32nd Sunday after Pentecost, Leavetaking of the Theophany

"Lord I Call..." Tone 7

Lord, I call upon You, hear me! Hear me, O Lord!
Lord, I call upon You, hear me!
Receive the voice of my prayer, when I call upon You!//
Hear me, O Lord!

Let my prayer arise in Your sight as incense, and let the lifting up of my hands be an evening sacrifice!// Hear me, O Lord!

- **V.** (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name!
- V. (9) The righteous will surround me; for You will deal bountifully with me.
- V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

Tone 7 *(for the Resurrection)*

<u>Come</u>, let us rejoice in the Lord, Who de<u>stroyed</u> the do<u>minion</u> of death! Let us <u>sing</u> to Him with the <u>bod</u>iless hosts, for He en<u>light</u>ened the <u>race</u> of man!// O our Maker and Savior, glory to You!

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

You en<u>dured</u> the Cross and <u>bur</u>ial for our sake. By Your <u>death</u>, You destroyed <u>death</u> as God. We fall <u>down</u> before Your Resurrection on the <u>third</u> day,//O <u>Sav</u>ior, <u>glory</u> to You!

V. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

When the Apostles beheld the Resurrection of the Maker, they were amazed and sang the angelic praise.

This is the glory of the Church.

This is the richness of the Kingdom.//
O Lord, crucified for our sake, glory to You!

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

(Resurrection stichera by Anatolius)

You were <u>held</u> by lawless <u>men</u>, O Christ, but to <u>me</u>, You are God, and I am <u>not</u> ashamed. You were <u>smit</u>ten on the cheek, but I do not de<u>ny</u> You. You were <u>nailed</u> to the Cross and I do not con<u>ceal</u> it, for I <u>glo</u>ry in Your Resurrection: Your <u>death</u> is my life.// O Almighty Lord and Lover of <u>man</u>, <u>glo</u>ry to You!

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

Tone 2 *(for the Feast, by John the Monk)*

Our Light that en<u>light</u>ens all comes to be <u>baptized</u>.

The <u>Fore</u>runner sees Him and rejoices in His soul. His hand trembles as he shows Him to the <u>people</u>: "Behold, the Redeemer of <u>Is</u>rael, the <u>One</u> Who frees us from cor<u>ruption</u>."// O sinless One, Christ our God, <u>glory</u> to You!

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

A servant baptized our Redeemer

and the coming of the Spirit bore <u>wit</u>ness to Him. The <u>hosts</u> of Angels saw this and <u>shook</u> with fear. And the voice of the Father was heard from <u>heaven</u>: "The One on Whom the Forerunner <u>lays</u> his hand, <u>He</u> is My beloved Son; I am well <u>pleased</u> in Him."// O Christ our God, <u>glo</u>ry to You!

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

The streams of the Jordan received <u>You</u>, their Source, and the Comforter descended in the <u>form</u> of a dove. <u>He</u> Who bowed the heavens now <u>bows</u> His head. The Clay cries aloud to the <u>Pot</u>ter: "Why do You command me to do what is be<u>yond</u> me; for it is <u>I</u> that should be <u>bap</u>tized by You?"// O sinless One, Christ our God, glory to You!

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

Wishing to save mankind that had <u>gone</u> astray, You did not think it un<u>wor</u>thy for You to be <u>clothed</u> in the form of a <u>ser</u>vant; for it was proper for You as <u>Mas</u>ter and God to take upon Yourself human <u>na</u>ture for our sake. Being <u>bap</u>tized in the flesh, O Redeemer, You made us worthy of forgiveness. And so we cry <u>out</u> to You://

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 2 *(for the Feast, by Byzas)*

You bowed Your head before the <u>Fore</u>runner and crushed the heads of the <u>drag</u>ons.
You <u>stood</u> in the waters and en<u>light</u>ened all things// that they might glorify You, O Savior, the <u>Light</u> of our souls.

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 7 (*Theotokion – Dogmatikon*)

No tongue can speak of your wonderful childbearing, for the order of nature was overruled by God.
You were revealed to be a Mother above nature, for you remained a Virgin beyond reason and understanding. Your conception was most glorious, O Theotokos!
The manner of your giving birth was ineffable, O Virgin!
Knowing you to be the Mother of God, devoutly we pray to you://
"Beseech Him to save our souls!"

Aposticha

Tone 7 *(for the Resurrection)*

As the <u>Sav</u>ior of the world You a<u>rose</u> from the tomb. As <u>God</u> You resurrected the race of <u>man</u> with Your flesh.// O <u>Lord</u>, <u>glo</u>ry to You!

V. The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty!

<u>Come</u>, let us worship the One Who <u>rose</u> from the dead, and en<u>light</u>ened all creation!

By His <u>death</u>, He saved us from the <u>tor</u>ments of hell.//

By His Resurrection He has granted us eternal <u>life</u> and great <u>mer</u>cy.

V. For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved.

You de<u>scend</u>ed into hell, capturing <u>death</u>, O Christ. In three <u>days</u> You a<u>rose</u> again, resur<u>rec</u>ting us who glorify Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion,// O <u>Lord</u> and <u>Lov</u>er of man.

V. Holiness befits Your house, O Lord, forevermore!

When <u>You</u> were placed in the tomb as <u>one</u> asleep, the <u>sight</u> was great and <u>awe</u>some.

But when <u>You</u> rose on the third day as al<u>mighty</u> God, <u>You</u> resurrected <u>Ad</u>am with Yourself.//
Glory to Your Resurrection, only Lover of man!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 6 *(for the Feast, by Theophanes)*

When the Son Who was born of a <u>Virgin</u> asked to be baptized in the <u>Jor</u>dan, the Shining Lamp, born of a barren woman, cried to Him in <u>fear</u> and joy:// "Sanctify me, O Master, by Your divine Epiphany!"

(at Great Vespers)

Tone 7 Troparion (*Resurrection*)

By Your <u>Cross</u> You destroyed <u>death</u>. To the thief You opened <u>Paradise</u>. For the <u>Myrrh</u>bearers You changed weeping into <u>joy</u>. And You commanded Your disciples, O <u>Christ</u> God, to pro<u>claim</u> that You are <u>risen</u>,// granting the world great mercy.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 1 Troparion (Feast)

When You, O Lord, were baptized in the Jordan, the worship of the Trinity was made manifest. For the voice of the Father bore witness to You, and called You His beloved Son; and the Spirit in the form of a dove confirmed the truthfulness of His word. O Christ our God, You have revealed Yourself// and have enlightened the world, glory to You.

(at the Divine Liturgy)

Tone 7 Troparion (Resurrection)

By Your <u>Cross</u> You destroyed <u>death</u>. To the thief You opened <u>Paradise</u>. For the <u>Myrrh</u>bearers You changed weeping into <u>joy</u>. And You commanded Your disciples, O <u>Christ</u> God, to pro<u>claim</u> that You are <u>risen</u>,// granting the <u>world</u> great <u>mer</u>cy.

Tone 1 Troparion (Feast) (see above)

Tone 7 Kontakion (Resurrection)

The do<u>min</u>ion of death can no longer hold men <u>cap</u>tive, for Christ descended, shattering and destroying its <u>pow</u>ers. Hell is <u>bound</u>, while the Prophets rejoice and cry: "The Savior has come to <u>those</u> in faith;// enter, you <u>faithful</u>, into the Resur<u>rec</u>tion!"

Tone 4 Kontakion (Feast)

Today You have shone forth to the <u>world</u>, O Lord, and the light of Your countenance has been <u>marked</u> on us. Knowing You, we sing Your <u>praises</u>: "You have come and re<u>vealed</u> Yourself,// O unapproachable Light."

Tone 7 Prokeimenon (Resurrection)

The Lord shall give strength to His people. / The Lord shall bless His people with peace. (*Ps. 28:11*)

V. Offer to the Lord, O you sons of God! Offer young rams to the Lord! (Ps. 28:1a)

Tone 4 Prokeimenon (Feast)

Blessed is He that comes in the Name of the Lord. / God is the Lord and has revealed Himself to us. (*Ps.* 117:26b, 27b)
