example,// as You are the Lover of man!

We <u>glorify</u> Christ, who <u>rose</u> from the dead. He accepted the human <u>body</u> and soul, and freed <u>both</u> from <u>suffering</u>.
