Nativity of the Holy Glorious Prophet, Forerunner, and Baptist, John

"Lord I Call..." Tone 4

Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! <u>Hear</u> me, O Lord! <u>Lord</u>, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! Receive the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call</u> up<u>on</u> You!// Hear me, O Lord!

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>in</u>cense, and <u>let</u> the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice!// Hear me, O Lord!

- **V.** (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name!
- V. (9) The righteous will surround me, for You will deal bountifully with me.
- V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

Tone 4 *Idiomela* (by John the Monk)

John is born, ending Zachariah's <u>si</u>lence.
The father cannot keep silent when his son, the voice of the <u>Lord</u>, is born. When at <u>first</u> he did not believe, his tongue was <u>si</u>lenced, but now John has been born to free his <u>fa</u>ther: the one who <u>heard</u> the <u>good</u> news, and from whom was born the <u>voice</u> of the Word, // the Forerunner of Light, who always inter<u>cedes</u> for our souls.

V. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

Today the voice of the <u>Word</u> is born, releasing Zachariah's <u>si</u>lence, re<u>veal</u>ing the <u>har</u>vest of the Church, loosing the bonds of <u>bar</u>renness.

The candlestick of the <u>Light</u> is <u>drawing</u> near.

The ray of the Sun proclaims His <u>coming</u>// for the edification of all and the sal<u>va</u>tion of our souls.

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

Tone 4 *(by Anatolius)*

The messenger of God's Word comes <u>forth</u> from the womb: the greatest among those born of <u>women</u>; the most <u>high</u> of the <u>Proph</u>ets.

Wonderful events precede the divine <u>mys</u>tery: a seedless conception; a <u>mar</u>velous birth!//
Glory to You, Who have worked miracles for our salvation!

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

Tone 4 *(by Andrew of Crete)*

Today the great Forerunner comes from the barren womb of E<u>liz</u>abeth; the great Prophet of Prophets, whom none surpass in <u>great</u>ness. The <u>ra</u>diant candlestick of the Light; the <u>voice</u> of the Word, the friend of the Bridegroom, preparing the Lord's chosen <u>people</u> by purifying them with water before the coming of the <u>Spir</u>it. He is Zachariah's <u>off</u>spring, the child of the <u>wil</u>derness, the preacher of repentance, and the <u>cleanser</u> of sins. He announced the Resurrection even to <u>those</u> in hell,// and he always <u>prays</u> for our souls.

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

Today the Prophet and Forerunner appears from the womb: John, the Baptizer of our Lord <u>Je</u>sus Christ. When he <u>saw</u> the Queen come to the <u>hand</u>maid, bearing in her womb the <u>time</u>less God,// he leaped in his mother's womb and <u>sang</u> for joy.

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

Most glorious wonder!
Zachariah asked the Angel of the Word:
"How can Elizabeth conceive and bear a son?
I am an old man; my wife is advanced in years."
And for his unbelief, he was condemned to silence, but today he beholds the birth and resumes his speech, entering into joy and crying out:
"Blessed be the Lord God of Israel, for He has visited and redeemed His people,//granting to the world great mercy!"

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

O John most praised, apostle to the <u>universe</u>, the good news of Gabriel, the fruit of <u>bar</u>renness, the <u>ho</u>ly and righteous flower of the <u>desert</u>, the beloved friend of the <u>Bridegroom Christ</u>;// pray to Him that He <u>save</u> our souls!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 6 *(by Byzantius)*

Today, like a shining star, the <u>lamp</u> of the Light, heralds the coming of the <u>Word</u> of God; today Zachariah's <u>si</u>lence is loosed, for the father cannot remain silent at the birth of the <u>Fore</u>runner// who will proclaim the world's deliverance with great <u>bold</u>ness!

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 6 (Theotokion)

Elizabeth conceived the <u>Fore</u>runner of grace; the Virgin conceived the King of <u>glory</u>.

Both mothers greeted each <u>oth</u>er with a kiss.

The infant leaped in the womb, praising his <u>Mas</u>ter.

His mother was amazed and <u>cried</u> out:

"Why is this granted me, that the Mother of my Lord should <u>come</u> to me?//

He will save the forsaken people, since He possesses great <u>mer</u>cy."

Now the warrior of the heavenly <u>King</u> has come.

He truly will prepare the way for our God.

He is a man by nature, but an angel in manner of life,

He embraced purity and chastity forever,

so they are now his by <u>na</u>ture.

Let all of us the faithful greet him, crying://

"Pray for us, that our souls may be saved!"
