"Lord I Call..." Tone 6

Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! <u>Hear</u> me, O Lord! Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! Receive the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call</u> upon You!// Hear <u>me</u>, O Lord!

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>incense</u>, and let the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice!// Hear me, O Lord!

Tone 6 *(for the Resurrection)*

Possessing victory over <u>hell</u>, O Christ, since You are <u>free</u> among the dead, You as<u>cended</u> the Cross raising with Yourself those who sat in the <u>shades</u> of death.// Drawing life from Your light, O almighty Savior, have <u>mer</u>cy on us!

V. (9) The righteous will surround me, for You will deal bountifully with me.

Today Christ <u>tramples</u> on death, for He is <u>risen</u> as He said!
Let us all <u>sing</u> this song, for He has granted <u>joy</u> to the world:
O Light unapproachable, O <u>Foun</u>tain of life!//
O Savior almighty, have mercy on us!

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

Where shall we sinners flee from You, Who are in all creation? In heaven You dwell! In hell You trampled on death! In the depths of the sea? Even there is Your hand, O Master! To You we flee, and falling before You, we pray://
O You Who rose from the dead, have mercy on us!

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

Tone 2 *(for the Feast, by John the Monk)*

Our Light that en<u>light</u>ens all comes to be <u>baptized</u>.

The <u>Forerunner sees Him and rejoices in His soul</u>. His hand trembles as he shows Him to the <u>people</u>: "Behold, the Redeemer of <u>Is</u>rael, the <u>One</u> Who frees us from cor<u>ruption</u>."// O sinless One, Christ our God, <u>glory</u> to You!

V. (6) If You, O Lord, shouldst mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

A servant baptized our Redeemer and the coming of the Spirit bore witness to Him. The hosts of Angels saw this and shook with fear. And the voice of the Father was heard from heaven: "The One on Whom the Forerunner lays his hand, He is My beloved Son; I am well pleased in Him."//O Christ our God, glory to You!

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

The streams of the Jordan received <u>You</u>, their Source, and the Comforter descended in the <u>form</u> of a dove. <u>He</u> Who bowed the heavens now <u>bows</u> His head. The Clay cries aloud to the <u>Pot</u>ter: "Why do You command me to do what is be<u>yond</u> me; for it is <u>I</u> that should be <u>bap</u>tized by You?"// O sinless One, Christ our God, <u>glory</u> to You!

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

Wishing to save mankind that had gone astray, You did not think it unworthy for You to be clothed in the form of a servant; for it was proper for You as Master and God to take upon Yourself human nature for our sake. Being baptized in the flesh, O Redeemer, You made us worthy of forgiveness. And so we cry out to You://
"O Benefactor, Christ our God, glory to You!"

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

Tone 1 (for the Forerunner) (O all-praised martyrs)

When the <u>Fore</u>runner be<u>held</u> You, O Christ, drawing near to him to ask for <u>bap</u>tism, he cried <u>out</u> in <u>trem</u>bling:
"Why do You ask me for <u>what</u> is be<u>yond</u> my strength?
<u>How</u> shall I touch You with my hand, O all-<u>pow</u>erful Lord, for You hold <u>all</u> things with Your hand?//
But instead baptize me, Your <u>ser</u>vant!"

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

"This <u>day</u> have I appeared as a com<u>plete</u> Man; unapproachable by nature, I have become ap<u>proach</u>able to you. <u>Rich</u>, I have willingly <u>made</u> Myself poor, that what has grown poor I may make rich with incor<u>rup</u>tion and del<u>iv</u>erance. Draw <u>near</u> and baptize Him Who is not subject to cor<u>rup</u>tion,// and Who delivers the world from decay!"

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

"I am con<u>strained</u> on every side," said the Forerunner to the Cre<u>at</u>or, "and cannot tell which <u>way</u> to go.
Bountiful <u>Lord</u>, You are a stream flowing with <u>nour</u>ishment; how then shall the flowing <u>streams</u> re<u>ceive</u> You, O Word,// Who comes to pour forth salvation on all who honor Your holy E<u>piph</u>any!"

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 6 *(for the Forerunner)*

Light in the flesh and Forerunner of the <u>Sav</u>ior, offspring of a barren <u>mother</u>, and friend of Him Who was born of a <u>Virgin</u>, you have worshipped Him by <u>leaping</u> in the womb, and have baptized Him in the waters of the <u>Jor</u>dan. We entreat you to intercede with Him, O <u>Prophet</u>,// that we may escape from the mighty <u>tempests</u> to come!

Tone 6 (*Theotokion – Dogmatikon*)

Who will not bless you, O most holy <u>Virgin?</u>
Who will not sing of your most pure <u>child</u>bearing?
The only-begotten Son shone timelessly from the <u>Fa</u>ther, but from you He was ineffably in<u>car</u>nate.
God by nature, yet <u>Man</u> for our sake, not two persons, but one known in two <u>na</u>tures.
Entreat Him, O pure and all-blessed <u>La</u>dy,//
to have <u>mer</u>cy on our souls!

Aposticha

Tone 6 *(for the Resurrection)*

Your Resurrection, O Christ our <u>Sav</u>ior, the Angels in <u>heav</u>en sing! Enable <u>us</u> on earth// to glorify You in <u>pur</u>ity of heart!

V. The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty!

Destroying the <u>gates</u> of hell, breaking the <u>chains</u> of death, You resurrected the fallen human race as al<u>mighty</u> God!// O Lord, Who rose from the dead, glory to You!

V. For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved.

Desiring to return us to <u>Par</u>adise, Christ was nailed to the Cross and <u>placed</u> in a tomb. The Myrrhbearing Women sought Him with tears, <u>cry</u>ing, "Woe to us, O Savior! How do You deign to descend to death?
What place can hold Your life bearing body?
Come to us as You promised!
Take away our wailing and tears!"
Then the Angel appeared to them:
"Stop your lamentations!
Go, proclaim to the Apostles:
'The Lord is risen,//
granting us purification and great mercy!"

V. Holiness befits Your house, O Lord, forevermore!

Tone 4 (for the Forerunner, by Byzas)

As the lover of the Spirit, the swallow that brings divine tidings of grace, O Forerunner, you have made known clearly to mankind the dispensation of the King, Who shone forth in brightness from a pure Virgin for the restoration of man. You banish the dominion of dark and evil ways, and guide the hearts of those baptized in repentance to eternal life,// O blessed Prophet inspired by God!

Tone 4 (for the Feast, by Cosmas the Monk)

Tone 1 Prokeimenon (Sunday After)

Let Your mercy, O Lord, be upon us / as we have set our hope on You! (Ps. 32:22)

V. Rejoice in the Lord, O you righteous! Praise befits the just! (Ps. 32:1)

Tone 7 Prokeimenon (Forerunner)

The righteous shall rejoice in the Lord / and shall hope in Him. (Ps. 63:11a)

(224-ctr) Ephesians 4:7-13 (Sunday After) (42) Acts 19:1-8 (Forerunner)

Tone 5

Alleluia, Alleluia!

- **V.** I will sing of Your mercies, O Lord, forever; with my mouth I will proclaim Your truth from generation to generation. (Ps. 88:1-2)

No tongue knows how to praise you worthily, O Theotokos; even angels are overcome with awe praising you. But since you are good, accept our faith; for you know our love inspired by God! You are the defender of Christians, and we magnify you.
