Pray to Him, O Father Basil, to enlighten and <u>save</u> our souls!

Tone 8 *(for St. Basil, by Anatolius)*

You be<u>came</u> a Lover of wisdom, O righteous <u>Fa</u>ther, preferring life with God above all <u>earthly</u> delights. Contemplating death, you a<u>ban</u>doned <u>all</u> your wealth. You stripped away fleshy lusts through rigorous <u>abstinence</u>, and studied God's Law, subjecting your flesh to the <u>Spirit</u>. You were rich in virtues and a <u>conqueror of passions</u>, casting away the world, the flesh and the <u>devil</u>. Now you stand before the <u>throne</u> of Christ.// Entreat Him to grant us great <u>mer</u>cy!

Tone 1 (for St. Basil, by Byzas)

O most <u>bless</u>ed <u>Ba</u>sil, you served Christ's Church like a busy <u>hon</u>eybee. <u>Armed</u> with di<u>vine</u> zeal, you stung the blasphemers and <u>wound</u>ed the <u>her</u>etics. You <u>stored</u> the souls of the faithful in the hive of <u>heav</u>en. Now that you rest in the green <u>pas</u>tures of God,// remember all of us, as you stand before the Holy <u>Trin</u>ity!

V. My mouth shall speak wisdom, and the meditation of my heart shall be understanding. (Ps. 48:3)

Tone 1 (*for St. Basil, by Basil the Monk*)

O <u>Ho</u>ly Father <u>Ba</u>sil, you acquired the virtues of <u>all</u> the saints: the <u>meek</u>ness of Moses, the zeal of <u>Elijah</u>, the faith of <u>Pe</u>ter, and the the<u>ology</u> of John. You <u>cry</u> with Paul the <u>Apostle</u>: "Who is weak, and <u>I</u> am not weak? Who is made to <u>fall</u>, and I do not burn in indignation?" <u>Moth</u>er.

Therefore You were circumcised as an <u>eight</u>-day-old Child. <u>Glo</u>ry to Your most gracious <u>coun</u>sel; glory to Your ^dispen<u>sation;//</u> glory to Your condescension, O only <u>Lov</u>er of man! (once)

(at the Divine Liturgy)

Tone 1 Troparion (Circumcision)

En<u>throned</u> on high with the Eternal Father and Your divine <u>Spir</u>it,
O Jesus, You willed to be born on earth of the unwedded handmaid, ^Your
Mother.

Therefore You were circumcised as an <u>eight</u>-day-old Child. <u>Glo</u>ry to Your most gracious <u>coun</u>sel; glory to Your ^dispen<u>sa</u>tion;// glory to Your condescension, O only Lover of man!

Tone 1 Troparion (St. Basil)

Your procla<u>ma</u>tion has gone out into <u>all</u> the earth, which was divinely taught by <u>hear</u>ing your voice. You ex<u>pound</u>ed the nature of <u>creatures</u> and ennobled the <u>man</u>ners of men.

O venerable <u>Fa</u>ther of royal <u>priest</u>hood,// entreat Christ God that our <u>souls</u> may be saved!

Tone 4 Kontakion (St. Basil)

You were revealed as the sure foun<u>da</u>tion of the Church, granting all mankind a lordship which cannot be <u>taken</u> away,// sealing it with your precepts, O venerable Basil, revealer of <u>heaven</u>.

Tone 3 Kontakion (Feast)

The Lord of <u>all</u> accepts to be <u>cir</u>cumcised, thus, as He is good, He excises the sins of <u>mor</u>tal men. Today He grants the world sal<u>va</u>tion, while light-bearing Basil, high priest of our Cre<u>a</u>tor,//rejoices in heaven as a di<u>vine</u> initiate of Christ.

Note: Because there is only one Sunday between the Nativity of Christ and the Theophany of Christ, the Readings for the Sunday Before Theophany are read today.

Tone 6 Prokeimenon (Circumcision and Sunday Before)

O Lord, save Your people, / and bless Your inheritance! (Ps. 27:9a)
