"Lord I Call..." Tone 6

Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! <u>Hear</u> me, O Lord! Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! Receive the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call</u> upon You!// Hear <u>me</u>, O Lord!

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>in</u>cense, and let the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice!// Hear me, O Lord!

- **V.** (10) *Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name!*
- V. (9) The righteous will surround me, for You will deal bountifully with me.
- V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!
- **V**. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!
- V. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

Tone 6 (for the Holy Fathers) (Having placed all their hope)

The memory of the Ancestors is revealed to the <u>ends</u> of the world, truly <u>fill</u>ing it with light and making known the <u>dawning</u> of grace. For Christ shone forth from afar, <u>bright</u>er than the sun, the leading rank of stars <u>shining</u> with Him; and the divine-human birth was revealed to take place in <u>Beth</u>lehem. Therefore with faith let us all <u>gath</u>er at this birth,// rejoicing in chorus and singing the pre-festal praise!

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

Adorned with the glory of divine com<u>mun</u>ion,
Adam rejoices today,
as he is the foundation and support of the wise <u>An</u>cestors.
With him Abel leaps with joy, and <u>E</u>noch makes glad;
Seth dances, and <u>No</u>ah with him;
the all-praiseworthy Patriarch <u>A</u>braham sings;
Melchizedek beholds from afar the birth that is without a <u>fa</u>ther.
Therefore, as we celebrate the divine memory of the <u>Forefathers</u> of Christ,//we pray for the sal<u>va</u>tion of our souls.

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

The three Youths, <u>wise</u> in God, who shone with joy in the <u>fur</u>nace, proclaimed the birth of <u>Christ</u> on earth; For just as the Lord sent down a <u>pre</u>cious dew, He preserved from the flame <u>her</u> who gave birth, keeping her undefiled and enriching her with di<u>vine</u> gifts. Therefore Daniel, pleasing to God, rejoiced and was glad, for having foreseen the Stone from the unquarried <u>mountain</u>,//he now prays with boldness in be<u>half</u> of our souls.

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

Tone 6 (for the Forefeast) (Having placed all their hope)

The never-setting Sun presses <u>for</u>ward to rise, enlightening all things under <u>heav</u>en.

Let us hasten with clean hands and pure deeds to <u>meet</u> Him; let us prepare to be borne on high with Him in <u>spir</u>it!

Let us beseech Him in His com<u>passion</u>, that, as He comes in His good pleasure to His <u>own</u> strange birth, He may lead us, who have become <u>strangers</u> to the path of life in <u>Eden</u>,// into Bethlehem where He <u>comes</u> to be born!

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

The Word of God, upborne on the shoulders of the cherubim, goes to dwell in a womb without blemish.

Though without passions, He is bound fast to the flesh;
He comes on earth as a man, born of the tribe of Judah.

A cave becomes the palace of the King of all;
the fiery throne is replaced by a manger,
where the Virgin Mary lays Him as a babe,
for He comes to restore the first-created man,//
as He is well-pleased so to do.

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

O Word of God without beginning, the Virgin lays You in a manger of dumb beasts. You choose to begin Your life in the flesh in a manner beyond understanding. You have come to loose me from the fetters of evil with which the envious serpent bound me. O Lover of man, You are wrapped in swaddling clothes, tearing to pieces the bonds of my countless sins. Therefore I joyfully praise and worship Your holy birth,//for You came to set me free.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 6 *(for the Holy Fathers)*

Daniel, the man of desires, be<u>held</u> You, O Lord, the Stone cut without human hands from the <u>Moun</u>tain. Thus, he foretold that You would take <u>flesh</u> without seed, O Word of God, born of the <u>Virgin</u>,// the changeless God and <u>Sav</u>ior of our souls!

Tone 6 *(for the Forefeast, by Byzantius)*

O cave, make ready, for the <u>Ewe</u> Lamb comes, bearing <u>Christ</u> in her womb!

O manger, receive Him Who by a word has released the dwellers of earth from <u>law</u>lessness!

You shepherds, abiding in the fields, bear witness to the fearful wonder, And you magi from Persia, offer to the King gold, myrrh, and frankincense, for the Lord has appeared from a Virgin Mother!

And she, bending over Him as a handmaiden, worshipped Him as He lay in her arms, saying to Him: "How were You sown as seed in me? How have You grown within me,//
O my Deliverer and my God?"

Tone 2 (for the Forefeast) (Automelon)

O house of <u>Eph</u>ratha, the holy <u>city</u>, the <u>glory</u> of the <u>prophets</u>, <u>beau</u>tify the house// in which God is <u>being</u> born!

V. God shall come from Teman and the Holy One from the dark and shady mountain. (Habakkuk 3:3)

O Bethlehem, land of <u>Ju</u>dah, prepare the divine <u>cav</u>ern as a <u>dwelling</u> for God to be <u>born</u> in the flesh from a Virgin who knew <u>not</u> a man// to save the <u>hu</u>man race!

V. O Lord, I have heard what You have done, and am filled with awe. (Habakkuk 3:2)

Come, all you <u>faithful</u>, let us celebrate the Forefeast of the Na<u>tiv</u>ity of Christ as we <u>spir</u>itually offer our <u>hymn</u> as the star! Sing with the Magi and <u>shep</u>herds: Salvation comes from the <u>Virgin's womb</u>,// recalling the <u>faithful</u> to life!

You became indeed the mediators of Christ's new <u>cov</u>enant.

Since, therefore, you have been taken up into <u>heav</u>en,//
intercede with Him to grant peace to the world and salvation to our souls!

Tone 2 (for the Forefeast, by Cyprian)

The time of our sal<u>va</u>tion draws near.

Make <u>ready</u>, O cave!

The <u>Virgin</u> draws near to <u>bear</u> the Christ.

Be glad and rejoice, O Bethlehem, land of <u>Ju</u>dah, for our Lord has <u>come</u> from thee!

<u>Hearken</u>, O mountains and hills, you lands around <u>Judea</u>,// for Christ, the Lover of man, is coming to save those whom He created!

(at Great Vespers)

Tone 4 Troparion (Resurrection)

When the women disciples of the Lord learned from the angel the joyous message of Your Resurrection, they cast away the ancestral curse and elatedly told the apostles:

"Death is overthrown!
Christ God is risen,//
granting the world great mercy!"

Tone 2 Troparion (Holy Fathers)

Great are the accomplishments of faith,
 for the three Holy Youths rejoice in the fountain of flames as though in the waters of rest;

Tone 4 Troparion of the Forefeast

Mary was of <u>Da</u>vid's seed, so she went with Joseph to register in <u>Beth</u>lehem. She bore in her womb the Fruit not <u>sown</u> by man. The time for the <u>birth</u> was at hand. Since there was no <u>room</u> at the inn, the cave became a beautiful <u>pal</u>ace for the Queen.// Christ is born, raising up the image that <u>fell</u> of old.

(at the Divine Liturgy)

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When the women dis<u>ci</u>ples of the Lord learned from the angel the joyous message of Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion, they cast away the an<u>ces</u>tral curse and elatedly told the a<u>pos</u>tles:

"<u>Death</u> is overthrown!
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Tone 1 Kontakion (Holy Fathers)

Rejoice, O Bethlehem! Prepare yourself, O Ephratha!

The Lamb is on her way to give birth to the Chief Shepherd she <u>car</u>ries in her womb.

The <u>God</u>-bearing Forefathers will rejoice, be<u>hold</u>ing Him,// and with the shepherds, they will glorify the Virgin <u>nursing</u> Him.

Tone 3 Kontakion (Forefeast)

Today the Virgin <u>comes</u> to the cave to give birth to the <u>Eter</u>nal Word. Hear the glad tidings and rejoice, O <u>u</u>niverse! Glorify with the angels and the <u>shep</u>herds the Eternal God, Who is willing to appear as a <u>lit</u>tle child!

Tone 4 Prokeimenon (Holy Fathers)

Blessed are You, O Lord God of our fathers, / and praised and glorified is Your Name forever! (Song of the Three Holy Children, v. 3)

V. For You are just in all that You have done for us! (v. 4)
