APRIL 11 Great and Holy Tuesday Liturgy of the Presanctified Gifts (sung on Tuesday)

"Lord I Call..." Tone 1

Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! <u>Hear</u> me, O Lord! <u>Lord</u>, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! Re<u>ceive</u> the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call</u> up<u>on</u> You!// Hear me, O Lord!

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>in</u>cense, and <u>let</u> the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an <u>eve</u>ning <u>sac</u>rifice!// <u>Hear me</u>, O Lord!

V. (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name!
V. (9) The righteous will surround me, for You will deal bountifully with me.
V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!
V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!
V. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

Tone 1

How shall <u>I</u>, the un<u>wor</u>thy one, appear in the <u>splen</u>dor of Your saints? For <u>if</u> I dare enter Your bridal <u>cham</u>ber with them, my <u>gar</u>ments will be<u>tray</u> me: they are un<u>fit</u> for a <u>wed</u>ding. The angels will cast me <u>out</u> in chains. <u>Cleanse</u> the filth of my <u>soul</u>, O Lord,// and save me in Your <u>love</u> for mankind!

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

Tone 2

O Christ the <u>Bridegroom</u>, my soul has slumbered in <u>la</u>ziness. I have no <u>lamp</u> aflame with <u>vir</u>tues. Like the foolish virgins, I wander aimlessly when it is <u>time</u> for work. But do not close Your compassionate heart to me, O <u>Mas</u>ter! <u>Rouse</u> me; shake off my <u>heavy</u> sleep! Lead me with the wise virgins into the bridal <u>cham</u>ber, that I may hear the pure voice of those that feast and cry un<u>ceas</u>ingly:// "O <u>Lord</u>, <u>glo</u>ry to You!"

V. **(4)** *From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!*

Tone 4

You have heard the condem<u>na</u>tion, O soul, of the man who hid his <u>tal</u>ent. But do not <u>hide</u> the <u>Word</u> of God! Proclaim His <u>won</u>ders, that, in<u>creas</u>ing the <u>gift</u> of grace,// you may enter into the <u>joy</u> of your Lord!

V. **(3)** *For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.*

Tone 6

Come, O <u>faith</u>ful, let us work zealously for the <u>Mas</u>ter, for He distributes wealth to His <u>ser</u>vants! Let each of us, according to his a<u>bil</u>ity, increase his <u>tal</u>ent of grace: let one be adorned in <u>wis</u>dom through good works; let another celebrate a service in <u>splen</u>dor! The one distributes his <u>wealth</u> to the poor; the other communicates the Word to <u>those</u> untaught. Thus we shall increase what has been en<u>trust</u>ed to us, and, as faithful <u>stew</u>ards of grace, we shall be accounted worthy of the <u>Mas</u>ter's joy. Make us worthy of this, O <u>Christ</u> our God,// in Your <u>love</u> for mankind!

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

When You shall come in glory, O Jesus, with the Angelic Hosts, and shall sit upon the throne for judgment, do not drive me away, O Good Shepherd! For You know the paths on Your <u>right</u> hand, but those on Your left hand <u>lead</u> astray! Do not de<u>stroy</u> me with the goats, though I am <u>coarse</u> with sin, but number me with the sheep on Your <u>right</u> hand,// and save me in Your <u>love</u> for mankind!

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

You are more beautiful than all men, O <u>Bridegroom</u>! You have in<u>vit</u>ed us to the spiritual banquet of Your bridal <u>cham</u>ber. Strip me of the ugly <u>gar</u>ment of my sins, as I participate in Your <u>Pas</u>sion! Adorn me in the glorious robe of Your <u>beauty</u>// that proclaims me a guest in Your Kingdom, O merciful Lord!

> Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 7

Be<u>hold</u>, the Master has entrusted you with the <u>tal</u>ent, O my soul! Re<u>ceive</u> the <u>gift</u> with fear! Re<u>pay</u> the One who gave by <u>giv</u>ing to the poor, and <u>gain</u> the <u>Lord</u> as your friend, <u>so</u> that when He comes in <u>glory</u>, You may <u>stand</u> at His right hand and hear His <u>bless</u>ed voice: "<u>Enter</u>, my servant, into the joy of your Lord!" Though I have <u>gone</u> astray, make me worthy of this, O <u>Sav</u>ior,// through Your great <u>mer</u>cy!

Tone 6 Prokeimenon

Arise, O Lord, and go to Your resting place, / You and the ark of Your might! (*Ps. 131:8*)

V. Remember, O Lord, in David's favor, all the hardships he endured! (Ps. 131:1)

Reading from Exodus (2:5-10)

Tone 4 Prokeimenon

Behold, how good and pleasant it is / when brothers dwell in unity! (Ps. 132:1)

V. It is like the precious oil upon the head, running down upon the beard, the beard of Aaron. (*Ps.* 132:1*a*-*b*)

Reading from Job (1:13-22) (*"Let my prayer arise..." and then immediately*)

Gospel (102) Matthew 24:36-26:2
