TONE 3

28th Sunday after Pentecost (13th of Luke) Sunday of the Forefathers, Holy Prophet Daniel and the Three Holy Youths: Ananias, Azarias, and Misael

"Lord I Call..." Tone 3

Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me. Hear <u>me</u>, O Lord. Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me. Receive the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call</u> upon You.// Hear me, O Lord.

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>incense</u>, and let the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice.// Hear me, O Lord.

V. (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name!

Tone 3 *(for the Resurrection)*

By Your Cross, O Christ our <u>Sav</u>ior, death's dominion has been <u>shat</u>tered; the devil's de<u>lu</u>sion destroyed. The race of man, being <u>saved</u> by faith,//always offers You a song.

V. (9) The righteous will surround me; for You will deal bountifully with me.

All has been enlightened by Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion, O Lord. Paradise has been <u>opened</u> again. All creation, <u>prais</u>ing You,// always <u>of</u>fers <u>You</u> a song.

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

I glorify the power of the <u>Fa</u>ther and the Son. I praise the authority of the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit: the undivided, uncreated <u>God</u>head,// the consubstantial Trinity which <u>reigns</u> for<u>ever</u>.

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

(Resurrection stichera by Anatolius)

We bow down in worship before Your precious <u>Cross</u>, O Christ, and we glorify and praise Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion,// for by Your wounds we have all been healed.

V. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

We praise the Savior incarnate of the <u>Virgin</u>, for He was crucified for our sake and resurrected on the <u>third</u> day,//granting <u>us</u> great <u>mer</u>cy.

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

Christ descended to hell proclaiming the glad <u>ti</u>dings: "Behold! Now I have <u>tri</u>umphed!
I am the Resurrection, I will <u>lead</u> you out,// for I have <u>shat</u>tered the <u>gates</u> of death!"

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

Tone 8 (for the Forefathers) (The Paradise of Eden)

Today, as we celebrate the Forefathers' memory, let us the faithful praise Christ the Redeemer, Who magnified them in all the nations! He is the Lord Who does wondrous deeds, for He is powerful and mighty! Through them He has shown us the rod of His strength: she is Mary, the only pure and Virgin Maiden of God. From her Christ blossomed,// bringing forth life, eternal salvation, and unending bliss for all.

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

O <u>Mas</u>ter, You delivered the Holy <u>Youths</u> from the fire, and Daniel from the mouths of <u>li</u>ons; You blessed Abraham, Isaac, Your <u>ser</u>vant, and <u>Ja</u>cob, his son; You consented to become like us by being <u>born</u> of their seed, to be crucified and <u>bur</u>ied, in order to save our <u>Fore</u>fathers, who <u>fell</u> of old. Thus You crushed the <u>bonds</u> of death and raised with Yourself all the dead of <u>ages</u> past,// who worship You, O Christ, King of the ages.

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

<u>Walking</u> amidst the flames as in a gentle <u>shower</u> of rain, the godly Youths exulted in the dew of the <u>Spirit</u>. By this they mystically prefigured the Trinity and <u>Christ's</u> incar<u>na</u>tion. Wise through faith, they quenched the <u>power</u> of fire. So also the righteous Daniel stopped the mouths of <u>li</u>ons. Through their intercessions we beseech You, O <u>Savior</u> and <u>Lover</u> of man: Deliver us from the unquenchable and e<u>ternal</u> fire,// and make us worthy of Your heavenly <u>Kingdom!</u>

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

Standing in a furnace of flaming fire as though in dew, the Holy Youths mystically prefigured Your coming from a Virgin, by which we are illumined but not consumed.

So also the righteous Daniel, glorious among the Prophets, clearly revealed Your divine Second Coming when he cried out: "I saw thrones set up, and the Judge was seated, and the river of fire flowed before Him."//

By their intercessions save us from this fire, O Christ our Master!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 6 *(for the Forefathers, by Anatolius)*

Today, let us the <u>faithful</u> acclaim all the Fathers be<u>fore</u> the Law:
Abraham, the <u>friend</u> of God,
Isaac, born of the <u>promise</u>,
Jacob and the twelve <u>Pa</u>triarchs,
honoring with these the gentle <u>Da</u>vid,
and Daniel, the <u>Prophet</u> of Desires,
and the three Youths who changed the <u>fur</u>nace into dew.
Let us ask forgiveness of <u>Christ</u> our God,//
Who is <u>glo</u>rified in His saints!

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 3 (*Theotokion – Dogmatikon*)

How can we not wonder at your mystical childbearing, O exalted Mother? For without receiving the touch of man, you gave birth to a Son in the flesh, O immaculate Virgin. The Son born of the Father before eternity was born of you at the fullness of time, O honored Lady. He underwent no mingling, no change, no division, but preserved the fullness of each nature. Entreat Him, O Lady and Virgin and Mother, to save the souls of those who, in the Orthodox manner, confess you// to be the Theotokos.

Aposticha

Tone 3 *(for the Resurrection)*

The sun was darkened by Your <u>Passion</u>, O Christ, but all creation was enlightened by the light of Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion.// Accept our evening <u>song</u>, O <u>Lover of man!</u>

V. The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty!

Your life-bearing Resur<u>rec</u>tion, O Lord, enlightened the whole universe, recalling Your cre<u>a</u>tion. Delivered from Adam's <u>curse</u>, we sing://
O Almighty <u>Lord</u>, <u>glory</u> to You!

V. For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved.

You are the <u>change</u>less God, Who, suffering in the <u>flesh</u>, were changed. Creation could not endure seeing <u>You</u> on the Cross. It was filled with fear while praising Your <u>patience</u>. By descending to hell and rising on the <u>third</u> day,// You have granted to the world life and great mercy.

V. Holiness befits Your house, O Lord, forevermore!

You endured <u>death</u>, O Christ, to deliver the race of <u>men</u> from death. You rose from the dead on the <u>third</u> day, raising with Yourself those who <u>knew</u> You as God// and enlightening the <u>world</u>. <u>Glo</u>ry to You!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 3 *(for the Forefathers, by Germanus)*

Come all who <u>love</u> the feast, let us praise in psalms the assembly of the <u>Fore</u>fathers: Adam, our first <u>Fa</u>ther, Enoch, Noah, Mel<u>chizedek</u>, Abraham, Isaac and <u>Ja</u>cob; and those who came <u>af</u>ter the Law: Moses, Aaron, <u>Joshua</u>, Samuel and <u>Da</u>vid, Isaiah, Jeremiah, Ezekiel and <u>Dan</u>iel, and with them the Twelve <u>Proph</u>ets: Elijah, Elisha, and <u>all</u> the rest, Zachariah and John the <u>Bap</u>tist: all those who pro<u>claimed</u> Christ,// the Life and Resur<u>rec</u>tion of the <u>hu</u>man race!

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 3 (Theotokion)

By the will of the <u>Fa</u>ther, without seed, of the Holy Spirit you conceived the <u>Son</u> of God. He was born of the Father before eternity without a <u>mother</u>, but now for our sake He came from you without a <u>fa</u>ther!// Do not cease entreating Him to de<u>liver</u> our <u>souls</u> from harm!

(at Great Vespers)

Tone 3 Troparion (Resurrection)

Let the heavens rejoice!
Let the earth be glad!
For the Lord has shown strength with His arm.
He has trampled down death by death.
He has become the first born of the dead.
He has delivered us from the depths of hell, and has granted to the world//
great mercy.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 2 Troparion (Forefathers)

Through <u>faith</u> You justified the <u>Fore</u>fathers, betrothing through them the Church of the <u>gen</u>tiles. These <u>saints</u> exult in <u>glo</u>ry, for from their seed came forth a <u>glo</u>rious fruit: <u>she</u> who bore You with<u>out</u> seed.// So by their prayers, O <u>Christ</u> God, have <u>mer</u>cy on us!

(at the Divine Liturgy)

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Tone 6 Kontakion (Forefathers)

You did not worship the graven <u>image</u>,
O thrice-<u>bless</u>ed ones,
but armed with the immaterial <u>Es</u>sence of God,
you were glorified in a <u>trial</u> by fire.
From the midst of unbearable flames you called on God, <u>cry</u>ing:
"Hasten, O com<u>pass</u>ionate One!
Speedily <u>come</u> to our aid,//
for You are merciful and able to do as You will!"

Tone 4 Prokeimenon (Forefathers)

Blessed are You, O Lord God of our fathers, / and praised and glorified is Your Name forever! (Song of the Three Holy Children, v. 3)

V. For You are just in all that You have done for us! (v. 4)
