TONE 7

24th Sunday after Pentecost (9th of Luke); Prophet Obadiah, Martyr Barlaam of Caesarea

"Lord I Call..." Tone 7

Lord, I call upon You, hear me! Hear me, O Lord!
Lord, I call upon You, hear me!
Receive the voice of my prayer, when I call upon You!//
Hear me, O Lord!

Let my prayer arise in Your <u>sight</u> as <u>incense</u>, and <u>let</u> the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an <u>evening sacrifice!//</u> Hear me, O Lord!

**V.** (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name!

## **Tone 7** *(for the Resurrection)*

Come, let us rejoice in the Lord, Who destroyed the dominion of death! Let us sing to Him with the bodiless hosts, for He enlightened the race of man!// O our Maker and Savior, glory to You!

V. (9) The righteous will surround me; for You will deal bountifully with me.

You en<u>dured</u> the Cross and <u>bur</u>ial for our sake. By Your <u>death</u>, You destroyed <u>death</u> as God. We fall <u>down</u> before Your Resurrection on the <u>third</u> day,// O Savior, glory to You!

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

When the Apostles beheld the Resurrection of the Maker, they were amazed and sang the angelic praise.

This is the glory of the Church.

This is the richness of the Kingdom.//
O Lord, crucified for our sake, glory to You!

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

### (Resurrection stichera by Anatolius)

You were <u>held</u> by lawless <u>men</u>, O Christ, but to <u>me</u>, You are God, and I am <u>not</u> ashamed. You were <u>smit</u>ten on the cheek, but I do not de<u>ny</u> You. You were <u>nailed</u> to the Cross and I do not con<u>ceal</u> it, for I <u>glo</u>ry in Your Resurrection: Your <u>death</u> is my life.// O Almighty Lord and Lover of man, glory to You!

**V.** (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

**Tone 1** (for Prophet Obadiah) (O all-praised martyrs)

As a <u>shin</u>ing vessel of the <u>Spir</u>it, you were illumined by Him, Oba<u>di</u>ah. With most divine <u>vis</u>ion, you were enriched by the image of <u>proph</u>ecy; foreknowledge of things to <u>come</u> and <u>knowledge</u> of the truth.// Pray that He may grant our souls peace and great <u>mer</u>cy!

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

The <u>glo</u>rious and honorable <u>Proph</u>ets participate through com<u>mun</u>ion by grace in the <u>very</u> attributes and <u>prop</u>erties by which <u>God</u> is <u>made</u> known.//
The Lord enlightens His chosen ones with His <u>splen</u>dor.

**V.** (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

You were a <u>glo</u>rious <u>proph</u>et: a divine herald of God full of un<u>fad</u>ing light. You be<u>held</u> the glory which surpasses understanding and <u>rea</u>son as you stood be<u>fore</u> the <u>Mas</u>ter of all.// Entreat Him that He may grant our souls peace and great <u>mer</u>cy!

**V.** (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

## **Tone 4** (for St. Barlaam) (As one valiant among the martyrs)

You were more sturdy than a <u>pillar</u>, harder than iron, and <u>stronger</u> than bronze; for <u>each</u> of these, when submitted to fire, is over<u>come</u> by its force; it melts and is <u>quickly</u> destroyed.
But your right hand did not waver when it was placed <u>o</u>ver the <u>burn</u>ing coals.// Unexpectedly it prevailed, O all-wise <u>Bar</u>laam.

## V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

As though you were a priest standing be<u>fore</u> God, and coming before Him, not with another's blood, but with your own, O blessed <u>mar</u>tyr, you <u>of</u>fered a sacrifice of sweet <u>frag</u>rance, not to the delusion of <u>de</u>mons,// but to Christ the Savior and Master Who reigns for<u>ev</u>er.

**V.** (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

A priest who offers and a lamb that is <u>offered</u>; joyfully we call you both, O Martyr, <u>wor</u>thy of all praise; as a <u>victim</u>, entirely un<u>blem</u>ished, you made yourself a whole-burnt offering to God through the fire of <u>tor</u>ments.// Earnestly pray that He save those who praise and honor your <u>mem</u>ory!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

# **Tone 7** (*Theotokion – Dogmatikon*)

No tongue can speak of your wonderful childbearing, for the order of nature was overruled by God.

You were revealed to be a Mother above nature, for you remained a Virgin beyond reason and understanding. Your conception was most glorious, O Theotokos!

The manner of your giving birth was ineffable, O Virgin!

Knowing you to be the Mother of God, devoutly we pray to you://

"Beseech Him to save our souls!"

# **Aposticha**

## **Tone 7** *(for the Resurrection)*

As the <u>Sav</u>ior of the world You a<u>rose</u> from the tomb. As <u>God</u> You resurrected the race of <u>man</u> with Your flesh.// O <u>Lord</u>, <u>glo</u>ry to You!

**V**. The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty!

<u>Come</u>, let us worship the One Who <u>rose</u> from the dead, and en<u>light</u>ened all creation!

By His <u>death</u>, He saved us from the <u>tor</u>ments of hell.//

By His Resurrection He has granted us eternal life and great mercy.

**V**. For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved.

You de<u>scend</u>ed into hell, capturing <u>death</u>, O Christ. In three <u>days</u> You a<u>rose</u> again, resur<u>rec</u>ting us who glorify Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion,// O Lord and Lover of man.

V. Holiness befits Your house, O Lord, forevermore!

When <u>You</u> were placed in the tomb as <u>one</u> asleep, the <u>sight</u> was great and <u>awe</u>some.

But when <u>You</u> rose on the third day as al<u>mighty</u> God, <u>You</u> resurrected <u>Ad</u>am with Yourself.//
Glory to Your Resurrection, only <u>Lover</u> of man!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

## **Tone 7** (*Theotokion*)

All the <u>earth</u>-born run to your protection, O <u>La</u>dy! <u>You</u> are our hope, O Theo<u>to</u>kos! De<u>liv</u>er us from our <u>count</u>less sins// and <u>pray</u> that our <u>souls</u> may be saved.

# (at Great Vespers)

## **Tone 7 Troparion** (*Resurrection*)

By Your <u>Cross</u> You destroyed <u>death</u>. To the thief You opened <u>Paradise</u>. For the <u>Myrrh</u>bearers You changed weeping into joy. And You commanded Your disciples, O <u>Christ</u> God, to pro<u>claim</u> that You are <u>risen</u>,// granting the <u>world</u> great <u>mercy</u>.

Intercede that all that be granted forgiveness, Great-martyr Barlaam.

#### **Tone 4** Resurrectional Dismissal Theotokion

The mystery of all eternity, unknown even by Angels, through you, Theotokos, is revealed to those on earth: God incarnate by union without confusion. He voluntarily accepted the Cross for us, by which He resurrected the first-created man,//saving our souls from death.

# (at the Divine Liturgy)

## **Tone 7** Troparion (Resurrection)

By Your <u>Cross</u> You destroyed <u>death</u>. To the thief You opened <u>Paradise</u>. For the <u>Myrrh</u>bearers You changed weeping into joy. And You commanded Your disciples, O <u>Christ</u> God, to pro<u>claim</u> that You are <u>risen</u>,// granting the <u>world</u> great <u>mercy</u>.

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### **Tone 7 Kontakion** (*Resurrection*)

The dominion of death can no longer hold men <u>cap</u>tive, for Christ descended, shattering and destroying its <u>pow</u>ers. Hell is <u>bound</u>, while the Prophets rejoice and cry: "The Savior has come to <u>those</u> in faith;// enter, you <u>faithful</u>, into the Resur<u>rec</u>tion!"

### Tone 3 Kontakion (St. Barlaam)

Though weak with old <u>age</u> you vanquished the <u>E</u>vil One in your mighty contest, O <u>Bar</u>laam.

You endured the rack like one without a <u>body</u>, and steadfastly endured the <u>burn</u>ing of your hand.//

Therefore, God the Word has <u>crowned</u> you with a <u>crown</u> of <u>glo</u>ry.

The Lord shall give strength to His people. / The Lord shall bless His people with peace. (*Ps. 28:11*)

V. Offer to the Lord, O you sons of God! Offer young rams to the Lord! (Ps. 28:1a)
