Tone 8 *(for the Resurrection)*

We <u>offer</u> to <u>You</u>, O Christ, our evening song and reasonable <u>ser</u>vice, for You <u>willed</u> to have <u>mer</u>cy on us// by Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion.

V. (9) The righteous will surround me; for You will deal bountifully with me.

Lord, Lord, do not cast us a<u>way</u> from Your face! For You willed to have <u>mer</u>cy on us// by Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion.

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

Rejoice, O holy <u>Zi</u>on: Mother of the churches, the a<u>bode</u> of God, for you were the first to re<u>ceive</u> re<u>mis</u>sion of sins// by the Resur<u>rec</u>tion.

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

(Resurrection stichera by Anatolius)

The <u>Word</u> of God the <u>Fa</u>ther, begotten before the <u>ages</u>, in the latter times willed to be in<u>car</u>nate of the <u>Virgin</u> and endured cruci<u>fi</u>xion unto death. He has <u>saved</u> mortal man// by His Resur<u>rec</u>tion.

V. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

Tone 4 (for Ven. Maximus) (As one valiant among the martyrs)

O blessed Maximus, you pro<u>claimed</u> to all the One Who was well-pleased to become man in His com<u>passion</u>, and is compre<u>hended</u> in two wills and <u>en</u>ergies. You stopped the gaping mouths of the most <u>e</u>vil ones, who, through the wantonness of the devil, the fabricator of <u>all wickedness</u>, // wrongly proclaimed Christ as having only one will and one <u>en</u>ergy.

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

By the strength of your doctrines, O Father <u>Maximus</u>, you choked the evil-minded Pyrrhus, who spoke vain and <u>fool</u>ish things. You under<u>went</u> persecutions and sorrows, O <u>bless</u>ed one: you were badly beaten, and your <u>tongue</u> was cut out; your divine hand, which you raised to <u>God</u>, was <u>cut</u> off,// yet with it you wrote the most sublime doctrines, O righteous one.

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

Your tongue became as the pen of a <u>ready</u> scribe, sharpened by the Spirit, O Father <u>Maximus</u>, in<u>scrib</u>ing the writing of divine virtues with grace upon the <u>tab</u>lets of our hearts, and conveying the doctrine of the incar<u>na</u>tion of Christ,//
Who willed to be made manifest to all mankind in two natures and one <u>Per</u>son.

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

Tone 8 (for St. Neophytus) (Oh, most glorious wonder)

Oh, most glorious wonder!

A dove descends from on high

and speaks in a human voice to Neophytus the Martyr,

illuminating him with an angel's way of life,

and sending the youth to contend most mightily.

Oh, what godly deeds were <u>done</u> by the <u>Mar</u>tyr!

He excelled in every contest.//

By his prayers, save our souls, O Christ, since You are compassionate!

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

Oh, most glorious wonder!

From his youth the wise Neophytus performs miracles

by the <u>strength</u> of the <u>Spir</u>it.

By his prayers water pours <u>out</u> from a rock;

he raises his dead mother back to life.

Oh, what godly deeds were done by the Martyr!

By his prayers, save our souls, O Christ, since You are compassionate!

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

Oh, most glorious wonder!

As Neophytus suffers bravely for Christ,

he amazes his enemies with astonishing miracles.

Thrown into the fire, he quenches it;

he causes savage beasts to cower in fear.

Oh, invincible might by which the <u>ath</u>lete was made <u>won</u>drous!//

By his prayers, O God, save us!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 6 (for Ven. Maximus)

The sound of your teachings has gone out into all the earth,

O venerable Father <u>Max</u>imus.

Therefore you have found the reward of your labors in the <u>heav</u>ens.

You destroyed the hosts of demons

and reached the ranks of Angels, whose life you blamelessly followed.

Since you have boldness before Christ our God,//

entreat peace for our souls!

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 8 (*Theotokion – Dogmatikon*)

The <u>King</u> of heaven, because of His <u>love</u> for man, appeared on earth and <u>dwelt</u> with men. He took <u>flesh</u> from the pure <u>Virgin</u> and after assuming it, He came <u>forth</u> from her. The Son is one: in two natures, yet one <u>Per</u>son. Proclaiming Him as perfect <u>God</u> and <u>per</u>fect Man, we confess <u>Christ</u> our God!//
Entreat Him, O unwedded Mother, to have mercy on our souls.

Aposticha

Tone 8 *(for the Resurrection)*

De<u>scending</u> from heaven to a<u>scend</u> the Cross, the eternal Life has <u>come</u> for death to raise <u>those</u> who are <u>fal</u>len; to enlighten those in <u>dark</u>ness.//
O Jesus, our Savior and illuminator, <u>glo</u>ry to You!

V. The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty!

We <u>glor</u>ify Christ, who <u>rose</u> from the dead. He accepted the human <u>body</u> and soul, and freed <u>both</u> from <u>suffering</u>. His most pure soul descended to <u>hell</u>, which He spoiled. His holy body did not see cor<u>rup</u>tion in the tomb.// He is the Redeemer of our souls.

V. For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved.

In <u>psalms</u> and songs we glorify Your Resurrection from the <u>dead</u>, O Christ. By it, You have freed us from the <u>tor</u>tures of hell// and as God have granted eternal life and great <u>mer</u>cy.

V. Holiness befits Your house, O Lord, forevermore!

O<u>Mas</u>ter of all, incomprehensible Creator of <u>heav</u>en and earth, by Your suffering on the Cross You have gained <u>pas</u>sionlessness for me. Accepting burial and a<u>ris</u>ing in glory, You resurrected Adam with Yourself by Your al<u>mighty</u> hand. Glory to Your rising on the <u>third</u> day! By it You have granted us eternal <u>life</u> and <u>cleansing</u> of sins// as the only com<u>pas</u>sionate One.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 8 *(for Ven. Maximus)*

We <u>hon</u>or you, O Maximus our <u>fa</u>ther, as the instructor of a <u>mul</u>titude of monks.

We have indeed learned to walk <u>rightly</u> in your <u>foot</u>steps.

Blessed are you, for having <u>la</u>bored for Christ, you denounced the power of the <u>en</u>emy.

You were a converser with the Angels and a companion of the <u>ven</u>erable and <u>right</u>eous.//

Together with them, entreat the Lord that He grant mercy to our souls!

O un<u>wed</u>ded <u>Virgin</u>, who ineffably conceived <u>God</u> in the flesh, O <u>Mother of God</u> most high, accept the cries of your servants, O <u>blame</u>less One! Grant cleansing of transgressions to all!// Receive our prayers and pray to <u>save</u> our souls!

Reveal Your <u>love</u> for <u>man</u>, O Merciful One, and accept the Theotokos <u>pray</u>ing for us,//
and save the despairing <u>people</u>, O our <u>Sav</u>ior!

(at the Divine Liturgy)

Tone 8 Troparion (*Resurrection*)

By rising <u>from</u> the <u>tomb</u>, You raised the dead and resurrected <u>Ad</u>am. Eve exults <u>in</u> Your <u>Resurrection</u>,// and the world celebrates Your rising from the dead, O greatly Merciful One!

Tone 6 Kontakion* (Ven. Maximus)

The Thrice-radiant Light took up abode in your soul, O all-blissful <u>fa</u>ther, and displayed it as an elect vessel, manifest to the <u>ends</u> of the earth.

O blessed Maximus, you explain hard-to-grasp doctrines with brilliance and <u>clar</u>ity,//
proclaiming the transcendent and unoriginate Trinity to all.

Tone 4 Kontakion (St. Neophytus)

You shined forth from the mount like <u>light</u>ning, glorifying Christ through your struggles and death as a <u>mar</u>tyr.//
Therefore, you have received an unfading crown, O Great-martyr Neophytus.
