"Lord I Call..." Tone 5

Lord, I call upon You, hear me! Hear me, O Lord!
Lord, I call upon You, hear me!
Receive the voice of my prayer, when I call upon You!//
Hear me, O Lord!

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>incense</u>, and <u>let</u> the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an <u>evening sacrifice!//</u> <u>Hear me</u>, O Lord!

V. (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name!

Tone 5 *(for the Resurrection)*

By Your <u>pre</u>cious <u>Cross</u>, O Christ, You have put the <u>dev</u>il to shame. By Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion, You have blunted the <u>sting</u> of sin and <u>saved</u> us from the <u>gates</u> of death.// We glorify You, O <u>on</u>ly begotten One.

V. (9) The righteous will surround me, for You will deal bountifully with me.

<u>Christ</u> was led as a sheep to the <u>slaughter</u> in order to grant Resurrection to the <u>human race</u>. The <u>princes</u> of hell were <u>frightened</u> by this, for the <u>gates</u> of sorrow were <u>lifted</u>. Christ the King of glory had <u>entered</u>, <u>saying to those in <u>chains</u>: "Go forth!"// And to those in <u>darkness</u>: "Come to the light!"</u>

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

(Resurrection stichera by Anatolius)

We offer You our evening worship,

O never setting Light,

Who <u>came</u> in these last days to the <u>world</u> in the flesh;

Who <u>ev</u>en descended to hell to dispel its <u>dark</u>ness.

Who has revealed the light of Resurrection to the <u>na</u>tions.//

Glory to You, O Lord and Giver of light!

V. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

We <u>glo</u>rify the Leader of our sal<u>va</u>tion; by His Resur<u>rec</u>tion from the dead,

the world was saved from deceit.

The assembly of Angels rejoices

as the deceit of demons is overthrown.//

Fallen Adam <u>rises</u> as the <u>dev</u>il falls.

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

The guards were instructed by the <u>law</u>less ones:

"Hide the rising of Christ, take money and say:

'The <u>body</u> was stolen from the tomb while <u>we</u> were asleep.'"

But who has heard of a body being stolen,

a body embalmed and naked,

with its grave clothes left behind in the tomb?

Do not be deceived, O Jews,

study the words of the Prophets and understand://

Christ is the Redeemer of the world and all powerful!

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

Come, all you <u>fai</u>thful, and with hymns let us honor all the holy unmercenary phy<u>si</u>cians, <u>cry</u>ing out to <u>the</u>m with love: Rejoice, O unmercenary phy<u>si</u>cians of the infirm! Rejoice, O you who have acquired the inexhaustible <u>gra</u>ce of healings! // Rejoice, you who pray fervently for the sal<u>va</u>tion of our souls!

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

Together let us now hymn all the valiant un<u>me</u>rcenaries, who bear a common title, our divine <u>guardians</u>, who with the <u>zeal</u> of faith and <u>lo</u>ve for God gave themselves over steadfastly to the common <u>goo</u>d of all, for whom they <u>suffered mu</u>ch for Christ, // and who pray with boldness for the sal<u>va</u>tion of our souls.

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

Let us glorify the honored <u>boast</u> of the Church, the glorious unmercenaries, the invincible <u>champions</u>, the faithful <u>he</u>lpers of those who with faith flee to them amid all tribu<u>la</u>tions, the ever-flowing <u>ri</u>vers which pour forth <u>stre</u>ams of <u>hea</u>lings, anticipating in all things the <u>nee</u>ds of all, // and praying for the sal<u>va</u>tion of our souls.

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

As you have the boldness before our most merciful <u>Sa</u>vior to have mercy on all and save them from mis<u>fo</u>rtunes, de<u>li</u>ver from <u>sufferings</u> and disease, and from all grievous temp<u>ta</u>tions, those who <u>hy</u>mn you with <u>fai</u>th and love, O you divinely blessed un<u>me</u>rcenaries, // and pray for the sal<u>va</u>tion of our souls.

Tone 5 (*Theotokion – Dogmatikon*)

In the Red Sea of old, a type of the Virgin Bride was prefigured. There Moses divided the waters; here Gabriel assisted in the miracle. There Israel crossed the sea without getting wet, here the Virgin gave birth to Christ without seed. After Israel's passage, the sea remained impassable; after Emmanuel's birth, the Virgin remained a Virgin. O ever-existing God Who appeared as Man,// O Lord, have mercy on us!
