#### "Lord I Call..." Tone 7

### **Tone 7** *(for the Resurrection)*

Come, let us rejoice in the Lord, Who destroyed the dominion of death! Let us sing to Him with the bodiless hosts, for He enlightened the race of man!// O our Maker and Savior, glory to You!

V. (9) The righteous will surround me; for You will deal bountifully with me.

You en<u>dured</u> the Cross and <u>bur</u>ial for our sake. By Your <u>death</u>, You destroyed <u>death</u> as God. We fall <u>down</u> before Your Resurrection on the <u>third</u> day,// O Savior, glory to You!

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

### (Resurrection stichera by Anatolius)

You were <u>held</u> by lawless <u>men</u>, O Christ, but to <u>me</u>, You are God, and I am <u>not</u> ashamed. You were <u>smit</u>ten on the cheek, but I do not de<u>ny</u> You. You were <u>nailed</u> to the Cross and I do not con<u>ceal</u> it, for I <u>glo</u>ry in Your Resurrection: Your <u>death</u> is my life.// O Almighty Lord and Lover of man, glory to You!

V. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

### **Tone 2** *(for the New Martyrs)*

With joy the enlightener of Alaska, <u>In</u>nocent, joins our blessed Father Herman of <u>New</u> Valaam in <u>cel</u>ebrating the feast of the Holy Martyrs of A<u>mer</u>ica. The glorified bishop and the <u>ven</u>erable monk invite all to this radiant <u>fes</u>tival,// praising God, Who is <u>won</u>derful in His saints.

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

Today the natives of Kenai rejoice in faith, for their apostle, the priest-monk Juvenaly, is <u>glo</u>rified. He <u>la</u>bored without concern for personal gain or <u>earthly</u> reward to enlighten an ancient people sitting in <u>darkness</u>. **V.** (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

Today the Aleut Nation celebrates a <u>feast</u> of joy, for one of its own race is ex<u>alt</u>ed by God.

Together with our venerable elder, Herman of Spruce <u>Is</u>land, we cry out to the warrior who shed his <u>bloo</u>d for the faith://
"O holy New-Martyr Peter, pray to <u>God</u> for us!"

**V.** (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

Come all Orthodox believers of A<u>mer</u>ica, let us celebrate this <u>feast</u> of faith! In their de<u>vo</u>tion to Christ, the Holy Martyrs suffered <u>will</u>ingly, recalling the Lord's promise that the Kingdom of God belongs to those who <u>suff</u>er for Him.

Having fought the good fight and re<u>ceived</u> their crowns,// they stand before the Lord and inter<u>cede</u> for our souls.

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

Come all Orthodox believers of America, let us rejoice at this <u>feast</u> of hope!

The <u>vi</u>sion of the future growth of the Church in America inspired the Hieromartyr Juvenaly in his apostolic work.

Committing his soul to the Lord, he rejoiced in the hope of eternal life. And the young <u>A</u>leut, Peter of Kodiak <u>Is</u>land, offered himself as a living <u>sac</u>rifice, trusting that in the world to come he would re<u>ceive</u> his reward.//

**V.** (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

Come all Orthodox believers of America,
let us sing for joy at this festival full of joy and love!
For greater love has no man than that he lay down his life.
And in imitation of the Savior,
both the monk and the boy suffered, confessing their faith.
Their love for Christ and His Holy Church could not be destroyed.
They have joined the noble chorus of martyrs who stand before the throne of God,//
where they intercede for our souls.

### **Tone 3** *(for the New Martyrs)*

The first martyr came from a <u>dis</u>tant land; the second was born in Russian A<u>mer</u>ica. Juvenaly received the benefits of a formal edu<u>cation</u>; while Peter was taught how to survive in the <u>wil</u>derness. The monk dedicated his life to Christ as a <u>man</u> of prayer; the boy became a witness to Christ, accepting <u>tor</u>ture and death. Now both are glorified <u>equally</u> by the God Who loves <u>all</u> men. Remembering their loving <u>sac</u>rifice,// may we also grow to the fullness of <u>love</u>, revealed to <u>us</u> in Christ!
