Hieromartyr Anthimus, Bishop of Nicomedia, Ven. Theoctistus

"Lord I Call..." Tone 4

Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! <u>Hear</u> me, O Lord! <u>Lord</u>, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! Receive the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call</u> up<u>on</u> You!// Hear me, O Lord!

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>in</u>cense, and <u>let</u> the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice!// Hear me, O Lord!

V. (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name!

Tone 4 *(for the Resurrection)*

We glorify Your Resurrection on the third day, O <u>Christ God</u>, by always honoring Your <u>life-creating Cross</u>; by <u>it</u>, You have renewed the corrupted <u>na</u>ture of man, O al<u>mighty One</u>.

By it, You have renewed our <u>en</u>trance to <u>hea</u>ven,// for You are good and the Lover of man.

V. (9) The righteous will surround me, for You will deal bountifully with me.

You loosed the Tree's verdict of disobedience, O <u>Sav</u>ior, by being voluntarily nailed to the <u>tree</u> of the Cross. By de<u>scending</u> to hell, O al<u>mighty</u> God, You broke the <u>bonds</u> of death. Therefore, we adore Your Resurrection from the <u>dead</u>, <u>sing</u>ing in joy:// "Glory to You, O all powerful Lord!"

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

You smashed the gates of <u>hell</u>, O Lord, and by Your death You demolished the <u>king</u>dom of death. You de<u>liv</u>ered the race of men from cor<u>rup</u>tion,//granting the world life, incorruption and great <u>mer</u>cy.

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

(Resurrection stichera by Anatolius)

Come, O people,

let us sing of the Savior's Resurrection on the third day!

By it, we have been freed from the unbreakable bonds of hell.

By it, we have received life and incor<u>rup</u>tion.

Save us by Your Resurrection!//

O Life-creating and almighty Savior, glory to You!

V. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

Tone 1 (for St. Anthimus) (O all-praised martyrs)

O divinely-wise and blessed one,

you brightened your sacred and divine vestments with the <u>dye</u> of your blood.

You went <u>forth</u> in faith from <u>strength</u> to strength

and from glory to glory.//

Pray now that peace and great mercy may be granted to our souls!

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

You <u>offered</u> the Bloodless <u>Sac</u>rifice to God as a most o<u>be</u>dient priest; <u>lat</u>er, as a most true <u>mar</u>tyr, you offered your<u>self</u> with <u>blood</u> to Christ as an ac<u>cept</u>able sacrifice and whole burnt <u>offering</u>, O divinely eloquent and <u>hon</u>ored one.// Pray to Him for those who sing your <u>praises!</u>

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

You led <u>leg</u>ions of martyrs to Christ, O Father <u>An</u>thimus, teaching and instructing by your <u>doc</u>trines and words. You <u>openly</u> presented yourself as an example for them, O <u>wise</u> one.// Pray with them that peace and great mercy be <u>granted</u> to our souls!

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

Tone 1 (for St. Theoctistus) (O all-praised martyrs)

O <u>Fa</u>ther Theoc<u>ti</u>stus, your radiant memory gladdens the assemblies of mo<u>nas</u>tics, who rejoice in the beautiful <u>works</u> of your life, the riches of your wonders and the <u>bright</u>ness of your <u>spir</u>itual gifts.// Entreat Christ that peace and great mercy be <u>granted</u> to our souls!

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

O Father Theoctistus,

the enemies were terrified by the intensity of your ascetic <u>dis</u>cipline, and they were de<u>feat</u>ed by your unceasing prayers, O most <u>praised</u> saint; for you had <u>Christ</u> as a <u>help</u>er in your work.//
Pray to Him that peace and great mercy be granted to our souls!

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

O <u>Fa</u>ther Theoc<u>ti</u>stus,
you were truly God's <u>crea</u>ture;
for by pre<u>serv</u>ing that which was according to His <u>image</u>,
you showed by your holy life that you were rightfully <u>named</u>,* O most <u>mar</u>velous one.//
Entreat Christ that peace and great mercy be <u>granted</u> to our souls!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 6 (for St. Anthimus)

O blessed <u>An</u>thimus, you were a most o<u>be</u>dient priest; the ultimate call was <u>given</u> to you, for while celebrating the divine and ineffable <u>mys</u>teries, you poured out your blood in behalf of <u>Christ</u> our God. You brought yourself as a pleasing <u>sacrifice</u> to Him. Therefore, since you have boldness be<u>fore</u> Him, pray fervently for those who keep your memory with <u>faith</u> and love, that they may be rescued from <u>evil</u>,// and from all temptations, dangers, and afflictions!

Tone 4 (*Theotokion – Dogmatikon*)

The Prophet David was a <u>fa</u>ther of the Lord through you, O <u>Virgin</u>.

He fore<u>told</u> in songs the One Who worked <u>won</u>der in you:

"At Your right hand <u>stood</u> the Queen,"

Your Mother, the medi<u>atrix</u> of life,
since God was freely born of her without a <u>fa</u>ther.

He wanted to renew His fallen image, made corrupt in <u>passion</u>,
so He took the lost sheep up<u>on</u> His <u>shoul</u>der
and brought it to His <u>Fa</u>ther,
joining it to the <u>heav</u>enly pow'rs.//
Christ, Who has great and rich mercy, has saved the world, O Theotokos.

Tone 4 *(for the Resurrection)*

By ascending the <u>Cross</u>, O Lord, You have annulled our an<u>ces</u>tral curse. By de<u>scending</u> to hell, You have freed the eternal <u>pris</u>oners, granting incorruption to the <u>hu</u>man race.// Therefore in songs we glorify Your life-creating and saving Resur<u>rec</u>tion.

V. The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty!

By hanging upon the tree, O only <u>pow</u>erful Lord, You shook all of creation.

By being <u>laid</u> in the tomb You have raised those who <u>dwelt</u> in the tombs, granting life and incorruption to the <u>human race</u>.//

Therefore in songs we glorify Your rising on the third day.

V. For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved.

The lawless <u>people</u>, O Christ, handed You over to Pilate, condemned to be <u>cru</u>cified, thus <u>prov</u>ing themselves ungrateful before their <u>Ben</u>efactor. But voluntarily You endured <u>bur</u>ial, rising by Your own power on the <u>third</u> day as God,//granting us life everlasting and great <u>mer</u>cy.

V. Holiness befits Your house, O Lord, forevermore!

With tears the women <u>reached</u> Your tomb, searching for You, but not <u>finding</u> You.
They <u>wept</u> with wailing and la<u>mented</u>:
"Woe to us! Our Savior, <u>King</u> of all,
<u>how</u> were You <u>sto</u>len?
What place can hold Your life-bearing <u>body</u>?"
An Angel re<u>plied</u> to them:
"Do not weep, but go and proclaim that the <u>Lord</u> is <u>ris</u>en,//granting us joy as the only com<u>pas</u>sionate One!"

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; **Tone 6** (for St. Theoctistus)

The sound of your teachings has gone out into <u>all</u> the earth, O venerable Father Theoctistus.

Therefore you have found the reward of your labors in the <u>heavens</u>. You destroyed the hosts of <u>de</u>mons and reached the ranks of Angels, whose life you blamelessly <u>fol</u>lowed. Since you have boldness before <u>Christ</u> our God,// entreat <u>peace</u> for our souls!

Tone 6 (Theotokion)

My Maker and Redeemer, <u>Christ</u> the Lord, was born of you, O most pure <u>Virgin</u>. By accepting my nature, He freed Adam from his <u>an</u>cient curse. Unceasingly we magnify you as the <u>Moth</u>er of God! Rejoice, O celestial Joy! Rejoice, O <u>Lady</u>://
the Protection, Intercession and Salvation of our souls!

Tone 4 Kontakion (St. Anthimus)

Living honrably as a priest,
you completed the course of martyrdom;
you extinguished the worship of idols
and became a champion of your flock, O divinely wise one.
Therefore, we honor you,
mystically crying out://
"Through your prayers deliver us from calamity, ever-memorable Anthimus."
