Apostles Silas and Silvanus of the Seventy, and those with them

"Lord I Call..." Tone 7

Lord, I call upon You, hear me! Hear me, O Lord!
Lord, I call upon You, hear me! Receive the voice of my prayer, when I call upon You!// Hear me, O Lord!

Let my prayer arise in Your sight as incense, and let the lifting up of my hands be an evening sacrifice!// Hear me, O Lord!

V. (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name!

Tone 7 *(for the Resurrection)*

Come, let us rejoice in the Lord, Who destroyed the dominion of death! Let us sing to Him with the bodiless hosts, for He enlightened the race of man!// O our Maker and Savior, glory to You!

V. (9) The righteous will surround me; for You will deal bountifully with me.

You en<u>dured</u> the Cross and <u>bur</u>ial for our sake. By Your <u>death</u>, You destroyed <u>death</u> as God. We fall <u>down</u> before Your Resurrection on the <u>third</u> day,// O Savior, glory to You!

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

When the Apostles beheld the Resurrection of the Maker, they were amazed and sang the angelic praise.

This is the glory of the Church.

This is the richness of the Kingdom.//
O Lord, crucified for our sake, glory to You!

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

(Resurrection stichera by Anatolius)

You were <u>held</u> by lawless <u>men</u>, O Christ, but to <u>me</u>, You are God, and I am <u>not</u> ashamed. You were <u>smit</u>ten on the cheek, but I do not de<u>ny</u> You. You were <u>nailed</u> to the Cross and I do not con<u>ceal</u> it, for I <u>glory</u> in Your Resurrection: Your <u>death</u> is my life.// O Almighty Lord and Lover of <u>man</u>, <u>glory</u> to You!

V. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

Ful<u>fill</u>ing the prophecy of <u>Da</u>vid,

<u>Christ</u> manifested His greatness in Zion to the dis<u>ci</u>ples.

He is <u>praised</u> and always <u>glo</u>rified,
to<u>get</u>her with the Father and the Holy <u>Spir</u>it.

At <u>first</u> as the Word, He was <u>bod</u>iless,
but <u>then</u> He took flesh and was <u>slain</u> for our sake.//
He rose in power as the Lover of man!

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

You des<u>cend</u>ed into hell as You <u>willed</u>, O Christ, over<u>throwing</u> death as God, and rising on the third day as <u>Mas</u>ter! With Your<u>self</u> You raised Adam from the bonds of hell and from cor<u>rup</u>tion!// Glory to Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion, O only <u>Lov</u>er of man!

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

You were <u>placed</u> in the tomb, O Lord, as <u>one</u> asleep. On the <u>third</u> day You rose in <u>power</u>, raising <u>Adam</u> with Yourself from the cor<u>rup</u>tion of death// <u>as</u> the <u>Almighty</u> One!

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

Tone 4 (for the Apostles) (Thou hast given a sign)

Enlightened by the lightning flashes of the <u>Spirit</u>, you went about the whole world illumining the <u>faithful</u>. O all-<u>wise</u> ones, as <u>Apostles</u> of the Word, you diminished the darkness of the depths of <u>ignorance</u>. Therefore we rejoice today as we celebrate your light <u>bearing festival</u>// that brings us sanctification.

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

You sprinkled heavenly rain to the <u>ends</u> of the earth as blest clouds refreshing the souls of the faithful with di<u>vine</u> grace. You <u>choked</u> the alien tares of ungodliness, bringing to maturity the fruitful <u>souls</u> of men.//
Therefore, O Apostles, we honor you in <u>praises!</u>

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

Let us come together and honor in faith the most excellent <u>Si</u>las, with Andronicus, Epenétus and <u>Cre</u>scens, and in <u>love</u> let us honor <u>Silvan</u>us with them!

They are heralds of the faith who pour out rivers of <u>healing</u>,//removing attacks of all the passions by the divine <u>Spi</u>rit.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 7 (*Theotokion – Dogmatikon*)

No tongue can speak of your wonderful childbearing, for the order of nature was overruled by God.

You were revealed to be a Mother above nature, for you remained a Virgin beyond reason and understanding. Your conception was most glorious, O Theotokos!

The manner of your giving birth was ineffable, O Virgin!

Knowing you to be the Mother of God, devoutly we pray to you://

"Beseech Him to save our souls!"

As the <u>Sav</u>ior of the world You a<u>rose</u> from the tomb. As <u>God</u> You resurrected the race of <u>man</u> with Your flesh.// O <u>Lord</u>, <u>glory</u> to You!

V. The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty!

<u>Come</u>, let us worship the One Who <u>rose</u> from the dead, and en<u>light</u>ened all creation!

By His <u>death</u>, He saved us from the <u>tor</u>ments of hell.//

Receiving it, we are filled with <u>glad</u>ness, and we celebrate your most honored memory, Apostles of the Lord, Silas and Sil<u>van</u>us.//

Therefore, intercede that great mercy and remission of sins may be granted to us.

V. Offer to the Lord, O you sons of God! Offer young rams to the Lord! (Ps. 28:1a)
