St. Nicholas the Wonderworker, Archbishop of Myra in Lycia

"Lord I Call..." Tone 2

Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! Hear <u>me</u>, O Lord! <u>Lord</u>, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! Receive the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call</u> upon You!// Hear me, O Lord!

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>incense</u>, and <u>let</u> the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice!// Hear me, O Lord!

Tone 2 (*Joseph of Arimathea*)

O Nicholas, living in Myra,

you were anointed with spiritual myrrh,

and were revealed to be truly myrrh, O bishop of Christ.

You make fragrant with myrrh those who keep your memorial with <u>faith</u> and love,

freeing them from misery, danger and af<u>flic</u>tion,//by your intercessions to Christ, O holy <u>Fa</u>ther.

V. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

O Holy Nicholas, the <u>ser</u>vant of Christ,

as a true namesake of victory,

you were <u>shown</u> to the faithful people to be strong amid temp<u>ta</u>tions and grief.

Called from all places, you are swift to come to those who turn with love to your protection.

Appearing by day and night to the <u>faithful</u>,// you save them from dangers and temp<u>ta</u>tions.

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

You appeared in a dream to the Emperor Constantine and his counselor Avlavius,

speaking to them, and <u>put</u>ting them in fear:

"Set free at once those you hold unjustly bound in prison,

for they are not guilty of lawless <u>mur</u>der!

And if you do not listen to my words, O King,//

I will beseech the Lord and intercede against you!"

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

O glorious Nicholas, the holy <u>preacher</u> of Christ, you are the great and fervent protector of those in <u>danger</u>, <u>those</u> on land and sea, far <u>off</u> or near; for you are a most compassionate and mighty inter<u>ces</u>sor. Therefore, as we assemble, we <u>cry</u> aloud://
"Pray to the Lord that we may be delivered from all <u>danger</u>!"

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

Tone 2 (With what crowns)

What crowns of praise shall we weave for the <u>Bish</u>op? Although he lived in <u>My</u>ra, he reaches <u>out</u> in spirit to all who sincerely <u>love</u> him. He is the consolation of all in affliction, the refuge of all in <u>danger</u>, the tower of godliness, the champion of the <u>faithful</u>,// for whose sake the greatly merciful Christ has laid low the arrogance of the <u>En</u>emy.

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

What songs of praise shall we sing to the <u>Bish</u>op? He wrestled against <u>god</u>lessness and was the <u>champion</u> of <u>god</u>liness, a great leader, shield and <u>teach</u>er of the Church, who put all inglorious <u>her</u>esy to shame, the de<u>stroy</u>er and fierce opponent of <u>Arius</u>, whose arrogance was over<u>thrown</u> by Christ,// Who grants to the world great <u>mer</u>cy.

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

With what songs of prophecy shall we praise the <u>Bish</u>op? He foresaw things afar and clearly an<u>nounced</u> them in advance, fore<u>tel</u>ling them as though they were <u>taking</u> place. He looked around the whole world, making in<u>jus</u>tice cease; he appeared in dreams to the emperor <u>wise</u> in God, and de<u>liv</u>ered from an unjust execution those who had <u>been</u> in bonds,// for he is rich in God's great <u>mer</u>cy.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 6

You that love the feasts,

let us gather and sing the praises of the fair ornament of <u>bish</u>ops, the glory of the Fathers, the fount of wonders and the great protector of the faithful.

Let us say: "Rejoice, guardian of the people of <u>Myra</u>, their chief and honored counselor and the pillar that can<u>not</u> be moved! Rejoice, light filled with brightness!

You make the ends of the world shine with wonders.

Rejoice, divine delight of the af<u>flic</u>ted,

the fervent advocate of those who suffer from in <u>justice!</u>

And now, all-blessed Nicholas, never cease praying to <u>Christ</u> our God// for those who honor the high feast of your memorial with <u>faith</u> and love!"

O Bishop Nicholas, you have divinely <u>taught all</u> things well,// and now, wearing your unfading crown, you inter<u>cede</u> for our souls!

You are compassionate to those who <u>call</u> on you in prayer, and you bear the supplications of the weak; you are a de<u>liv</u>erer and protector of those who honor your glorious memory in faith.//

Pray that Christ may grant the world great mercy!

V. Precious in the sight of the Lord is the death of His saints. (Ps. 115:6)

Rejoice, most <u>sacred mind</u>, pure dwelling of the <u>Trinity</u>, <u>pillar of the Church and support of the <u>faithful</u>, help of the <u>fallen</u>, star ever dispersing temptations and af<u>flic</u>tions through the radiance of your prayers, well-<u>pleasing to God!</u> <u>You</u> are a calm haven, O Bishop <u>Nich</u>olas, where <u>those</u> who flee are saved from the threatening <u>wave</u> of life.// Pray that Christ may grant our <u>souls</u> great <u>mercy!</u></u>

He voluntarily accepted the <u>Cross</u> for us, by which He resurrected the first-created man,// saving our souls from death.
