(Following "God is with us," we sing the following)

Tone 8

The <u>day</u> is over; I <u>thank</u> You, O Lord! Grant me to pass this evening and this <u>night</u> without sin,//and save me, O <u>Savior!</u>

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

The <u>day</u> is over; I glorify You, O <u>Mas</u>ter! Grant me to pass this evening and this night without <u>giv</u>ing offense,//and save me, O <u>Sav</u>ior!

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

The <u>day</u> is over; I sing to You, O <u>Ho</u>ly One! Grant me to pass this evening and this night free from temp<u>ta</u>tion,//and save me, O <u>Sav</u>ior!

Tone 6

The bodiless Cherubim glorify You with never-<u>end</u>ing songs. The six-winged Seraphim exalt You with ceaseless <u>voices</u>. All the hosts of Angels honor You with the <u>thrice</u>-holy hymn. For You, O Father, are from all eternity, with Your co-e<u>ter</u>nal Son, and with the Spirit of life, Who is <u>equal</u> to You;// You have revealed the unity of the Trinity.

O most-holy Virgin and Mother of God, and you eye-witnesses and servants of the Word, all you choirs of prophets and martyrs, who enjoy eternal life, fervently pray for us all, who are in fearful distress, that we may be delivered from the deceit of the Evil One, so that we may sing the song of the Angels: Holy, holy, holy, Thrice-holy Lord,// have mercy on us and save us!

(after the 1st Trisagion)

Tone 1 Troparion

When <u>You</u>, O Lord, were baptized in the <u>Jor</u>dan, the worship of the Trinity was made <u>manifest</u>. For the <u>voice</u> of the Father bore <u>wit</u>ness to You, and called You His be<u>loved Son</u>; and the <u>Spirit</u> in the form of a <u>dove</u> confirmed the <u>truthfulness</u> of His word. O <u>Christ</u> our God, You have re<u>vealed</u> Yourself// and have enlightened the world, <u>glory</u> to You.

(after the 2nd Trisagion)

Tone 4 Kontakion

Today You have shone forth to the <u>world</u>, O Lord, and the light of Your countenance has been <u>marked</u> on us. Knowing You, we sing Your <u>praises</u>: "You have come and re<u>vealed</u> Yourself,// O unapproachable Light."

Litya

Tone 4 *(by Cosmas the Monk)*

He Who covers Himself with light as with a <u>gar</u>ment for our sake saw fit to be<u>come</u> like us.

To<u>day</u> He covers Himself with the streams of the <u>Jor</u>dan. He has no need of their <u>cleansing</u>, but He se<u>cures</u> new <u>birth</u> for us.

O the <u>wonder!</u>
Without fire He re-forges,
Without <u>breaking</u> He <u>re</u>-forms.
He saves those en<u>light</u>ened in Him://
Christ God, the Savior of our souls.

By fire and the <u>Spirit</u>,
You wash away the <u>sin</u> of the world.
When the <u>Bap</u>tist saw You <u>coming</u>, he was afraid.
He trembled and cried out, <u>saying</u>:

To<u>day</u> creation is enlightened.

Today all things rejoice, in heaven and on earth together.

Angels and men join forces,

Tone 2 (by Anatolius) Idiomela

John saw You coming to him in the Jordan, O <u>Christ</u> God, and he said: "You have no un<u>cleanness</u>, O Lord, <u>why</u> do You come to Your <u>ser</u>vant? In whose Name will I <u>baptize</u> You? In the Name of the <u>Fa</u>ther? But in Your<u>self</u> You bear the <u>Fa</u>ther. In the <u>Name</u> of the Son? But You Yourself are the Son in<u>car</u>nate. In the <u>Name</u> of the Holy <u>Spir</u>it? But by Your breath You can give the Spirit to the <u>faithful</u>."// O God Who shone forth, have mercy on us!

V. The sea looked and fled, Jordan turned back. (Ps. 113:3)

The waters <u>saw</u> You, O God, the waters saw <u>You</u> and were afraid.

Tone 6 (by Theophanes)

When the Son Who was born of a <u>Virgin</u> asked to be baptized in the <u>Jor</u>dan, the Shining Lamp, born of a barren woman, cried to Him in <u>fear</u> and joy:// "Sanctify me, O Master, by Your divine Epiphany!"

Tone 1 Troparion

When You, O Lord, were baptized in the Jordan, the worship of the Trinity was made manifest. For the voice of the Father bore witness to You, and called You His beloved Son; and the Spirit in the form of a dove confirmed the truthfulness of His word.

O Christ our God, You have revealed Yourself// and have enlightened the world, glory to You. (thrice)

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
