Tone 2 Automelon (by Andrew Pyrrhus)

With what wreaths of praise shall we crown <u>Pe</u>ter and Paul? Separated in body, they were united by the <u>Spir</u>it; they rank <u>first</u> among <u>preachers</u>: one was the leader of the <u>Apos</u>tles, while the other labored <u>more</u> than the rest. <u>Truly</u>, Christ our God, Who has great <u>mer</u>cy,// has adorned them with the crowns of immortal <u>glo</u>ry.

Tone 2 *Idiomela* (by Andrew of Jerusalem)

Let us come today and gather in chorus, and give an offering of the faithful! Let us exalt the Apostles Peter and Paul, the two vessels of grace! Let us worthily crown them with praises! For they bountifully spread the <u>seed</u> of the Word, giving all mankind its rich harvest. Filled with the grace of the Spirit, they were branches of the True Vine who tended the fruit that gladdens our hearts. Let us sing to them with unveiled faces and pure hearts: "Rejoice, guides of those without reason, who cared for those who gained wisdom! Rejoice, chosen friends of the Creator! Rejoice, stewards of bounty and foes of illusion!" They indeed went out into <u>all</u> the earth as husbandmen spreading the <u>seed</u> of the faith, planting for all mankind divine understanding, revealing the Word of the <u>Trinity</u>.
