Repose of St. John Maximovitch of Shanghai and San Francisco

"Lord I Call..." Tone 3

Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me. Hear <u>me</u>, O Lord. Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me. Receive the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call</u> upon You.// Hear me, O Lord.

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>incense</u>, and let the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice.// Hear me, O Lord.

V. (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name!

Tone 3 *(for the Resurrection)*

By Your Cross, O Christ our <u>Savior</u>, death's dominion has been <u>shat</u>tered; the devil's de<u>lu</u>sion destroyed.

The race of man, being <u>saved</u> by faith,// always <u>offers You</u> a song.

V. (9) The righteous will surround me; for You will deal bountifully with me.

All has been enlightened by Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion, O Lord. Paradise has been <u>opened</u> again. All creation, <u>prais</u>ing You,// always <u>offers You</u> a song.

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

I glorify the power of the <u>Fa</u>ther and the Son. I praise the authority of the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit: the undivided, uncreated <u>God</u>head,// the consubstantial Trinity which <u>reigns</u> for<u>ev</u>er.

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

(Resurrection stichera by Anatolius)

We bow down in worship before Your precious <u>Cross</u>, O Christ, and we glorify and praise Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion,// for by Your wounds we have all been healed.

V. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

Tone 6 (for St. John) (Having placed all their hope)

Who can say that the grace-filled power of the first apostles has <u>left</u> the earth, who can claim that the sanctity of the ancient ascetics is <u>seen</u> no more? For You, O Lord, have now raised up a new and glorious a<u>postle</u>, a new ascetic who has overcome the <u>enemy</u>'s attacks// and has won the heavenly crown of victory.

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

Rejoice now, O Russian <u>people</u>, for from you a fiery pillar has risen to <u>heaven</u>, where before the throne of God your new inter<u>ces</u>sor prays, a teacher of the Gospel to distant lands and a pastor to all <u>peoples</u>,// the holy Hierarch John.

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

Rejoice, O peoples of Serbia, China and the <u>Phi</u>lippines, and you of Africa, France, Holland and A<u>merica</u>, for among you walked a living <u>bear</u>er of God, a saint enlightened by grace and touched by di<u>vi</u>nity, a visionary who beheld the realm outside of <u>space</u> and time,//where he now prays for you.

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

Tone 3 (for St. John)

Behold the strange wisdom of God,

how the great and beautiful was manifested in a vessel <u>small</u> and unadorned, how the Creator's mind was revealed to one whom the world con<u>sid</u>ered mad://behold, O faithful, the life of John and know the ways of God.

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

Behold the world turned <u>up</u>side down, behold the wise and prudent <u>put</u> to shame, and all the secret and hidden things re<u>vealed</u> to babes, to the guileless and <u>child</u>like in faith, to those who believe in simplicity and <u>warmth</u> of heart,// to the <u>ever-memorable</u> John.

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

What labors did you not per<u>form</u>, O saint? What suffering did you not endure for <u>Christ's</u> sake? You did not withhold the love for God that was ever burning with<u>in</u> you, but spread it to the <u>ends</u> of the world,// enkindling the flame that asc<u>ends</u> to the <u>Kingdom above</u>.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 6 (for St. John)

Before your precious relics, O holy <u>Fa</u>ther, the faithful stand with <u>rev</u>erence and awe, your loved ones cease not to <u>speak</u> to you, those who hurt beg forgiveness, sinners are moved to re<u>pen</u>tance, those who sorrow are re<u>newed</u> with hope, the cold-hearted are <u>warmed</u> with love, those who stand at the abyss are drawn back by your <u>gen</u>tle hand, those who are dying are given the breath of ever<u>lasting life</u>, eyes which are closed in darkness are opened to the <u>light</u> of Christ, deafened ears are made to hear the voice of <u>angels://</u> O new apostle, pray that the Lord's grace be sent <u>ev</u>en to us.

Tone 3 (*Theotokion – Dogmatikon*)

How can we not wonder at your mystical childbearing, O exalted Mother? For without receiving the touch of man, you gave birth to a Son in the flesh, O immaculate Virgin. The Son born of the Father before eternity was born of you at the fullness of time, O honored Lady. He underwent no mingling, no change, no division, but preserved the fullness of each nature.

Entreat Him, O Lady and Virgin and <u>Mo</u>ther, to save the souls of those who, in the Orthodox manner, con<u>fess</u> you// to be the Theotokos.

Your life-bearing Resur<u>rec</u>tion, O Lord, enlightened the whole universe, recalling Your cre<u>a</u>tion. Delivered from Adam's <u>curse</u>, we sing://
O Almighty <u>Lord</u>, <u>glory</u> to You!

V. For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved.

Tone 6 Troparion* (St. John)

Glorious apostle to an age of coldness and <u>un</u>belief, invested with the grace-filled power of the <u>saints</u> of old; divinely-illumined seer of heavenly <u>mys</u>teries, feeder of orphans, hope of the <u>hope</u>less: you enkindled on earth the fire of <u>love</u> for Christ upon the dark eve of the day of <u>judgment</u>. Pray now that this <u>sac</u>red flame// may also <u>rise</u> from our hearts!
