"Lord I Call..." Tone 3

Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me. Hear <u>me</u>, O Lord. Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me. Receive the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call</u> upon You.// Hear me, O Lord.

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>in</u>cense, and let the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice.// <u>Hear me</u>, O Lord.

V. (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name!

Tone 3 *(for the Resurrection)*

By Your Cross, O Christ our <u>Sav</u>ior, death's dominion has been <u>shat</u>tered; the devil's de<u>lu</u>sion destroyed. The race of man, being <u>saved</u> by faith,// always <u>offers You</u> a song.

V. (9) The righteous will surround me; for You will deal bountifully with me.

All has been enlightened by Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion, O Lord. Paradise has been <u>opened again</u>. All creation, <u>prais</u>ing You,// always <u>offers You</u> a song.

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

I glorify the power of the <u>Fa</u>ther and the Son. I praise the authority of the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit: the undivided, uncreated <u>Godhead</u>,// the consubstantial Trinity which <u>reigns</u> for<u>ev</u>er.

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

(Resurrection stichera by Anatolius)

We bow down in worship before Your precious <u>Cross</u>, O Christ, and we glorify and praise Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion,// for by Your <u>wounds</u> we have <u>all</u> been healed.

V. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

Tone 2 (for St. Abercius) (Joseph of Arimathea)

With the splendors of divine <u>teachings</u> you destroyed the night of polytheism, O Father A<u>ber</u>cius. You re<u>vealed</u> the dawn in all-glorious <u>mir</u>acles, making those who were in darkness <u>child</u>ren of the day. Therefore, we all celebrate your holy <u>mem</u>ory with faith,// singing hymns to you, O divinely in<u>spired</u> one.

V. **(5)** For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

You performed a miracle, O Father,

mingling wine and oil in a single vessel, pre<u>serving</u> them in that way, but when <u>need</u>ed you caused them to separate by di<u>vine</u> grace. By your supplication you caused a gift of warm water to <u>gush</u> forth healing the infirmities of those who ap<u>proach</u> you with faith// and call you blessed, O Father A<u>ber</u>cius.

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

Dedicating your whole self to God, O Abercius,

you fulfilled the <u>teachings</u> of God.

You received grace from on high, O venerable one,

driving away mankind's many in<u>fir</u>mities.

You destroyed the temples of the *idols*,//

planting the knowledge of God in those who languished in wretched ignorance, O <u>bles</u>sed one.

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and *He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.*

The blessed Youths spurned the <u>e</u>vil commands: submitting to God, they were bound, breaking the bonds of <u>false</u>hood. Rejecting worldly rank, they have received the glory of per<u>fection</u>,// which won for them the joy of the heavenly <u>King</u>dom.

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

You trained yourselves mightily for the struggles of <u>suf</u>fering, O Saints. You hid in a cave, en<u>treat</u>ing the Lord.

With un<u>ceasing supplications you sought power and might</u> from Him through His wisdom and judgments as the <u>Lov</u>er of man.// In a godly manner He commanded all of you to fall a<u>sleep</u> in peace.

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

Come, O people, let us earnestly hymn the witnesses of <u>pi</u>ety: the divinely assembled <u>regiment</u>, the blessed <u>choir</u>, the invincible company of <u>mar</u>tyrs, the beautiful triumph of the <u>Church</u> of God, the indi<u>vis</u>ible as<u>sem</u>bly,// the unvanquished army and unshakable foundation of <u>pi</u>ety!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 3 (for St. Abercius)

Venerable hierarch, most blessed Father A<u>ber</u>cius, you are a wonder-worker and <u>fav</u>orite of God. Shining forth in your pro<u>phet</u>ic life, you have been granted apos<u>tol</u>ic gifts. Together with the Angels you ever minister before the <u>Sav</u>ior.// Pray that our souls may be de<u>liv</u>ered <u>from</u> all harm!

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 3 (*Theotokion – Dogmatikon*)

How can we not <u>won</u>der

at your mystical childbearing, O exalted <u>Mother</u>? For without receiving the <u>touch</u> of man, you gave birth to a Son in the flesh, O immaculate <u>Virgin</u>. The Son born of the Father before e<u>ter</u>nity was born of you at the fullness of time, O honored <u>La</u>dy. He underwent no mingling, no change, no di<u>vi</u>sion, but preserved the fullness of each <u>na</u>ture. Entreat Him, O Lady and Virgin and <u>Mo</u>ther, to save the souls of those who, in the Orthodox manner, con<u>fess</u> you// to be the <u>Theoto</u>kos.

ApostichaTone 3(for the Resurrection)

The sun was darkened by Your <u>Passion</u>, O Christ, but all creation was enlightened by the light of Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion.// Accept our evening <u>song</u>, O <u>Lov</u>er of man!

V. The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty!

Your life-bearing Resur<u>rec</u>tion, O Lord, enlightened the whole universe, recalling Your cre<u>a</u>tion. Delivered from Adam's <u>curse</u>, we sing:// O Almighty <u>Lord</u>, <u>glory</u> to You!

V. For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved.

You are the <u>change</u>less God, Who, suffering in the <u>flesh</u>, were changed. Creation could not endure seeing <u>You</u> on the Cross. It was filled with fear while praising Your <u>pa</u>tience. By descending to hell and rising on the <u>third</u> day,// You have granted to the world <u>life</u> and great <u>mer</u>cy.

V. Holiness befits Your house, O Lord, forevermore!

You endured <u>death</u>, O Christ, to deliver the race of <u>men</u> from death. You rose from the dead on the <u>third</u> day, raising with Yourself those who <u>knew</u> You as God// and enlightening the <u>world</u>. <u>Glo</u>ry to You! Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 3(Theotokion)

By the will of the <u>Fa</u>ther,

without seed, of the Holy Spirit you conceived the <u>Son</u> of God. He was born of the Father before eternity without a <u>mother</u>, but now for our sake He came from you without a <u>fa</u>ther!// Do not cease entreating Him to de<u>liv</u>er our <u>souls</u> from harm!

(at Great Vespers)

Tone 3 Troparion (*Resurrection*)

Let the heavens rejoice! Let the <u>earth</u> be glad! For the Lord has shown <u>strength</u> with His arm. He has trampled down <u>death</u> by death. (at the Divine Liturgy)

Tone 3 Troparion (*Resurrection*)

Tone 8 Kontakion (St. Abercius)

The whole Church <u>hon</u>ors <u>you</u> as a great <u>hie</u>rarch and as a com<u>pan</u>ion <u>to</u> the A<u>pos</u>tles.// By your prayers keep the <u>Church</u> un<u>con</u>quered and unshaken by heresy, O glorious A<u>ber</u>cius.

Tone 4 Kontakion (Holy Youths)

The Seven Holy Youths renounced the perishing <u>com</u>forts of this world, preferring the eternal things of <u>Heav</u>en.

They were incorrupt after death and <u>rose</u> from the dead

and buried the snares of the <u>devils!//</u>

O faithful, let us then honor them, singing a hymn of praise to Christ!

Tone 3Prokeimenon(Resurrection)

Sing praises to our God, sing praises! / Sing praises to our King, sing praises! (*Ps. 46:6*)

V. Clap your hands, all peoples! Shout to God with loud songs of joy! (Ps. 46:1)

V. In You, O Lord, have I hoped; let me never be put to shame! (Ps. 30:1a)
