**TONE 2** 

"Lord I Call..." Tone 2

Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! Hear <u>me</u>, O Lord! <u>Lord</u>, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! Receive the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call</u> upon You!// Hear me, O Lord!

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>incense</u>, and <u>let</u> the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice!// <u>Hear me</u>, O Lord!

**V.** (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name!

## **Tone 2** *(for the Resurrection)*

Come, let us worship the <u>Word</u> of God begotten of the Father before all <u>ages</u>, and in<u>car</u>nate of the Virgin <u>Mary</u>! Having en<u>dured</u> the Cross, He was buried as He Him<u>self</u> desired.// And having risen from the dead, He saved me, an <u>er</u>ring man.

V. (9) The righteous will surround me; for You will deal bountifully with me.

## Christ our <u>Savior</u>

nailed to the Cross the bond against us, He <u>void</u>ed it and destroyed the do<u>min</u>ion of death.// We fall down before His Resurrection on the <u>third</u> day.

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

# With the Archangels

let us praise the Resur<u>rec</u>tion of Christ! He is our <u>Sav</u>ior, our Re<u>deem</u>er. He is coming with awesome glory and mighty <u>pow</u>er// to judge the <u>world</u> which He made.

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

## (Resurrection stichera by Anatolius)

The Angel pro<u>claimed</u> You, the crucified and buried <u>Mas</u>ter.

He <u>told</u> the women: "Come, see the <u>place</u> where He lay! He is <u>ris</u>en as He said, for He is al<u>mighty</u>."

We <u>wor</u>ship You, O only im<u>mor</u>tal One.//
Have mercy on us, O Christ, the <u>Giv</u>er of life!

**V.** (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

#### **Tone 1** *Idiomela (by Patriarch Germanus)*

Simeon, tell us, Whom you bear in your arms, that you rejoice so greatly in the Temple? To Whom do you shout and cry aloud: "Now I am set free, for I have seen my Savior?" This is He Who was born of a Virgin; this is God the Word, Who came forth from God, Who for our sakes has taken flesh and has saved man.// Let us worship Him!

**V.** (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

<u>Sim</u>eon, receive Him Whom Moses once beheld in <u>dark</u>ness, granting the Law on <u>Si</u>nai, now that <u>He</u> has become a Babe <u>subject</u> to the Law! This is <u>He</u> Who <u>spoke</u> through the Law. This is <u>He</u>, of Whom the <u>Proph</u>ets spoke, Who for our sakes has taken flesh and has <u>saved</u> man.// Let us <u>wor</u>ship Him!

**V.** (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

<u>Come</u>, let us also go to meet Christ with di<u>vine</u> songs!

Let us receive Him Whose salvation <u>Simeon saw!</u>

This is <u>He</u> Whom <u>Dav</u>id announced; this is He Who <u>spoke</u> in the <u>Proph</u>ets, <u>Who</u>, for our sakes, has taken flesh and Who <u>speaks</u> through the Law.// Let us worship Him!

**V.** (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

#### Tone 4 (the Feast)

The Lover of man, fulfilling everything <u>writ</u>ten in the Law, now is brought into the <u>Temple</u>.

<u>Simeon the Elder receives Him in his aged arms, crying: "Let me depart now to the <u>blessed life</u>, for today I behold You, <u>clothed</u> in <u>mor</u>tal flesh,// the Lord of life and <u>Mas</u>ter of death!"</u>

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

Lord, the Light of revelation for the <u>na</u>tions, You have shone as the Sun of <u>right</u>eousness, en<u>throned</u> upon a <u>ra</u>diant cloud.

You have fulfilled the <u>shad</u>ow of the Law: The grace of re<u>newal</u> begins to shine.

When Simeon received You, he <u>cried</u> in joy: "Now release me from cor<u>rup</u>tion,// for I have seen You, my <u>Mas</u>ter!"

**V.** (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

You took flesh in Your good <u>pleas</u>ure; You were carried in arms You Your<u>self</u> had formed, without <u>leaving</u> the bosom of the <u>Fa</u>ther. Simeon <u>held</u> You in his hands, though Your hands had fashioned both <u>him</u> and <u>all</u> the world. He cried <u>out</u> in joy: "Let me depart, O <u>Good</u> One,// for today I have seen You, the <u>Lov</u>er of man!"

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

# **Tone 6** *(by John the Monk)*

Let the gate of heaven be <u>o</u>pened today, for the unoriginate Word of the <u>Fa</u>ther has made a beginning in time without forsaking His di<u>vin</u>ity. As a Babe <u>for</u>ty days old,

of His own will He is brought by the Virgin, His Mother, as an offering in the Temple of the Law.

The Elder receives Him in his arms, crying as a servant to his Master:

"Let me depart for my eyes have seen Your salvation!"//

Glory to You, O Lord, for You have come into the world to save mankind.

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

#### **Tone 2** (*Theotokion – Dogmatikon*)

The shadow of the Law passed when grace came; as the Bush burned, yet was not consumed, so the <u>Virgin</u> gave birth, yet remained a <u>Virgin</u>. The Righteous Sun has risen instead of a <u>pillar</u> of flame.//Instead of Moses, Christ, the Sal<u>va</u>tion of our souls.

## **Tone 1** (by Anatolius)

The <u>An</u>cient of Days, Who gave Moses the Law on Sinai in <u>for</u>mer times, today appears as a Child.

As Maker of the Law, He fulfills the Law.

He is brought into the <u>Tem</u>ple ac<u>cord</u>ing to the Law,

and given over to the Elder.

Simeon the righteous receives Him.

Be<u>hold</u>ing the fulfillment of the divine order now <u>brought</u> to pass, rejoicing aloud, he cries:

"My eyes have seen the mystery hidden from the ages made manifest in these <u>lat</u>ter days, the <u>Light</u> that disperses the foolishness of the faithless <u>Gen</u>tiles, and the glory of the newly-<u>cho</u>sen <u>Is</u>rael!

<u>Therefore</u> let Your servant depart from the <u>bonds</u> of this flesh to the life filled with wonder that knows no <u>age</u> or end,// for You grant the world great mercy!"

## **Tone 1** *(by John the Monk)*

To<u>day</u> He Who once gave the Law to Moses on <u>Si</u>nai submits Himself to the com<u>mand</u>ments of the Law, be<u>com</u>ing for our sakes like us in His com<u>passion</u>. Now the God of purity as a holy Child has <u>o</u>pened a <u>pure</u> womb, and as <u>God</u> He is brought as an <u>offering</u> to Himself, setting us free from the <u>curse</u> of the Law,// and granting <u>light</u> to our souls.

## **Tone 2** (by Andrew Pyros)

Simeon now receives below in his <u>earthly</u> arms
Him Whom the ministers on high entreat with <u>trem</u>bling.
He pro<u>claims</u> the union of <u>God</u> with mankind.
He sees the heavenly God as <u>mor</u>tal Man.
He prepares to withdraw from <u>earthly</u> things, and <u>raises</u> his <u>cry</u> in joy:
"Glory to You, O Lord, for You have revealed to those in <u>dark</u>ness// the Light that knows no <u>evening!</u>"

#### Tone 2 (by Germanus)

Today Simeon takes in his arms the Lord of <u>Glo</u>ry, Whom Moses saw of old in the <u>dark</u>ness when he re<u>ceived</u> the Tablets of the Law on Mount <u>Si</u>nai. This is He Who speaks through the <u>Proph</u>ets and Who is the Cre<u>a</u>tor of the Law. This is <u>He</u> Whom <u>Da</u>vid announced;// He is fearful to all, yet great and abundant in <u>mer</u>cy.

## **Tone 2** *(by Germanus or John the Monk)*

The holy Virgin brought the Holy One to the priest in the sacred <u>Tem</u>ple. Simeon, extending his arms, received Him with joy, and cried out: "Now, <u>Mas</u>ter, let Your servant depart in peace,// according to Your <u>word</u>, O Lord!"

## **Tone 2** *(by Germanos or John the Monk)*

Today holy Simeon the <u>Eld</u>er lifted up in his arms the Creator of <u>heav</u>en and earth, as he <u>said</u> in the Holy <u>Spir</u>it://
"Now I am set free, for I have seen my <u>Sav</u>ior."

## **Tone 2** (by Anatolius or Andrew of Jerusalem)

Today Simeon the Elder enters the Temple, rejoicing in the <u>Spir</u>it, to take into his arms Him Who gave the Law to <u>Mo</u>ses and Who Himself fulfilled the Law.

Moses was deemed worthy to see God through darkness and as an indistinct voice.

With veiled face he reproved the faithless hearts of the <u>He</u>brews; while <u>Si</u>meon lifted up the pre-eternal Word of the Father in <u>bod</u>ily form, and revealed the Light of the Gentiles: the Cross and the Resur<u>rec</u>tion. And Anna the Prophetess pointed out the <u>Sav</u>ior, pro<u>claiming Him the Deliverer of Is</u>rael. Let us cry <u>out to Him://</u>
"O Christ our God, through the Theotokos, have <u>mer</u>cy on us!"

#### **Tone 4** *(by Andrew of Crete)*

Today the holy Mother who is even more exalted than the <u>Temple</u>, has come into the <u>Temple</u>, clearly <u>showing</u> to the world the Creator of the world and the <u>Giver</u> of the Law. Simeon the Elder receives Him in his arms and honors Him, <u>cry</u>ing out: "Now let Your <u>ser</u>vant de<u>part</u> in peace,// for I have seen You, the <u>Sav</u>ior of our souls!"

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

## Tone 5 (by Andrew of Crete)

Search the <u>Scrip</u>tures, just as Christ our God said in the <u>Gos</u>pels!

For in them we find Him being brought forth and wrapped in <u>swad</u>dling clothes, laid in a <u>manger</u>, and <u>nour</u>ished with milk, re<u>ceiv</u>ing circumcision and held by <u>Si</u>meon, neither in fancy nor in <u>fan</u>tasy but in <u>truth</u> appearing to the world.

Let us <u>cry</u> a<u>loud</u> to Him://

"O pre-eternal <u>God</u>, <u>glory</u> to You!"

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen

## **Tone 5** *(by Germanos or Anatolius)*

The <u>An</u>cient of Days, as a <u>Child</u> in the flesh, is brought by His Mother the Virgin into the Holy <u>Temple</u>, ful<u>fil</u>ling the promise an<u>nounced</u> by His own Law. Re<u>ceiving Him, Simeon said:</u> "Now let Your servant depart in peace, acc<u>ording</u> to Your word,// for my eyes have <u>seen</u> Your sal<u>va</u>tion, O Lord!"

#### **Aposticha**

#### **Tone 2** *(for the Resurrection)*

Your Resurrection, O Christ our <u>Sav</u>ior, has enlightened the whole <u>u</u>niverse, re<u>call</u>ing Your creation.// Glory to You, O almighty Lord!

**V.** The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty!

By the Tree You destroyed the curse of the Tree, O <u>Sav</u>ior. By Your burial You mortified the <u>maj</u>esty of death. You have en<u>light</u>ened our race by Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion.// O Giver of life, Christ our God, glory to You!

**V.** For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved.

When You were seen nailed to the <u>Cross</u>, O Christ, You restored the beauty of Your <u>crea</u>tures. The <u>sol</u>diers showed their inhumanity when they pierced Your <u>side</u> with a spear. The Hebrews, not knowing Your <u>power</u>, asked that Your <u>tomb</u> might be sealed, but through the <u>mercy</u> of Your compassion, You accepted the tomb and rose on the <u>third</u> day!// O Lord, <u>glory</u> to You!

V. Holiness befits Your house, O Lord, forevermore!

O Christ, the <u>Giv</u>er of life, for the sake of the dead You voluntarily en<u>dured</u> death, de<u>scending</u> into hell as the <u>Mighty</u> One to save those who awaited Your <u>coming</u>, granting them the life of paradise in<u>stead</u> of hell. Grant <u>al</u>so to us who glorify Your Resurrection on the <u>third</u> day// cleansing of our sins and great <u>mer</u>cy!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

## **Tone 8** *(by Andrew of Crete)*

He Who is borne on high by the Cherubim and praised in hymns by the **Ser**aphim is brought today according to the Law into the <u>holy Temple</u> and rests in the arms of the Elder as on a throne. From Joseph He receives gifts fitting for God: a pair of doves, a symbol of the spotless Church and of the newly chosen people of the Gentiles, and two young pigeons, for He is the originator of the two <u>Cov</u>enants, both <u>Old</u> and New. Simeon, now granted the fulfillment of the prophesies concerning himself, blesses the Virgin and Theotokos Mary. He foretells in figures the Passion of her Son. From Him he begs release, crying aloud: "Now, Master, let me depart as You have promised me, for I have seen the pre-eternal Light// and the Lord and Savior of the people who bear the Name of Christ!"

#### (at Great Vespers)

## Tone 2 Troparion (Resurrection)

When You descended to death, O Life Immortal, You slew hell with the splendor of Your Godhead. And when from the depths You raised the dead, all the powers of heaven cried out:// "O Giver of life, Christ our God, glory to You!"

## **Tone 1** Troparion (*Feast*)

Rejoice, O Virgin Theotokos, <u>Full</u> of Grace! From you shone the Sun of Righteousness, <u>^Christ</u> our God, enlightening those who sat in <u>dark</u>ness. Rejoice and be glad, O righteous <u>Elder</u>, you accepted in your arms the <u>^Redeemer</u> of our souls,// Who grants us the Resurrection!

## Tone 2 Kontakion (Resurrection)

Hell became afraid, O almighty <u>Sav</u>ior, seeing the miracle of Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion from the tomb!

The <u>dead</u> arose! Creation, with Adam, beheld this and rejoiced with You,// and the world, my Savior, praises <u>You</u> for<u>ev</u>er.

## Tone 1 Kontakion (Feast)

By Your Na<u>tiv</u>ity You sanctified the <u>Virgin</u>'s womb and blessed Simeon's hands, ^O <u>Christ</u> God. Now You have come and saved <u>us</u> through love. Grant <u>peace</u> to all Orthodox <u>Christians</u>,//O only <u>Lover</u> of Man!

## Tone 2 Prokeimenon (Resurrection)

The Lord is my strength and my song; / He has become my salvation. (Ps. 117:14)

**V.** The Lord has chastened me sorely, but He has not given me over to death. (Ps. 117:18)

## **Tone 3 Prokeimenon** (Song of the Theotokos)

My soul magnifies the Lord, / and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior. (*Lk.* 1:46-47)
