## SUNDAY, OCTOBER 8 18<sup>th</sup> Sunday after Pentecost (3<sup>rd</sup> of Luke) Commemoration of the Holy Fathers of the 7<sup>th</sup> Ecumenical Council

### "Lord I Call..." Tone 1

Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! <u>Hear</u> me, O Lord! <u>Lord</u>, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! Re<u>ceive</u> the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call</u> up<u>on</u> You!// <u>Hear me</u>, O Lord!

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>in</u>cense, and <u>let</u> the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an <u>evening sac</u>rifice!// <u>Hear me</u>, O Lord!

V. (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name!
V. (9) The righteous will surround me, for You will deal bountifully with me.

**Tone 1** *(for the Resurrection)* 

Ac<u>cept</u> our evening prayers, O <u>ho</u>ly Lord! Grant us re<u>mis</u>sion of sins,// for You alone have manifested the Resur<u>rec</u>tion to the world.

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

En<u>cir</u>cle <u>Zi</u>on and surround her, O <u>people</u>! Give <u>glory</u> in her to the One Who <u>rose</u> from the dead! For <u>He</u> is <u>our</u> God,// Who has delivered us from our transgressions!

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

<u>Come</u>, O <u>people</u>, let us hymn and fall <u>down</u> before Christ, <u>glo</u>rifying His Resur<u>rec</u>tion from the dead! For <u>He</u> is <u>our</u> God,// Who has delivered the world from the <u>En</u>emy's deceit!

**V.** (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

### (Resurrection stichera by Anatolius)

Be glad, O heavens! Sound trumpets, O foun<u>da</u>tions of the earth! Sing in <u>glad</u>ness, O <u>moun</u>tains! Behold Emmanuel has <u>nailed</u> our <u>sins</u> to the Cross! Granting <u>life</u>, He has <u>slain</u> death.// He has resurrected Adam as the <u>Lov</u>er of man.

**V**. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

**Tone 6**(for the Fathers)(Despairing for her life)

The seven honorable councils of the Fathers, held at <u>var</u>ious times, were brought together under one canon in good <u>or</u>der by Patriarch Ger<u>man</u>us the New. He established and recorded their <u>teachings</u>; he also presented these <u>Fa</u>thers to the Lord as watchful intercessors for our sal<u>va</u>tion,// and as fellow-<u>shep</u>herds of the fold.

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

The book of the Law instructed the sons of Israel

that the seventh day was to be honored,

and they devoted themselves to a shadow and <u>rev</u>erenced it.

But, O Fathers, who came together in the Seventh Council,

at the be<u>hest</u> of God,

Who fashioned the universe in six days and blessed the seventh day,//

you have made the seventh more honorable by laying down a definition of the Faith.

**V.** (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

You have enabled all men, O thrice-blessed <u>Fa</u>thers, to come to the knowledge of the <u>Trin</u>ity as the Cause of the world's gener<u>at</u>ion; for by your mystical <u>rea</u>soning you established three and four <u>Councils</u>, and you appeared as champions of <u>Or</u>thodoxy, for you showed that, while there are four <u>elements</u>,// it is the Trinity Who created them and <u>made</u> the world. V. (2) *Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!*  It would have been enough for Elisha the <u>Proph</u>et to have bent down only once to give life to the dead son of the <u>wom</u>an; but he knelt and bent <u>sev</u>en times. And in his foresight he prophesied your <u>gath</u>ering, by which you breathed life into the slaying of <u>God</u> the Word,// by putting to death Arius and his profane com<u>pan</u>ions.

**V.** (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

In your wisdom, O venerable <u>Fa</u>thers, you mended the garment of Christ, rent by <u>howling</u> dogs; for you could not bear looking upon the nakedness of His <u>Body</u>, but as Shem and Japheth of old who hid their father's <u>nakedness</u>, you put to shame that slayer of his father, the wretched <u>Ar</u>ius,// and those who foolishly follow his <u>teach</u>ings.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

# Tone 6 *(for the Fathers)*

Today let us praise the mystical trumpets of the <u>Spir</u>it, the God-bearing <u>Fa</u>thers, who stand in the midst of the Church, singing true the<u>ology</u>, praising the changeless <u>Trin</u>ity! They laid low the errors of <u>Ar</u>ius and upheld the <u>Orthodox Faith.//</u> They always entreat the Lord to have <u>mercy</u> on our souls.

# **Tone 1** (*Theotokion – Dogmatikon*)

Let us <u>praise</u> the Virgin <u>Mary</u>! The gate of heaven, the <u>glory</u> of the world! The <u>song</u> of the angels, the beauty of the <u>faith</u>ful! She was born of <u>man</u>, yet gave <u>birth</u> to God! She was re<u>vealed</u> as the heaven, as the temple of the <u>God</u>head! She destroyed the wall of <u>en</u>mity! She com<u>menced</u> the peace; she opened the <u>King</u>dom! Since she is <u>our</u> foundation of faith, our de<u>fen</u>der is the <u>Lord</u> Whom she bore! Courage! Courage! # **Tone 1**(for the Resurrection)

We have been <u>freed</u> from <u>suf</u>ferings by Your <u>suf</u>fering, O Christ. <u>We</u> have been delivered from cor<u>rup</u>tion by Your <u>Resurrec</u>tion.// O Lord, <u>glo</u>ry to You!

V. The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty!

Let creation rejoice! Let the <u>heav</u>ens be glad! Let the <u>nations clap their hands with gladness</u>, for Christ our Savior has <u>nailed</u> our <u>sins</u> to the Cross. Slaying <u>death</u>, He has given <u>life</u>.// He has resurrected fallen Adam as the <u>Lov</u>er of man.

**V**. For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved.

As <u>King</u> of <u>heav</u>en and earth, You were voluntarily crucified in Your <u>love</u> for man. <u>Hell</u> was angered when it <u>met</u> You below. Adam rose seeing You, the Cre<u>a</u>tor, <u>un</u>der the earth. O <u>won</u>der! How has the Life of all <u>tast</u>ed death? You enlightened the <u>world</u> which cries:// O Lord, Who rose from the dead, <u>glo</u>ry to You!

V. Holiness befits Your house, O Lord, forevermore!

The <u>myrrh</u>bearing women came with <u>haste</u> to Your tomb, bearing myrrh and la<u>ment</u>ing. Not <u>find</u>ing Your most pure <u>bo</u>dy, they learned from the angel of the new and <u>glo</u>rious <u>won</u>der. They <u>told</u> the A<u>pos</u>tles:// "The Lord is risen, granting the world great <u>mer</u>cy."

## **Tone 4** *(for the Fathers)*

Come, all Orthodox <u>Church</u>es, let us celebrate today in faith and true <u>wor</u>ship the <u>year</u>ly commemoration of the divinely-arrayed <u>Fa</u>thers who gathered at Nicea from through<u>out</u> the world! There they refuted the godless <u>teaching</u> of <u>Ar</u>ius, banishing him from the catholic Church by a decree of the <u>coun</u>cil. They taught all to confess openly the <u>Son</u> of God, consubstantial and co-e<u>ter</u>nal with the <u>Fa</u>ther, proclaiming this with precision and true worship in the <u>Sym</u>bol of Faith. Therefore, as we faithfully follow their divine <u>doc</u>trines, let us worship the Father, the Son, and the most <u>Ho</u>ly <u>Spir</u>it,// the consubstantial Trinity in one <u>God</u>head!

Tone 4(Theotokion)

Look on the entreaties of your servants, O <u>Blame</u>less One! Stop all the terrible attacks against us, <u>free</u>ing us from every af<u>flic</u>tion, for we have only you as our sure and firm <u>an</u>chor! Do not let us be put to <u>shame</u>, O <u>La</u>dy, for we call on you for our inter<u>ces</u>sion! Hasten to pray for those who <u>call</u> in faith: "Rejoice, O <u>La</u>dy, <u>Help</u> of all:// the Joy and Shelter and Sal<u>va</u>tion of our souls!" (at Great Vespers)

#### Troparion (Resurrection) Tone 1

When the stone had been sealed by the Jews, while the soldiers were guarding Your most pure <u>bo</u>dy, You rose on the third day, O Savior, granting life to the world. The powers of heaven therefore cried to You, O Giver of Life: "Glory to Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion, O Christ! Glory to Your Kingdom!// Glory to Your dispensation, O Lover of mankind!"

#### Tone 8 **Troparion** (*Fathers*)

# Tone 1Troparion (Resurrection)

When the <u>stone</u> had been sealed by the <u>Jews</u>, while the soldiers were guarding Your most pure <u>bo</u>dy, You <u>rose</u> on the third day, O <u>Sav</u>ior, granting <u>life</u> to the world. The <u>pow</u>ers of heaven therefore cried to You, O <u>Giv</u>er of Life: "Glory to Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion, O Christ! <u>Glory to Your Kingdom!//</u> Glory to Your dispensation, O <u>Lov</u>er of mankind!"

# Tone 8 Troparion (*Fathers*)

You are most <u>glo</u>rious, O <u>Christ</u> our God! You have es<u>tab</u>lished the <u>Ho</u>ly Fathers as <u>lights</u> on the earth. Through them You have <u>guid</u>ed us to the <u>true</u> Faith.// O greatly com<u>pas</u>sionate <u>One</u>, <u>glo</u>ry to You!

# Tone 1 Kontakion (*Resurrection*)

As <u>God</u>, You rose from the tomb in <u>glory</u>, raising the <u>world</u> with Yourself. Human <u>na</u>ture praises You as God, for death has <u>van</u>ished. Adam exults, O <u>Mas</u>ter! Eve rejoices, for she is freed from bondage and <u>cries</u> to You:// "You are the Giver of Resurrection to all, O Christ!"

# Tone 6 Kontakion (*Fathers*)

The Son Who shone forth from the <u>Fa</u>ther was ineffably born, two-fold in nature, of a <u>wom</u>an. Having beheld Him, we do not deny the <u>im</u>age of His form, but depict it piously and revere it <u>faith</u>fully. Thus, keeping the <u>True</u> Faith,// the Church venerates the icon of Christ In<u>car</u>nate.

Let Your mercy, O Lord, be upon us / as we have set our hope on You! (Ps. 32:22)

V. Rejoice in the Lord, O you righteous! Praise befits the just! (Ps. 32:1)

Tone 4Prokeimenon(Song of the Three Holy Children)

Blessed are You, O Lord God of our fathers, / and praised and glorified is Your Name forever! (*Song of the Three Holy Children, v. 3*)
