Synaxis of the Three Great Ecumenical Teachers and Hierarchs: Basil the Great, Gregory the Theologian, and John Chrysostom

"Lord I Call..." Tone 4

Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! <u>Hear</u> me, O Lord! <u>Lord</u>, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! Receive the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call</u> upon You!// Hear me, O Lord!

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>in</u>cense, and <u>let</u> the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice!// Hear me, O Lord!

- **V.** (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name!
- V. (9) The righteous will surround me; for You will deal bountifully with me.
- V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

Tone 4 (As one valiant among martyrs)

Let us worthily honor the <u>in</u>struments of grace:
John, Basil, and <u>Greg</u>ory,
the <u>harps</u> of the Spirit, the resounding trumpets of <u>preaching</u>,
awesome and <u>clear</u> in tone,//
thundering from the heights to declare the glory of God to the ends of the earth!

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

Let us worthily honor the three <u>champions</u>: the bulwarks of de<u>vo</u>tion, the <u>three</u> apostles <u>add</u>ed to the twelve, rivers overflowing with living water from <u>Eden</u>, flooding the face of the earth with life-bearing and di<u>vine</u> streams!// They have formed the faith, as the elements form creation.

V. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

It is said: "There is no speech, nor are there <u>words</u> that are not heard in their <u>voices</u>"; for the procla<u>ma</u>tion of the godly and wise <u>teachers</u> has gone out through all the earth and the sea of cre<u>ation</u>. Therefore, through their divine precepts, great things are gathered and as<u>sem</u>bled//

into one true doctrine for the ends of the earth.

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

Let us who follow their <u>teachings</u> praise the instruments of the Holy <u>Spir</u>it with hymns; they are the <u>trumpets</u> of truth, the words of <u>or</u>ators! Let us entreat them, for they are <u>bold</u> before the Lord, that He may always grant forgiveness to <u>all</u> of us,// and great peace to the <u>whole</u> world!

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

Tone 2 (With what crowns)

With what <u>wreaths</u> of praise shall we crown the <u>teachers?</u> In separate <u>bodies</u>, they were united in <u>spirit</u>: God-bearing intercessors, equal in number to the <u>Trinity</u>, ministers and lights who illumine the <u>universe</u>, <u>pillars</u> of the Church, whom Christ, our <u>mer</u>ciful God,//crowns with wreaths of victorious <u>glory</u>.

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

With what beautiful hymns

shall we crown the God-bearing and heavenly initiates?

Preachers of the mysteries,

leading theologians of the Orthodox Faith:

Basil, manifest in holiness,

Gregory, godly and divinely inspired,

John of the golden tongue,//

whom the Trinity, the greatly merciful Lord, has fittingly glorified.

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

With what <u>words</u> of praise shall we extol the holy <u>hi</u>erarchs?

<u>Equals</u> to the Apostles in grace and the honor of <u>spir</u>itual gifts, destroyers of im<u>piety</u>, saviors and guides in <u>word</u> and deed, earthly <u>angels</u> and <u>heavenly</u> men, Christ-like <u>shep</u>herds in the faith,// whom Christ, the greatly merciful Lord of glory, has <u>hon</u>ored.

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

With what <u>wreaths</u> of praise shall we crown Chrysostom, together with Basil and <u>Gregory?</u> Precious <u>ves</u>sels of the Spirit, champions of the <u>pure</u> Faith, pillars of the Church and strength of the <u>faithful</u>, consolation for <u>sin</u>ners, <u>springs</u> overflowing with <u>wa</u>ter from which we drink for the de<u>light</u> of our souls,// as we ask forgiveness of sins and great <u>mer</u>cy.

Today let us praise the mystical trumpets of the <u>Spir</u>it, the God-bearing <u>Fa</u>thers, who stand in the midst of the Church, singing true the<u>ol</u>ogy, praising the changeless <u>Trin</u>ity!
They laid low the errors of <u>Ar</u>ius and upheld the <u>Orth</u>odox Faith.//
They always entreat the Lord to have mercy on our souls.

Tone 6 (*Theotokion – Dogmatikon*)

Who will not bless you, O most holy <u>Virgin?</u>
Who will not sing of your most pure <u>child</u>bearing?
The only-begotten Son shone timelessly from the <u>Fa</u>ther, but from you He was ineffably in<u>car</u>nate.
God by nature, yet <u>Man</u> for our sake, not two persons, but one known in two <u>na</u>tures.
Entreat Him, O pure and all-blessed <u>La</u>dy,//
to have <u>mer</u>cy on our souls!

Come, O worshippers of the heavenly <u>Trin</u>ity, let us praise the earthly trinity of the divine <u>hi</u>erarchs: <u>Gregory</u>, the namesake of the<u>ology</u>, Basil, who bears the name of the <u>Kingdom</u>, and John, truly <u>named</u> after grace! They are the <u>depths</u> of <u>wisdom</u>, the ocean currents of the <u>Spir</u>it, fountains ever gushing forth cascades of living <u>wa</u>ter, lustrous <u>pearls</u>, luminaries on earth, <u>rud</u>ders of the Church, trees bearing magnificent fruit, <u>stew</u>ards of grace, mouthpiece of my Christ, and champions of the <u>Trin</u>ity, from <u>Whom</u> they are illumined without mediation;// and they ceaselessly inter<u>cede</u> for our souls.

Let us, who have been en<u>light</u>ened through them, faithfully praise the coals kindled from the un<u>bear</u>able Fire! For, blazing in <u>un</u>ion with It, they became <u>lu</u>minaries for the world, being a vital <u>strength</u> for the poor, by preaching and extolling in true piety the Father, the Son, and the Holy <u>Spir</u>it; Let us <u>also say</u> to them://
"Rejoice, O godly-wise trinity of the <u>Trin</u>ity!"

Tone 6

Let us faithfully acclaim David's three-fold-sling,
Solomon's scarlet cord, the Word's three-stranded lash,
The wise hierarchs: Basil the Great, divine Gregory, and John Chrysostom;
for, having laid low the spiritual Goliath with the high Cornerstone,
they led the Faith to one-enss,
enclosing it by the crimson blood of Christ.
By their teachings they drove away from the folds of Christ's divine flock the leaders of heresies,
those peddlers who argued over divine truths.
Even now they still confirm the faith//
and intercede with the Lord that He have mercy on our souls.

Tone 8

The grace of <u>God</u> has appeared to all men, educating us through the three <u>teachers</u>, that, adorning our ways and im<u>proving</u> our <u>manner</u> of life, we might be illumined in mind by the brightness of divine <u>know</u>ledge. Therefore we cry: "O Holy Trinity, O <u>Lord</u> of all, by the <u>prayers</u> of Your three <u>Pas</u>tors, preserve Your flock in peace, in safety, and free of <u>anguish</u>,// and save us, for You are the Lover of man!"

Tone 6

O Trinity, holy and worthy of ado<u>ra</u>tion, glory to Your wise <u>prov</u>idence!

For, from among men, You have granted men three great <u>lu</u>minaries, who shine with the light of Your perfect <u>know</u>ledge, spreading the radiance of Your saving and <u>ho</u>ly will.

Through them, the inhabited earth is enriched with the light of <u>knowledge</u>, seeing Your glory <u>clear</u>ly; and it eagerly seeks Your blessed <u>King</u>dom, urging us to be obedient to their divine <u>teachings</u>.

Do You Yourself, as the all-<u>mer</u>ciful God, heed their prayers on <u>our</u> behalf,// and save our souls, O <u>Lov</u>er of man!

Having assembled together, O <u>lov</u>ers of the feasts, let us praise with song the hierarchs of Christ and fame of the <u>Fa</u>thers, the towers of the Faith and teachers and guardians of the <u>faithful!</u>

Rejoice, Gregory the Theo<u>logi</u>an, heavenly mind and <u>great</u>est high priest! Rejoice, John, of golden words, brilliant and distinguished preacher of re<u>pent</u>ance!"

Wherefore, O thrice-blessed <u>Fa</u>thers, cease not always to inter<u>cede</u> with Christ// for us who with faith and love celebrate your all-sacred and di<u>vine</u> feast.

Tone 6 (*Theotokion*)

Having assembled together, O <u>lov</u>ers of the feasts, let us praise with song the beauty of <u>virgins</u> the joy of the <u>heavenly Hosts</u>, the only Theotokos and un<u>breakable wall</u>, defending the Faithful on <u>every side</u>: and let us say: "Rejoice, O pure Virgin <u>Mother</u>, gold-gleaming lampstand and <u>heavenly gate!</u> Rejoice, O undefiled tabernacle of sanctification, who contained <u>God</u> in your womb! Rejoice, you who are incomparably higher than all the <u>heavenly hosts!</u> Therefore, O Lady and Mother who did <u>not know man</u>, cease not to protect your <u>ser</u>vants who ever sing your praises with <u>faith</u> and love,// and who venerate your birthgiving without seed!"

Aposticha

Tone 1 (*O all-praised martyrs*)

To<u>day</u> let us worthily <u>gather</u> to praise the spiritual initiates of the <u>mys</u>teries, the <u>trumpets</u> of God and reflections of His <u>glo</u>ry: Basil the Great, the divine Gregory of <u>fiery</u> inspi<u>ra</u>tion, and <u>John</u>, the truly <u>gold</u>en-mouthed!// They pour out streams of golden <u>teachings</u> on us.

V. Your saints shall exult in glory and rejoice upon their beds. (Ps. 149:5)

Let us <u>praise</u> with worthy hymns the foun<u>da</u>tions of the faith: the godly and <u>watch</u>ful minds, the <u>ra</u>diant golden-streamed rivers and the shining <u>bea</u>cons, the champions of the Trinity, the vessels of the <u>grace</u> of the <u>Spir</u>it,// the unshakable pillars and the strength of the Church!

V. Your priests shall be clothed with righteousness and Your saints will shout for joy. (Ps. 131:9)

O thrice-<u>bless</u>ed <u>Basil</u>, divinely wise <u>Gregory</u>, and most <u>golden</u> and all-<u>hon</u>ored John, you were <u>in</u>struments of the <u>Spirit</u>, <u>trumpets</u> of divine thunder, lightning flashes of <u>preaching</u>, most radiant beacons, shining with the golden <u>light</u> of God!// Pray to Christ that He may save those who <u>hon</u>or you!

Tone 2

Today, the souls of mortals are raised up from <u>earthly</u> things. Today, on the saints' memorial, they become <u>heav</u>enly. The <u>gates</u> of heaven are <u>opened</u>, and the words of the Master are <u>spoken</u> to us. Words proclaim the Word, and tongues sing hymns to His <u>won</u>ders. We cry <u>out</u> to the <u>Sav</u>ior: "Glory to You, O <u>Christ</u> our God, // for through them peace has been given to the <u>faithful!</u>"

Tone 2 (Forefeast of the Meeting of the Lord)

Today Christ is carried in the sanctuary as an <u>Infant;</u> today He Who gave the Law to Moses becomes <u>subject</u> to the Law. The <u>armies</u> of angels <u>won</u>dered, seeing Him Who holds all things carried in the arms of an <u>eld</u>erly man. Filled with reverence, Simeon cried out, rejoicing:

"O <u>Sav</u>ior, now let me depart from this fleeting life to a rest that <u>grows</u> not old,//
for I have seen You, and <u>I</u> rejoice!"

(at Great Vespers)
