"Lord I Call..." Tone 2

Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! Hear <u>me</u>, O Lord! <u>Lord</u>, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! Receive the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call</u> upon You!// Hear me, O Lord!

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>in</u>cense, and <u>let</u> the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice!// Hear me, O Lord!

- **V.** (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name!
- V. (9) The righteous will surround me, for You will deal bountifully with me.
- V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!
- **V**. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!
- **V.** (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.
- **V.** (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.
- **V.** (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

Tone 2 (for the Feast, by Germanus)

Come, let us greatly rejoice in the Lord, as we sing of this present mystery: the wall that divided God from man has been destroyed; the flaming sword withdraws from Eden's gate; the Cherubim withdraw from the Tree of Life; and I, who had been cast out through my disobedience, now feast on the delights of Paradise: for today the Father's perfect Image, marked with the stamp of His eternity,

has taken the form of a <u>ser</u>vant.

Without undergoing change He is born from an unwedded <u>mother</u>; He was true <u>God</u>, and He re<u>mains</u> the same, but through His <u>love</u> for mankind, He has become what He never <u>was</u>: true man. <u>Come</u>, O faithful, let us <u>cry</u> to Him://
"O God, born of the Virgin, have <u>mercy</u> on us!"

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

(by Anatolius)

When the Lord Jesus was born of the Holy <u>Virgin</u>, the whole universe was <u>filled</u> with light. The <u>shep</u>herds <u>watched</u> in the fields. The Wise Men worshipped, and the <u>Ang</u>els sang. But Herod was troubled, for <u>God</u> had appeared in the flesh.// He is the <u>Savior</u> of our souls.

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

Your Kingdom endures forever, O <u>Christ</u> our God. Your rule is from <u>age</u> to age.

Made <u>flesh</u> by the Holy <u>Spir</u>it,
made man of the ever-virgin <u>Mary</u>,
You have filled all creation with joy.
The <u>light</u> of Your coming has <u>shone</u> on us;
every living creature <u>praises</u> You,
the Image of the Father's <u>glory</u>.
Light of <u>Light</u>, the radiance of the <u>Father</u>,
the same yesterday, today, and for<u>ever</u>,
You have shone forth from the <u>Virgin.//</u>
O God, have <u>mercy</u> on us!

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

What shall we <u>offer</u> You, O Christ,
Who for our sakes have appeared on <u>earth</u> as a man?
Every creature made by You <u>offers</u> You thanks:
the Angels offer a hymn; the <u>heavens</u>, a star;
the Wise Men, gifts; the shepherds, their <u>won</u>der;
the <u>earth</u>, its cave; the wilderness, a <u>manger</u>,
and we offer You a virgin <u>Mother!</u>//
O Pre-eternal God, have mercy on us!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 6 *(for the Feast)*

Glory to God in the highest, and on <u>earth</u> peace! Today Bethlehem receives Him Who reigns forever with the <u>Fa</u>ther. Today Angels glorify the newborn Babe in hymns <u>wor</u>thy of God: "Glory to God in the <u>high</u>est,// and on earth, peace, good <u>will</u> to men!"

Tone 7 Great Prokeimenon

Who is so great a God as our God? / You are the God Who works wonders! (Ps. 76:13b)

- V. You have made known Your power among the peoples! (Ps. 76:14a)
- **V**. And I said, "Now have I begun; this is the change of the right hand of the Most High." (Ps. 76:10)
- **V.** I remembered the works of the Lord; for from the beginning will I remember Your wonders! (Ps. 76:11)

Aposticha

Tone 8 *(for the Feast, by John the Monk)*

A great <u>mir</u>acle has come to <u>pass</u> this day: nature is made new and <u>God</u> becomes Man. That which He <u>was</u>, He <u>has</u> remained, and that which He was not, He has <u>taken</u> on Himself// while suffering neither confusion nor division.

V. The Lord said to my Lord: "Sit at My right hand until I make Your enemies Your footstool!" (Ps. 109:1)

O <u>Lord</u>, You have come to <u>Beth</u>lehem and have made Your <u>dwelling</u> in the cave. You have <u>heaven as</u> Your throne, yet You are laid in a <u>manger</u>. The hosts of Angels at<u>tend</u> on every side, yet You have come <u>down</u> among <u>shep</u>herds, that in Your compassion You might <u>save</u> mankind.// <u>Glo</u>ry to You!

V. Out of the womb before the morning star have I begotten You. (Ps. 109:4a)

The <u>shep</u>herds hasten to <u>Beth</u>lehem, revealing the true <u>Shep</u>herd,
Who rests upon the Cherubim and <u>lies</u> in a <u>manger</u>.
For our sake He has taken upon Himself the <u>form</u> of a Child.// O Lord, <u>glo</u>ry to You!

Tone 4 Troparion

Your Nativity, O <u>Christ</u> our God, has shone to the world the light of <u>wis</u>dom! For by it, those who <u>wor</u>shipped the stars, were taught by a star to a<u>dore</u> You, the Sun of <u>Right</u>eousness, and to know You, the <u>Or</u>ient from on high.// O Lord, <u>glo</u>ry to You! (once)

(at the Divine Liturgy)

(After the Entrance)

Come, let us worship and fall down before Christ, O Son of God, born of the Virgin, save us who sing to You: "Alleluia!"

Tone 4 Troparion (Feast)

Your Nativity, O <u>Christ</u> our God, has shone to the world the light of <u>wis</u>dom! For by it, those who <u>wor</u>shipped the stars, were taught by a star to a<u>dore</u> You, the Sun of <u>Right</u>eousness, and to know You, the <u>Or</u>ient from on high.// O Lord, <u>glory</u> to You!

Tone 6 Kontakion (Synaxis of the Theotokos)

He Who was begotten before the Morning Star of the Father without a <u>mother</u>, today is made flesh of you upon the earth without a <u>father</u>.

A star announces the good tidings to the <u>Wise Men</u>,//
while Angels and shepherds sing the praises of your most pure childbearing, O <u>full</u> of grace!

Tone 4 Prokeimenon (Saturday After)

I shall make your name to be remembered / in all generations. (Ps. 44:16)

V. Hearken, O daughter, and see, and incline your ear! (Ps. 44:9a)

Tone 8

Alleluia, Alleluia!

- V. Arise, O Lord, into Your resting place: You and the Ark of Your sanctification! (Ps. 131:8)
- **V**. The Lord swore to David a sure oath from which He will not turn back. (Ps. 131:11a)

Gospel

(4) Matthew 2:13-23 (Synaxis of the Theotokos)

(Instead of "It is truly meet...," we sing:)

Magnify, O my soul, the most pure Virgin Theotokos, more honorable and more glorious than the heavenly hosts.

I behold a strange, most glorious mystery: heaven—the cave; the cherubic throne—the Virgin; the manger—the place where Christ lay: the uncontainable God, Whom we magnify in song.

(or, the ninth heirmos of the second canon)

Out of fear, we should choose to love silence, for that is a safer course; so difficult it is lovingly to compose intricately woven songs to you, O Virgin.
But grant us strength, O Mother, equal to our natural calling.

Communion Hymn
