Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! <u>Hear</u> me, O Lord! <u>Lord</u>, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! Receive the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call</u> upon You!// Hear me, O Lord!

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>in</u>cense, and <u>let</u> the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice!// Hear me, O Lord!

Tone 4 *Idiomela (by Cosmas the Monk)*

Before Your Cruci<u>fix</u>ion, O Lord, the mountain became as <u>heaven</u>, and like a <u>tabernacle</u> the cloud <u>spread</u> itself out, when You were transfigured, and the Father bore <u>wit</u>ness to You. Peter was <u>pre</u>sent with <u>James</u> and John, since they were to be with You at the time of Your be<u>tray</u>al, that, having seen Your <u>won</u>drous works, they might not be a<u>fraid</u> of Your <u>sufferings</u>.// Grant us to venerate Your sufferings in peace, through Your <u>mer</u>cy!

Before Your Cruci<u>fix</u>ion, O Lord,
You took Your Disciples to a high <u>moun</u>tain
and were trans<u>fig</u>ured be<u>fore</u> them,
illumining them with bright <u>rays</u> of Your pow'r.
From love of <u>man</u> and in Your <u>sov</u>ereign might,
it was Your desire to show them the splendor of Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion.
In peace count us also worthy of this <u>splen</u>dor, O God,//
in Your mercy and Your <u>love</u> for man!

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

The mountain that once was veiled in <code>gloom</code> and smoke, is now <code>holy</code> and revered, since Your <code>feet</code>, O Lord, have stood upon it.

For by Your dread Transfiguration, the mystery hidden before the ages has been made manifest in the last times to Peter, <code>James</code>, and John.

Unable to endure the shining of Your face and the brilliance of Your <code>gar</code>ments, they fell to the <code>ground</code> upon their <code>faces</code>.

Seized with wonder and amazement, they saw Moses and <code>Elij</code>ah talking with You about the things that would be<code>fall</code> You; and a voice came in testimony from the <code>Father saying</code>:

"This is My beloved Son in Whom I am well pleased; <code>lis</code>ten to Him!// It is He Who grants the world great <code>mercy!</code>"

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

When You were transfigured upon a high mountain, O <u>Sav</u>ior, having with You the chief Dis<u>ci</u>ples, You shone <u>forth</u> in glorious <u>maj</u>esty, proving that those who excel in the height of their <u>vir</u>tues shall be made worthy of di<u>vine glory</u>.

Moses and Elijah, <u>talking</u> with Christ, showed that He is Lord of both the <u>liv</u>ing and the dead, the God Who spoke of old through the <u>Law</u> and the <u>Proph</u>ets.

The voice of the Father testified to Him from the cloud of light, <u>say</u>ing: "Listen to Him, Who through the Cross has <u>despoiled</u> hell// and has given the dead e<u>ternal life!"</u>

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 6 *(by Anatolius)*

Prefiguring Your Resurrection, O <u>Christ</u> our God, You took with You in Your ascent of Mount <u>Ta</u>bor Your three Disciples, Peter, <u>James</u> and John. When You were transfigured, O <u>Sav</u>ior, Mount Tabor was <u>cov</u>ered with light. Your Disciples, O Word, threw themselves <u>down</u> upon the ground, unable to gaze upon the form that <u>none</u> may see. The Angels ministered in fear and <u>trem</u>bling; the heavens shook and the <u>earth</u> quaked,// as they beheld on earth the Lord of Glory.

Tone 2 Idiomela

In Your goodness You have sanctified the whole <u>world</u> with Your Light: You were transfigured on a high <u>mountain</u>, <u>showing Your power to Your Disciples</u>; for You redeem the world from trans<u>gression</u>.//
Therefore we cry out to You: "O Lord of compassion, <u>save</u> our souls!"

You were transfigured in glory on Mount Tabor, O <u>Christ God</u>, showing to Your Disciples the glory of Your Di<u>vinity</u>. Enlighten us <u>also</u> with the light of Your <u>knowledge</u> and guide us in the path of Your com<u>mand</u>ments,// for You alone are good and the <u>Lover of man!</u>

Christ, the Light that shone be<u>fore</u> the sun,

He likewise presented the chief Prophets, Moses and Elijah,

who testified to His Divinity:

that He is indeed the true brightness of the essence of the <u>Fa</u>ther,

the Ruler of the <u>liv</u>ing and the dead.

Therefore, a cloud covered them like a tabernacle,

and out of a cloud the Father's voice bore witness and said:

"This is My be<u>lov</u>ed Son,

Whom I have begotten without change from the womb before the Morning Star; I have sent Him to save those who are baptized in the Name of the Father, the

Son, and the Holy Spirit,

and who confess with faith that the one power of the Godhead is indivisible:

Listen to Him!"

O Christ our God, Who are supreme in goodness and the <u>Lov</u>er of man, shine also upon us with the light of Your unapproachable <u>glo</u>ry,// and make us worthy to inherit Your eternal <u>King</u>dom!

Tone 1 Idiomela

He Who of <u>old</u> spoke through symbols to Moses on Mount Sinai saying: "I am He Who Is,"

was transfigured today upon Mount Tabor before the Disciples.

In His own <u>per</u>son He showed them the <u>na</u>ture of man

arrayed in the original beauty of the Image.

Calling Moses and Elijah to be witnesses of this surpassing grace,

He made them partakers of the gladness,//

foretelling His death on the Cross and His saving Resur<u>rec</u>tion.

V. The heavens are Yours, the earth also is Yours; the world and all that is in it, You have founded them! (Ps. 88:11a)

David, the ancestor of God,

Tone 7 Troparion

Tone 8 Katavasia, Ode 1 *(from the Canon of the Elevation of the Cross, by Cosmas the monk)*

Moses traced out a cross, as with his staff he divided the Red Sea in two, so that Israel could go across on foot; and then striking it again crosswise, and uniting it over Pharoah and his chariots, he inscribed the Invincible Weapon.//
Therefore let us sing to Christ our God, for He has been glorified.

Tone 4 1st Canon, Ode 3 - Heirmos

The bow of the mighty has grown feeble, and the feeble have girded themselves with strength;//therefore, my heart is established in the Lord.

Tone 8 Katavasia, Ode 3

The rod of Aaron is an image of this mystery, for when it budded it revealed who should be the priest; and for the Church, which before was barren, the Tree of the Cross has blossomed forth// for her strength and firm foundation.

Tone 4 1st Canon, Ode 5 - Heirmos

O Christ, Who parted the original chaos from the light, that, in light, Your works might praise You as their Creator://
"Direct our paths in Your light!"

Tone 8 Katavasia, Ode 5

O thrice-blessed Tree, on which Christ the King and Lord was stretched! Through you the one who deceived us through a tree has fallen, caught by the bait of God, Who was nailed to you in the flesh,// and Who grants peace to our souls.

Tone 4 1st Canon, Ode 6 - Heirmos

In my affliction I cried to the Lord,// and the God of my salvation heard me.

Tone 8 Katavasia, Ode 6

In the belly of the sea monster, Jonah stretched out his hands in the form of a cross,

plainly prefiguring the saving Passion.
When he emerged from there on the third day,
he prefigured the transcendent Resurrection of Christ our God,
Who was nailed to the Cross in the flesh//
and by His rising on the third day enlightened the world.

The Little Litany, then the Kontakion:

Tone 7 Kontakion

On the <u>mountain</u> You were transfigured, O <u>Christ</u> God, and Your Disciples beheld Your glory as far as they could <u>see</u> it; so that when <u>they</u> would behold You <u>cru</u>cified, they would understand that Your suffering was <u>vol</u>untary, and would pro<u>claim</u> to the <u>world//</u> that You are truly the <u>Ra</u>diance of the <u>Fa</u>ther.

Tone 4 1st Canon, Ode 7 - Heirmos

In Babylon the Children, sons of Abraham, once trampled upon the flame of the furnace, and they sang this song of praise://
"Blessed are You, the God of our Fathers!"

Tone 8 Katavasia, Ode 7

The senseless decree of the impious tyrant, spewing threats and blasphemy hateful to God, brought the people to confusion.

Yet the three Children could not be frightened either by the brutal fury or the roaring fire, but in the wind, moist with dew, that blew against it, they stood together, and they sang:

"O praised above all, blessed are You,// our God, and the God of our Fathers!"

Tone 4 1st Canon, Ode 8 - Heirmos

The Children in Babylon, on fire with zeal for God, bravely trampled upon the threat of the tyrant and the flames; and cast into the midst of the fire, but refreshed with dew, they sang:// "Bless the Lord, all you works of the Lord!"

Tone 8 Katavasia, Ode 8

O Children, equal in number to the Trinity, bless God the Father, the Creator; praise the Word, Who descended and changed the fire to dew, and exalt above all, to all ages,// the All-Holy Spirit, Who gives life to all!

We praise, bless, and worship the Lord, singing and exalting Him throughout all ages.

Tone 4 1st Canon, Ode 9 - Heirmos

Magnify, O my soul, the Lord Who was transfigured on Mount Tabor!

Your childbearing was without corruption; God came forth from your body clothed in flesh, and appeared on earth and dwelt among men.// Therefore we all magnify you, O Theotokos.

Tone 8 Katavasia, Ode 9

You are a mystical Paradise, O Theotokos, who, though untilled, have brought forth Christ; through Him the life-bearing wood of the Cross was planted on earth. Now at its Exaltation, as we bow in worship before it, we magnify you.

Exapostilarion Tone 3

O Word, Light unaltered from the Light of the unbegotten Father, in Your Light made manifest today on Mount Tabor we have seen the Father as Light and the Spirit as Light,//guiding all creation as Light.

The Praises Tone 4

Let everything that breathes <u>praise</u> the Lord! Praise the Lord from the <u>heavens!</u>

<u>Praise</u> Him in the <u>highest!</u>//

To You, O God, is due a song!

Praise Him, all you <u>Ang</u>els of His! Praise Him, <u>all</u> His hosts!// To You, O God, is <u>due</u> a song!

V. Praise Him with trumpet sound; praise Him with lute and harp! (Ps. 150:3)

Tone 4 (*Called from on high*)

Before Your precious Cross and Your <u>Passion</u>,
You took the holy Disciples whom You had especially <u>cho</u>sen,
and went <u>up</u>, O Master, onto Mount <u>Ta</u>bor
wishing to show them Your <u>glo</u>ry.
When they saw You transfigured, shining more <u>brightly than</u> the sun,
they fell on their faces, struck with a<u>mazement at Your might</u>,
and they <u>cried</u> aloud:
"O Christ, You are the timeless light and the <u>bright</u>ness of the <u>Fa</u>ther,//
even though, of Your own will, You are manifested in the <u>flesh</u> without change."

V. Praise Him with timbrel and dance; praise Him with strings and pipe! (Ps. 150:4)

You, Who from all eternity are <u>God</u> the Word, and cover Yourself with light as with a <u>gar</u>ment, were trans<u>fig</u>ured before Your Dis<u>ci</u>ples, and shone more <u>brightly</u> than the sun.

Moses and Elijah <u>stood by</u> Your side, making it plain that You are the Lord both of the dead and of the <u>liv</u>ing. They glorified Your ineffable dispen<u>sation</u>, Your mercy and Your <u>great</u> conde<u>scen</u>sion,// by which You have saved the world utterly <u>lost</u> in sin.

V. Praise Him with sounding cymbals; praise Him with loud clashing cymbals! Let everything that breathes praise the Lord! (Ps. 150:5)

O Lord, Who were born from the Virgin Cloud and made <u>flesh</u>, and were transfigured on Mount <u>Ta</u>bor, sur<u>rounding</u> Yourself with a <u>bright</u> cloud, the voice of the Father in the presence of the Dis<u>ci</u>ples plainly declared You to <u>be</u> the be<u>loved</u> Son, one in Essence and sharing the <u>same</u> throne. Therefore Peter spoke in amazement, not <u>knowing</u> what he said:// "It is good for us to be here, O Benefactor, rich in <u>mer</u>cy!"

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 8

<u>Christ</u> took Peter, James, and John alone to a high <u>mountain</u>, and was transfigured be<u>fore</u> them.

His face shown like the sun, and His <u>rai</u>ment became <u>white</u> as the light. Moses and Elijah appeared <u>talking</u> with Him.

A bright cloud over<u>sha</u>dowed them and behold, a <u>voice</u> from the <u>cloud</u> said://

"This is My beloved Son, in Whom I am well pleased; <u>hear</u> Him!"
