### 26th Sunday after Pentecost (11th of Luke), Prophet Zephaniah

### "Lord I Call..." Tone 1

Lord, I call upon You, hear me! Hear me, O Lord!
Lord, I call upon You, hear me!
Receive the voice of my prayer, when I call upon You!//
Hear me, O Lord!

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>incense</u>, and <u>let</u> the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an <u>evening sacrifice!//</u> <u>Hear me</u>, O Lord!

**V.** (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name!

### **Tone 1** *(for the Resurrection)*

Ac<u>cept</u> our evening prayers, O <u>ho</u>ly Lord! Grant us re<u>mis</u>sion of sins,// for You alone have manifested the Resur<u>rec</u>tion to the world.

V. (9) The righteous will surround me, for You will deal bountifully with me.

En<u>cir</u>cle <u>Zi</u>on and surround her, O <u>peo</u>ple!
Give <u>glory</u> in her to the One Who <u>rose</u> from the dead!
For <u>He</u> is <u>our</u> God,//
Who has delivered us from our transgressions!

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

Come, O people, let us hymn and fall down before Christ, glorifying His Resurrection from the dead! For He is our God,// Who has delivered the world from the Enemy's deceit!

**V**. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

### (Resurrection stichera by Anatolius)

Be glad, O heavens!
Sound trumpets, O foun<u>da</u>tions of the earth!
Sing in <u>glad</u>ness, O <u>moun</u>tains!
Behold Emmanuel has <u>nailed</u> our <u>sins</u> to the Cross!
Granting <u>life</u>, He has <u>slain</u> death.//
He has resurrected Adam as the Lover of man.

**V.** (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

### Let us praise Him

Who voluntarily was crucified in the <u>flesh</u> for our sake. He <u>suffered</u>, was buried, but <u>rose</u> from the dead. By Orthodoxy con<u>firm</u> Your <u>Church</u>, O Christ.// Grant peace for our life as the gracious <u>Lov</u>er of man.

**V.** (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

We <u>stand</u> before Your life-bearing tomb unworthily, O <u>Christ</u> God, offering glory to Your ineffable com<u>passion</u>. You have ac<u>cept</u>ed the Cross and death, O <u>sin</u>less One// to grant Resurrection to the world as the <u>Lover</u> of man.

**V.** (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

Let us praise the Word, co-eternal with the <u>Fa</u>ther.

He in<u>eff</u>ably came forth from the <u>virg</u>inal womb.

He freely accepted the <u>Cross</u> and <u>death</u> for our sake.

He was <u>raised</u> in <u>glo</u>ry.//

Glory to You, O lifegiving Lord, the <u>Sav</u>ior of our souls!

**V.** (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

### **Tone 4** (for Prophet Zephaniah) (Called from on high)

As a divine prophet, herald and proclaimer of the <u>words</u> of God, receiving the radiance of divine splendor in <u>purity</u> of mind, you were re<u>vealed</u> as the divinely inspired mouth of the <u>Spirit</u>. You proclaim the things He re<u>vealed</u> to you, telling all the <u>nations</u>, O most <u>hon</u>ored one, of the Kingdom of Christ and the salvation that is <u>given</u> to men.// Entreat Him to save and en<u>lighten</u> our souls!

### V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

You fittingly shine forth in the vision of God, O divinely in<u>spired</u> one, honored with grace and a chief place among the <u>Proph</u>ets, re<u>ceiv</u>ing the <u>bless</u>ings of God.

Now that you have boldness towards the All-Good One and <u>sym</u>pathy for us, we honor you for having the eloquence of God, being honorable and <u>pleasing</u> to Him.

Never cease to pray on behalf of those who <u>praise</u> you in faith,//that He may deliver us from misfortunes and <u>save</u> our souls!

**V**. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

You revealed Your Prophet, O Immortal One, to be a living cloud pouring forth the water of eternal life. You sent him forth, giving him freely the All-holy Spirit, consubstantial with You, the Almighty Father, and Your Son, who shone forth from Your Essence, by which he prophesied the saving coming of Christ our God,//proclaiming salvation to all the nations.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

## **Tone 1** (*Theotokion – Dogmatikon*)

Let us <u>praise</u> the Virgin <u>Mary!</u>
The gate of heaven, the <u>glory</u> of the world!
The <u>song</u> of the angels, the beauty of the <u>faithful!</u>
She was born of <u>man</u>, yet gave <u>birth</u> to God!
She was re<u>vealed</u> as the heaven, as the temple of the <u>God</u>head!

She destroyed the wall of enmity!
She commenced the peace; she opened the Kingdom!
Since she is our foundation of faith,
our defender is the Lord Whom she bore!
Courage! Courage! O People of God!
For Christ will destroy our enemies//
since He is all powerful.

### **Tone 1** *(for the Resurrection)*

We have been <u>freed</u> from <u>suf</u>ferings by Your <u>suf</u>fering, O Christ. <u>We</u> have been delivered from cor<u>rup</u>tion by Your <u>Resurrection</u>.// O Lord, <u>glo</u>ry to You!

**V**. The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty!

Let creation rejoice!
Let the <u>heavens</u> be glad!
Let the <u>nations</u> clap their hands with <u>gladness</u>, for Christ our Savior has <u>nailed</u> our <u>sins</u> to the Cross. Slaying <u>death</u>, He has given <u>life</u>.//
He has resurrected fallen Adam as the Lover of man.

**V**. For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved.

As <u>King</u> of <u>heav</u>en and earth,
You were voluntarily crucified in Your <u>love</u> for man.

<u>Hell</u> was angered when it <u>met</u> You below.

Adam rose seeing You, the Creator, <u>un</u>der the earth.
O <u>won</u>der! How has the Life of all <u>tast</u>ed death?
You enlightened the <u>world</u> which cries://

**V**. Holiness befits Your house, O Lord, forevermore!

The <u>myrrh</u>bearing women came with <u>haste</u> to Your tomb, bearing myrrh and la<u>menting</u>.

Not <u>finding</u> Your most pure <u>body</u>, they learned from the angel of the new and <u>glo</u>rious <u>won</u>der. They <u>told</u> the A<u>pos</u>tles://

"The Lord is risen, granting the world great <u>mer</u>cy."
