17th Sunday after Pentecost (2nd of Luke) The Protection of our Most Holy Lady Theotokos and Ever-Virgin Mary [Ven. Romanus the Melodist]

"Lord I Call..." Tone 8

Lord, I call upon You, hear me! Hear me, O Lord!
Lord, I call upon You, hear me!
Receive the voice of my prayer, when I call upon You!//
Hear me, O Lord!

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>incense</u>, and let the lifting <u>up</u> of <u>my</u> hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice!// Hear me, O Lord!

- V. (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name!
- V. (9) The righteous will surround me; for You will deal bountifully with me.

Tone 8 *(for the Resurrection)*

We <u>offer</u> to <u>You</u>, O Christ, our evening song and reasonable <u>ser</u>vice, for You <u>willed</u> to have <u>mer</u>cy on us// by Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion.

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

Lord, <u>Lord</u>, do not cast us a<u>way</u> from Your face! For You willed to have <u>mer</u>cy on us// by Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion.

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

Rejoice, O holy Zion:

Mother of the churches, the a<u>bode</u> of God, for you were the first to re<u>ceive</u> re<u>mis</u>sion of sins// by the Resurrection.

V. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

(Resurrection stichera by Anatolius)

The <u>Word</u> of God the <u>Fa</u>ther, begotten before the <u>ages</u>, in the latter times willed to be in<u>car</u>nate of the <u>Virgin</u> and endured cruci<u>fi</u>xion unto death. He has <u>saved</u> mortal man// by His Resurrection.

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

Tone 1 (for the Protection) (Oh, the Marvelous Wonder)

O <u>pure</u> Theotokos, fount of <u>wis</u>dom, and great help to <u>those</u> in distress, <u>you</u> are a speedy aid, protectress, and sup<u>port</u> of the world. We the faithful sing in praise of her who is a <u>sea</u> of com<u>passion</u>, in<u>effably praising her radiant omophorion</u>: "Rejoice, O Maiden, <u>full</u> of grace, the <u>Lord</u> is <u>with</u> you,// granting the world great <u>mer</u>cy through you!"

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

The wondrous Isaiah prophesied:

"In the latter days," said he, "it will come to pass that the mountain of the Lord shall be revealed, and the house of the Lord shall be upon the summit of the mountain." And of this, O sovereign Lady, we have seen in you the true fulfillment.

For the mountains and hills are adorned with churches that bear the many names of your festivals.

Therefore, joyfully we sing to you:

"Rejoice, O highly favored Maiden, the Lord is with you,// granting the world great mercy through you!"

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

Oh, how <u>mar</u>velous an adornment are you to all the <u>faithful!</u>
You are the true fulfillment of the <u>prophecies</u>,
the <u>glory</u> of the Apostles and the beauty of the <u>Mar</u>tyrs,
the boast of virginity and the marvelous protection of the <u>whole</u> world.
O sovereign <u>Lady</u>, protect with the omophorion of your tender <u>mercy</u>
all the people who cry <u>out</u> to you:
"Rejoice, O Virgin, <u>full</u> of grace,
the <u>Lord</u> is <u>with</u> you,//
granting the world great <u>mercy</u> through you!"

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

Tone 4 *(for the Protection) (As one valiant among the martyrs)*

You are like the divinely planted Paradise, O Theo<u>to</u>kos, the place where the Tree of Life was watered by the Holy <u>Spir</u>it. We ac<u>know</u>ledge that you gave birth to the Creator of all Who feeds the faithful with the <u>Bread</u> of Life. Together with the Forerunner, en<u>treat</u> Him on <u>our</u> behalf;// and by your precious omophorion protect your people from <u>all</u> attacks!

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

Heaven and earth are <u>sanc</u>tified; the Church is radiant, and all the people <u>cel</u>ebrate, for be<u>hold</u>, the Mother of God enters invisibly with the armies of the <u>Ang</u>els, the Forerunner, and the Theo<u>logian</u>, the Prophets, and the A<u>pos</u>tles! She prays to Christ for <u>Christ</u>ians and entreats Him to have mercy on this land and its <u>people</u>,// who glorify the feast of her Protection.

Tone 8 *(for the Protection)*

To<u>day</u> the Powers of Heaven rejoice with us, and the souls of the just are spiritually as<u>sem</u>bled to behold the Queen and Mother <u>glo</u>rified by the <u>faithful</u>. They witness the vision of the <u>Mother of God</u>: her arms outstretched upon the <u>clouds</u> in prayer, en<u>treating peace</u> for the world,// strength for Orthodox Christians, and sal<u>vation for our souls</u>.

Tone 8 (*Theotokion – Dogmatikon*)

The <u>King</u> of heaven, because of His <u>love</u> for man, appeared on earth and <u>dwelt</u> with men. He took <u>flesh</u> from the pure <u>Virgin</u> and after assuming it, He came <u>forth</u> from her. The Son is one: in two natures, yet one <u>Person</u>. Proclaiming Him as perfect <u>God</u> and <u>perfect Man</u>, we confess <u>Christ</u> our God!//
Entreat Him, O unwedded Mother, to have mercy on our souls.

And it is she whom glorious Andrew be<u>held</u> in the air protecting the people with her <u>pre</u>cious veil. Let us sing to her with <u>ten</u>derness of heart:// Rejoice, O protectress, defender, and sal<u>va</u>tion of our souls!

Aposticha

Tone 8 *(for the Resurrection)*

De<u>scending</u> from heaven to a<u>scend</u> the Cross, the eternal Life has <u>come</u> for death to raise <u>those</u> who are <u>fal</u>len; to enlighten those in <u>dark</u>ness.//
O Jesus, our Savior and illuminator, <u>glory</u> to You!

V. The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty!

We <u>glor</u>ify Christ, who <u>rose</u> from the dead. He accepted the human <u>body</u> and soul, and freed <u>both</u> from <u>suffering</u>. His most pure soul descended to <u>hell</u>, which He spoiled. His holy body did not see cor<u>rup</u>tion in the tomb.// He is the Re<u>deem</u>er of our souls. **V**. For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved.

In <u>psalms</u> and songs we glorify Your Resurrection from the <u>dead</u>, O Christ. By it, You have freed us from the <u>tor</u>tures of hell// and as God have granted eternal life and great <u>mer</u>cy.

V. Holiness befits Your house, O Lord, forevermore!

O<u>Mas</u>ter of all, incomprehensible Creator of <u>heav</u>en and earth, by Your suffering on the Cross You have gained <u>pas</u>sionlessness for me. Accepting burial and a<u>rising</u> in glory, You resurrected Adam with Yourself by Your al<u>mighty</u> hand. Glory to Your rising on the <u>third</u> day! By it You have granted us eternal <u>life</u> and <u>cleansing</u> of sins// as the only compassionate One.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

By rising <u>from</u> the <u>tomb</u>, You raised the dead and resurrected <u>Ad</u>am. Eve exults <u>in</u> Your <u>Resurrection</u>,// and the world <u>cel</u>ebrates Your <u>ris</u>ing from the dead, O greatly <u>Mer</u>ciful One!

Tone 8 Kontakion (St. Romanus)

You were a<u>dorned</u> from <u>child</u>hood with the godly virtues of the <u>Spir</u>it; you were a <u>pre</u>cious a<u>dorn</u>ment of the Church of Christ, all-wise Ro<u>man</u>us, for you made it <u>love</u>ly with <u>beau</u>tiful <u>hym</u>nody.

Therefore we entreat you, grant your divine gift to those who desire it,// that we may cry out to you: "Rejoice, all-blessed Father, beauty of the Church!"

Tone 3 Kontakion (*Protection*)

Today the <u>Virg</u>in stands in the <u>midst</u> of the Church, and with choirs of saints she invisibly prays to <u>God</u> for us. Angels and <u>bish</u>ops <u>wor</u>ship, Apostles and Prophets rejoice together,// since for our sake she <u>prays</u> to the <u>pre</u>-e<u>ter</u>nal God.

Tone 8 Prokeimenon (Resurrection)

Pray and make your vows / before the Lord, our God! (Ps. 75:10a)

V. In Judah God is known; His Name is great in Israel. (Ps. 75:1)

Tone 3 Prokeimenon (Song of the Theotokos)

My soul magnifies the Lord, / and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior. (Lk. 1:46-47)
