V. (9) The righteous will surround me; for You will deal bountifully with me.

Lord, Lord, do not cast us a<u>way</u> from Your face! For You willed to have <u>mer</u>cy on us// by Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion.

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

Rejoice, O holy Zion: Mother of the churches, the a<u>bode</u> of God, for you were the first to re<u>ceive</u> re<u>mis</u>sion of sins// by the Resur<u>rec</u>tion.

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

(Resurrection stichera by Anatolius)

The <u>Word</u> of God the <u>Fa</u>ther, begotten before the <u>ages</u>, in the latter times willed to be in<u>car</u>nate of the <u>Virgin</u> and endured cruci<u>fi</u>xion unto death. He has <u>saved</u> mortal man// by His Resurrection.

V. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

We glorify You, O Lord, for You voluntarily endured the <u>Cross</u> for our sake. We fall down in worship before You, O al<u>mighty Sav</u>ior. Do not cast us a<u>way</u> from Your face but hear us and save us, O <u>Lov</u>er of man,// by Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion!

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

<u>Glo</u>ry to You, O <u>Sav</u>ior Christ, Only-begotten Son of God, who was <u>nailed</u> to the Cross// and resurrected from the tomb on the <u>third</u> day!

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

We <u>glorify</u> Your Resurrection from the <u>dead</u>, O Christ, by which You have freed Adam's race from the <u>tor</u>tures of hell,// and as God have granted to the world eternal life and great <u>mer</u>cy.

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

Tone 1 (for Ven. Alypius) (O all-praised martyrs)

O most blessed Alypius,

from your youth you offered your life to <u>Christ</u> our God, and <u>strength</u>ened by Him, you submitted the passions of your <u>body</u> to the <u>will</u> of the <u>spir</u>it.

Thus, you subjected that which is lower to that which is <u>high</u>er.//
Therefore, entreat the Lord that He grant our souls peace and great mercy!

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

O A<u>ly</u>pius, <u>wise</u> in God, you were revealed to be a shining <u>bea</u>con, il<u>lu</u>mining the earth with the splendor of your wonders and <u>god</u>ly deeds. Thus, at your repose, you were received into the presence of the <u>nev</u>er <u>set</u>ting Sun.//

Therefore, entreat the Lord that He grant our souls peace and great <u>mer</u>cy!

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

O wise Father Alypius,

you were truly the example of an immovable pillar to all mo<u>nas</u>tics, for, <u>high</u> upon your pillar, you stood in <u>vigilant</u> prayer, enduring both the heat of the <u>day</u> and the <u>cold</u> of the night. <u>There</u>fore, you received the divine gifts of the <u>Spirit</u> to heal infirmities and drive away evil <u>pas</u>sions.// Therefore, entreat the Lord that He grant our souls peace and great <u>mer</u>cy!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 8 (*Theotokion – Dogmatikon*)

The <u>King</u> of heaven, because of His <u>love</u> for man, appeared on earth and <u>dwelt</u> with men. He took <u>flesh</u> from the pure <u>Virgin</u> and after assuming it, He came <u>forth</u> from her. The Son is one: in two natures, yet one <u>Per</u>son. Proclaiming Him as perfect <u>God</u> and <u>per</u>fect Man, we confess <u>Christ</u> our God!//
Entreat Him, O unwedded Mother, to have <u>mer</u>cy on our souls.

Aposticha

Tone 8 *(for the Resurrection)*

Descending from heaven to ascend the Cross, the eternal Life has come for death to raise those who are fallen; to enlighten those in darkness.//
O Jesus, our Savior and illuminator, glory to You!

V. The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty!
