TONE 2

27th Sunday after Pentecost (12th of Luke) Martyrs Means, Hermogenes, and Eugraphus, of Alexandria

"Lord I Call..." Tone 2

Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! Hear <u>me</u>, O Lord! <u>Lord</u>, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! Receive the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call</u> upon You!// Hear me, O Lord!

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>in</u>cense, and <u>let</u> the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice!// <u>Hear me</u>, O Lord!

V. (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name!

Tone 2 *(for the Resurrection)*

Come, let us worship the <u>Word</u> of God begotten of the Father before all <u>ages</u>, and in<u>car</u>nate of the Virgin <u>Mary</u>! Having en<u>dured</u> the Cross, He was buried as He Him<u>self</u> desired.// And having risen from the dead, He saved me, an <u>er</u>ring man.

V. (9) The righteous will surround me; for You will deal bountifully with me.

Christ our <u>Sav</u>ior nailed to the Cross the bond against us, He <u>void</u>ed it and destroyed the dominion of death.//

We fall down before His Resurrection on the third day.

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

With the Archangels
let us praise the Resur<u>rec</u>tion of Christ!
He is our <u>Sav</u>ior, our Redeemer.
He is coming with avecage along and mighty never

He is coming with awesome glory and mighty <u>power</u>// to judge the <u>world</u> which He made.

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

(Resurrection stichera by Anatolius)

The Angel pro<u>claimed</u> You, the crucified and buried <u>Mas</u>ter.

He <u>told</u> the women: "Come, see the <u>place</u> where He lay! He is <u>ris</u>en as He said, for He is al<u>mighty</u>."

We <u>wor</u>ship You, O only im<u>mor</u>tal One.//
Have mercy on us, O Christ, the <u>Giv</u>er of life!

V. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

By Your Cross, You destroyed the <u>curse</u> of the tree. By Your burial You destroyed the do<u>minion</u> of death. By Your <u>rising</u>, You enlightened the <u>race</u> of man.// O Benefactor, Christ our God, <u>glory</u> to You!

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

The gates of death opened to You from <u>fear</u>, O Lord.

When the guards of hell saw You <u>they</u> were afraid,
for You de<u>mol</u>ished the gates of brass and smashed the <u>iron chains.//</u>
You have led us from the darkness and shadows of death, and have <u>broken</u> our bonds.

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

Let us come and worship in the <u>house</u> of the Lord, singing the hymn of sal<u>va</u>tion:
Cleanse our <u>sins</u>, for You were crucified and <u>raised</u> from the dead,// and are in the bosom of the Father!

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

Tone 1 (for the Martyrs) (O all-praised martyrs)

O all-<u>glo</u>rious Martyr <u>Me</u>nas, when your <u>heels</u> were struck, your <u>eyes</u> put out, and your God-speaking <u>tongue</u> removed, you endured with steadfastness, <u>look</u>ing for di<u>vine</u> rewards.// Therefore pray that God may grant peace and great <u>mer</u>cy to our souls!

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

The <u>glorious Hermogenes</u>
desired the severing of his <u>hands</u> and feet.
Be<u>hold</u>ing the fire, he showed forth a greater <u>burn</u>ing of heart
as he clung <u>firm</u>ly <u>un</u>to his God.//
Now we pray to Him that He may grant peace and great mercy to our souls!

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

Your <u>limbs</u> were broken, O <u>wise</u> saints;
you were cast into the <u>depths</u> of the sea.
Having <u>drowned</u> the malice of the <u>ser</u>pent,
you were guided by the hands of the Most High to the calm <u>ha</u>ven of <u>sweet</u>ness.//
Therefore pray that God may grant peace and great <u>mer</u>cy to our souls!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 2 (*Theotokion – Dogmatikon*)

The shadow of the Law passed when <u>grace</u> came; as the Bush burned, yet was <u>not</u> consumed, so the <u>Virgin</u> gave birth, yet remained a <u>Virgin</u>. The Righteous Sun has risen instead of a <u>pil</u>lar of flame.// Instead of Moses, Christ, the Salvation of our souls.

Aposticha

Tone 2 (for the Resurrection)

Your Resurrection, O Christ our <u>Sav</u>ior, has enlightened the whole <u>u</u>niverse, re<u>call</u>ing Your creation.// Glory to You, O al<u>mighty</u> Lord!

V. The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty!

By the Tree You destroyed the curse of the Tree, O <u>Savior</u>. By Your burial You mortified the <u>majesty</u> of death. You have en<u>light</u>ened our race by Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion.// O Giver of life, Christ our God, glory to You!

V. For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved.

When You were seen nailed to the <u>Cross</u>, O Christ, You restored the beauty of Your <u>crea</u>tures. The <u>sol</u>diers showed their inhumanity when they pierced Your <u>side</u> with a spear. The Hebrews, not knowing Your <u>power</u>, asked that Your <u>tomb</u> might be sealed, but through the <u>mer</u>cy of Your com<u>passion</u>, You ac<u>cepted</u> the tomb and rose on the <u>third</u> day!// O Lord, <u>glory</u> to You!

V. Holiness befits Your house, O Lord, forevermore!

O Christ, the <u>Giv</u>er of life, for the sake of the dead You voluntarily en<u>dured</u> death, de<u>scending</u> into hell as the <u>Mighty</u> One to save those who awaited Your <u>coming</u>, granting them the life of paradise in<u>stead</u> of hell.

Grant <u>also</u> to us who glorify Your Resurrection on the <u>third</u> day// cleansing of our sins and great <u>mer</u>cy!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 2 (Theotokion)

A new miracle surpasses all ancient <u>mir</u>acles! Who knows of a Mother who gave birth with<u>out</u> a man, who <u>car</u>ried in her arms her Creator? This birth is the <u>will</u> of God! Since you carried Him as an infant in your arms, O most <u>pure</u> one, and since <u>you</u> possess motherly boldness be<u>fore</u> Him, do not cease praying for us who <u>hon</u>or you,// that He may be bountiful and <u>save</u> our souls!

(at Great Vespers)

Tone 2 Troparion (Resurrection)

When You descended to death, O Life Immortal, You slew hell with the splendor of Your Godhead. And when from the depths You raised the dead, all the powers of heaven cried out:// "O Giver of life, Christ our God, glory to You!"

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit,

Tone 8 Troparion (Martyrs)

Having slain the <u>fiery</u> <u>ragings</u> and fierce movements of the passions through their ascetic <u>la</u>bors,

the Martyrs of Christ, Menas, Hermogenes, and Eugraphus,

received grace to dispel the aff<u>lic</u>tions of the infirm and to work wonders both while alive and after death.

It is a <u>truly great won</u>der that naked bones pour forth <u>heal</u>ing.// Glory to our <u>only God</u> and Creator!

Tone 8 Resurrectional Dismissal Theotokion

For our sake You were <u>born</u> of <u>the Virgin</u> and endured cruci<u>fix</u>ion, O <u>Good</u> One, destroying <u>death</u> by death.

Revealing the <u>Resurrection</u> as God, do not despise the <u>work</u> of Your hand!

Reveal Your <u>love</u> for <u>man</u>, O Merciful One, and accept the Theotokos <u>pray</u>ing for us,//

and save the despairing people, O our Savior!

(at the Divine Liturgy)

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Tone 2 Kontakion (*Resurrection*)

<u>Hell</u> became afraid, O almighty <u>Sav</u>ior, seeing the miracle of Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion from the tomb! The <u>dead</u> arose! Creation, with Adam, beheld this and rejoiced with You,// and the world, my Savior, praises <u>You</u> for<u>ev</u>er.

Tone 1 1st Kontakion (Martyrs)

Let us sing <u>praise</u> in honor of the glorious <u>Me</u>nas, and of his companions, the holy Hermogenes and Eugraphus. For they have <u>hon</u>ored the Lord and fought for His <u>glory</u>. They are worthy of numbering with the Angels in <u>hea</u>ven,// and are bountiful in their miracles.

Tone 2 Prokeimenon (Resurrection)

The Lord is my strength and my song; / He has become my salvation. (Ps. 117:14)

V. The Lord has chastened me sorely, but He has not given me over to death. (Ps. 117:18)
