# Afterfeast of the Nativity of the Forerunner, All Saints of British Isles

#### "Lord I Call..." Tone 2

Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! Hear <u>me</u>, O Lord! <u>Lord</u>, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! Receive the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call</u> upon You!// Hear me, O Lord!

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>incense</u>, and <u>let</u> the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice!// Hear me, O Lord!

**V.** (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name!

### **Tone 2** *(for the Resurrection)*

Come, let us worship the <u>Word</u> of God begotten of the Father before all <u>ages</u>, and in<u>car</u>nate of the Virgin <u>Mary</u>! Having en<u>dured</u> the Cross, He was buried as He Him<u>self</u> desired.// And having risen from the dead, He saved me, an <u>er</u>ring man.

V. (9) The righteous will surround me; for You will deal bountifully with me.

Christ our <u>Sav</u>ior nailed to the Cross the bond against us,
He <u>void</u>ed it and destroyed the do<u>min</u>ion of death.//
We fall down before His Resurrection on the third day.

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

With the Archangels let us praise the Resur<u>rec</u>tion of Christ! He is our <u>Sav</u>ior, our Re<u>deem</u>er. He is coming with awesome glory and mighty <u>pow</u>er// to judge the <u>world</u> which He made.

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

## (Resurrection stichera by Anatolius)

The Angel pro<u>claimed</u> You, the crucified and buried <u>Mas</u>ter.

He <u>told</u> the women: "Come, see the <u>place</u> where He lay! He is <u>risen</u> as He said, for He is al<u>mighty</u>."

We <u>wor</u>ship You, O only im<u>mor</u>tal One.//
Have mercy on us, O Christ, the <u>Giv</u>er of life!

**V.** (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

### **Tone 4** *Idiomela (for the Forerunner, by John the Monk)*

John is born, ending Zachariah's silence.

The father cannot keep silent when his son, the voice of the Lord, is born.

When at first he did not believe, his tongue was silenced,

but now John has been born to free his <u>fa</u>ther:

the one who <u>heard</u> the good news,

and from whom was born the voice of the Word, //

the Forerunner of Light, who always intercedes for our souls.

**V.** (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

Today the voice of the <u>Word</u> is born, releasing Zachariah's <u>si</u>lence, re<u>veal</u>ing the <u>har</u>vest of the Church, loosing the bonds of <u>bar</u>renness.

The candlestick of the <u>Light</u> is <u>drawing</u> near.

The ray of the Sun proclaims His <u>coming</u>// for the edification of all and the salvation of our souls.

**V.** (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

# **Tone 4** (for the Forerunner, by Anatolius)

The messenger of God's Word comes <u>forth</u> from the womb: the greatest among those born of <u>women</u>; the most <u>high</u> of the <u>Proph</u>ets.

Wonderful events precede the divine <u>mys</u>tery: a seedless conception; a <u>mar</u>velous birth!//
Glory to You, Who have worked miracles for our salvation!

**V.** (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

## **Tone 1** (All Saints of British Isles)

O <u>come</u>, all you <u>fai</u>thful, now let us praise the <u>sai</u>nts of the Isles, the <u>ve</u>nerable monastics, the holy <u>bi</u>shops, the right-believing princes, all the martyrs and the <u>company</u> of holy <u>women</u>, those <u>kno</u>wn by name and those un<u>kno</u>wn, for truly by their words, deeds, manifold ways of life and <u>gifts</u> of God, they became <u>sai</u>nts and God made glorious even their graves with <u>wonders</u>. And now, standing before <u>Chri</u>st Who has <u>glo</u>rified them, // they pray fervently for us who celebrate the splendor of their <u>fea</u>st with love.

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

# **Tone 2** (All Saints of British Isles)

With what <u>beauty</u> of hymn shall we praise the divinely <u>wi</u>se of the Isles, the <u>sple</u>ndor and adornment of the <u>Chu</u>rch of Christ, the crown of the <u>priesthood</u>, the rule of piety, the never-drying wellsprings of divine <u>hea</u>ling, the out<u>pouring</u> of the gifts of the <u>Spi</u>rit, the streams of manifold <u>wo</u>nders which gladden the Isles and all those who <u>see</u>k God. //
For whose sake the All-Merciful Christ has cast down the uprisings of the <u>e</u>nemy.

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

# **Tone 8** (All Saints of British Isles)

Let the <u>ear</u>th make glad and the <u>hea</u>vens rejoice, in praising your toils and <u>struggles</u>, your spiritual courage and purity of <u>mind</u>, O <u>venerable</u> ones, for you were not overcome by the laws of <u>na</u>ture. // O holy company and divine assembly, you are truly the <u>strength</u> of our Isles.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

## **Tone 8** *(for the Forerunner)*

Elizabeth greeted the Virgin Mary:
"Why is it that the Mother of my Lord should come to me?
You bear the King, and I His soldier;
you the Giver of the Law,
and I its proclaimer;
you bear the Word, and I the voice//
that preaches the Kingdom of Heaven."

## **Tone 2** (*Theotokion – Dogmatikon*)

The shadow of the Law passed when grace came; as the Bush burned, yet was not consumed, so the <u>Virgin</u> gave birth, yet remained a <u>Virgin</u>. The Righteous Sun has risen instead of a <u>pillar</u> of flame.// Instead of Moses, Christ, the Salvation of our souls.

# **Tone 2** *(for the Resurrection)*

Your Resurrection, O Christ our <u>Sav</u>ior, has enlightened the whole <u>u</u>niverse, re<u>call</u>ing Your creation.// Glory to You, O al<u>mighty</u> Lord!

V. The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty!

By the Tree You destroyed the curse of the Tree, O <u>Sav</u>ior. By Your burial You mortified the <u>maj</u>esty of death. You have en<u>light</u>ened our race by Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion.// O Giver of life, Christ our God, <u>glory</u> to You!

**V**. For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved.

When You were seen nailed to the <u>Cross</u>, O Christ, You restored the beauty of Your <u>crea</u>tures. The <u>sol</u>diers showed their inhumanity when they pierced Your <u>side</u> with a spear. The Hebrews, not knowing Your <u>power</u>, asked that Your <u>tomb</u> might be sealed, but through the <u>mer</u>cy of Your com<u>passion</u>, You accepted the tomb and rose on the <u>third</u> day!// O Lord, <u>glory</u> to You!

V. Holiness befits Your house, O Lord, forevermore!

O Christ, the <u>Giv</u>er of life, for the sake of the dead You voluntarily en<u>dured</u> death, de<u>scending</u> into hell as the <u>Mighty</u> One to save those who awaited Your <u>coming</u>, granting them the life of paradise in<u>stead</u> of hell. Grant <u>al</u>so to us who glorify Your Resurrection on the <u>third</u> day//cleansing of our sins and great <u>mer</u>cy!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

# **Tone 4** (All Saints of British Isles)

<u>Hell</u> became afraid, O almighty <u>Sav</u>ior, seeing the miracle of Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion from the tomb! The <u>dead</u> arose! Creation, with Adam, beheld this and rejoiced with You,// and the world, my Savior, praises You forever.

# Tone 3 Kontakion (Forerunner)

Today the formerly barren woman gives birth to <u>Christ's</u> Fore<u>run</u>ner, who is the fulfillment of every <u>prophecy</u>; for <u>in</u> the <u>Jordan</u>, when he laid his hand on the One foretold by the <u>Prophets</u>,// he was revealed as Prophet, Herald, and <u>Fore</u>runner of <u>God</u> the Word.

# **Tone 8 Kontakion** (All Saints of British Isles)

To<u>day</u> the <u>fai</u>thful of the <u>I</u>sles celebrate the commemoration of Your <u>sai</u>nts, O Lord.

The <u>hea</u>vens rejoice and the <u>e</u>nds of the earth and the <u>sea</u> make glad. // <u>Through</u> their <u>i</u>ntercessions deign to grant our souls great <u>me</u>rcy.

## Tone 2 Prokeimenon (Resurrection)

The Lord is my strength and my song; / He has become my salvation. (Ps. 117:14)

**V.** The Lord has chastened me sorely, but He has not given me over to death. (Ps. 117:18)

Tone 7 Prokeimenon (All Saints of British Isles)

Precious in the sight of the Lord is the death of His saints.
