#### "Lord I Call..." Tone 6

Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! <u>Hear</u> me, O Lord! Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! Receive the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call</u> upon You!// Hear me, O Lord!

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>in</u>cense, and let the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice!// Hear <u>me</u>, O Lord!

V. (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name!

**Tone 6** *(for the Resurrection)* 

Possessing victory over <u>hell</u>, O Christ, since You are <u>free</u> among the dead, You as<u>cend</u>ed the Cross raising with Yourself those who sat in the <u>shades</u> of death.// Drawing life from Your light, O almighty Savior, have <u>mer</u>cy on us!

V. (9) The righteous will surround me, for You will deal bountifully with me.

Today Christ <u>tramples</u> on death, for He is <u>risen</u> as He said! Let us all <u>sing</u> this song, for He has granted joy to the world: O Light unapproachable, O <u>Foun</u>tain of life!// O Savior almighty, have <u>mer</u>cy on us!

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

Even there is Your hand, O <u>Mas</u>ter! To You we flee, and falling be<u>fore</u> You, we pray:// O You Who rose from the dead, have <u>mer</u>cy on us!

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

(Resurrection stichera by Anatolius)

In Your Cross, we <u>glo</u>ry, O Christ. We sing and glorify Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion. For <u>You</u> are our God,// and we know no <u>oth</u>er than You.

**V.** (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

**Tone 4** (for St. John) (You have given a sign)

In mercy, O wondrous John, you followed the most merciful <u>Mas</u>ter. You cast forth your bread, O venerable one, distributing to <u>those</u> in need. <u>There</u>fore, O holy one, your memory is truly e<u>ter</u>nal. We celebrate it with <u>faith</u> and love.// By your supplications, save us from temptations and tribulations, O most

wealthy bishop!

**V**. **(5)** For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

He Who sees what is hidden elevated you to a most magnificent throne. He foresaw your <u>purity</u>, the <u>rightness</u> of your mind, and your godly <u>pre</u>sence. He anointed and perfected you with chrism, O <u>wise</u> one, openly appointing you to be the <u>shep</u>herd <u>of</u> His flock.// You guided them to the heaven of divine desire, O divinely-eloquent John.

**V**. **(4)** *From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!* 

The Lord granted all the requests of your heart, O truly <u>won</u>drous one. You observed all the laws of sal<u>va</u>tion, for you loved <u>God</u> and neighbor without limit, as your <u>very</u> self, O divinely <u>bless</u>ed one. You <u>sat</u>isfied <u>those</u> in need.// Therefore, O John, we <u>hon</u>or you today.

**V. (3)** For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

**Tone 8**(for Ven. Nilus)(What shall we call you)

<u>What</u> shall we call you now, O <u>ho</u>ly one? A river gushing forth from the spiritual <u>E</u>den? A torrent of <u>gifts</u> be<u>stowed</u> by God? A flood of the grace of <u>teaching</u>? A cup of wisdom and <u>know</u>ledge? A most <u>mighty</u> inter<u>ces</u>sor? A most active <u>teacher</u>?// Pray that our <u>souls</u> may be saved!

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

<u>What</u> shall we name you, O <u>ven</u>erable one? Cultivator of the eternal gardens, O <u>bles</u>sed one? Husbandman of the spiritual <u>vine</u>yard of the <u>faith</u>ful? One most skilled in <u>God</u>-given laws? Knower of God-inspired <u>teaching</u>? Poet of the <u>good</u>ness of creation? In<u>struc</u>tor of peace?// Pray that our <u>souls</u> may be saved!

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

<u>What</u> shall we call you now, O <u>won</u>drous one? Keeper of the sanctity of <u>mar</u>riage? Pro<u>tec</u>tor of <u>chas</u>tity? Instructor of mo<u>nas</u>tics? Guide of virg<u>in</u>ity? One who balanced both estates, having by ex<u>per</u>ience <u>lived</u> through both? Your divine deeds were many, and you greatly <u>fast</u>ed for God.// Pray that our <u>souls</u> may be saved!

#### **Tone 2** (for St. John, by Anatolius)

John, the great pastor and beacon of Alex<u>an</u>dria, the follower of Christ, was a wellspring of <u>mer</u>cy. His true <u>sym</u>pathy overflowed with increasing compassion for <u>those</u> in need. Come, let us who are poor in spirit <u>drink</u> our fill! Let us practice his se<u>ren</u>ity! With a <u>truly</u> compassionate presence, he showed hospitality to Christ in the <u>per</u>son of the poor Like Abraham in <u>days</u> of old, he was counted worthy of <u>bless</u>edness.// He prays with boldness that our souls may find <u>mer</u>cy.

**Tone 6** (*Theotokion – Dogmatikon*)

Who will not bless you, O most holy <u>Virgin</u>? Who will not sing of your most pure <u>child</u>bearing? The only-begotten Son shone timelessly from the <u>Fa</u>ther, but from you He was ineffably in<u>car</u>nate. God by nature, yet <u>Man</u> for our sake, not two persons, but one known in two <u>natures</u>. Entreat Him, O pure and all-blessed <u>Lady</u>,// to have <u>mercy</u> on our souls!

By your vigilant <u>prayer</u> you <u>cut</u> away the undergrowth of the body's insurgent <u>pas</u>sions.

As you have <u>bold</u>ness before the <u>Lord</u>, free me from every danger so that I may <u>cry</u> to you://

"Rejoice, uni<u>ve</u>rsal <u>fa</u>ther <u>Ni</u>lus!"
