# Sunday of the Publican and the Pharisee [Beginning of the Lenten Triodion]

#### "Lord I Call..." Tone 5

Lord, I call upon You, hear me! Hear me, O Lord!
Lord, I call upon You, hear me!
Receive the voice of my prayer, when I call upon You!//
Hear me, O Lord!

Let my prayer arise in Your sight as incense, and let the lifting up of my hands be an evening sacrifice!//
Hear me, O Lord!

- **V.** (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name!
- **V**. (9) The righteous will surround me, for You will deal bountifully with me.

# **Tone 5** *(for the Resurrection)*

By Your <u>pre</u>cious <u>Cross</u>, O Christ, You have put the <u>dev</u>il to shame. By Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion, You have blunted the <u>sting</u> of sin and <u>saved</u> us from the <u>gates</u> of death.// We glorify You, O <u>on</u>ly be<u>got</u>ten One.

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

<u>Christ</u> was led as a sheep to the <u>slaughter</u> in order to grant Resurrection to the <u>human race</u>. The <u>princes</u> of hell were <u>frightened</u> by this, for the <u>gates</u> of sorrow were <u>lifted</u>. Christ the King of glory had <u>entered</u>, <u>saying to those in <u>chains</u>: "Go forth!"// And to those in <u>darkness</u>: "<u>Come</u> to the light!"</u>

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

O great wonder!

The Creator of the invisible suffered in the flesh in His <u>love</u> for man and rose again immortal.

Come, O sons of nations,

let us worship Him,

for delivered from error by His compassion,//

we have learned to sing of one <u>God</u> in three <u>Persons!</u>

**V.** (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

(Resurrection stichera by Anatolius)

We offer You our evening worship,

O never setting Light,

Who <u>came</u> in these last days to the <u>world</u> in the flesh;

Who even descended to hell to dispel its darkness.

Who has revealed the light of Resurrection to the <u>na</u>tions.//

Glory to You, O Lord and Giver of light!

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

We <u>glo</u>rify the Leader of our sal<u>va</u>tion; by His Resur<u>rec</u>tion from the dead, the <u>world</u> was <u>saved</u> from deceit. The as<u>sem</u>bly of Angels rejoices as the deceit of demons is <u>ov</u>erthrown.// Fallen Adam rises as the devil falls.

**V.** (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

The guards were instructed by the <u>law</u>less ones:

"Hide the rising of Christ, take money and say:

'The body was stolen from the tomb while we were asleep.'"

But who has heard of a body being stolen,

a body embalmed and naked,

with its grave clothes left behind in the tomb?

Do not be deceived, O Jews,

study the words of the Prophets and <u>un</u>derstand://

Christ is the Redeemer of the world and all powerful!

**V.** (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

O <u>Lord</u>, Who has <u>cap</u>tured hell and <u>trampled</u> on death,
You have en<u>light</u>ened the world by Your <u>prec</u>ious Cross.//
O <u>Sav</u>ior, have <u>mer</u>cy on us!

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

**Tone 1**\* *Idiomela* (from the Lenten Triodion)

Brothers, let us not pray like the Pharisee! He who exalts himself will be humbled. Let us prepare to abase ourselves by fasting; let us cry aloud with the voice of the Publican:// "O God, forgive us sinners!"

**V**. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

The <u>Phar</u>isee went up to the temple with a proud and <u>emp</u>ty heart; the Publican bowed himself in re<u>pent</u>ance.

They <u>both</u> stood before You, O <u>Mas</u>ter: the one, through <u>boasting</u>, <u>lost</u> his reward, but the <u>oth</u>er, with tears and sighs, won Your <u>blessing</u>: Strengthen me, O Christ our God, as I weep in Your <u>presence</u>,// since You are the Lover of man!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

**Tone 8** *(from the Lenten Triodion)* 

I <u>know</u> the value of tears, O al<u>mighty</u> Lord: they delivered Hezekiah from the <u>gates</u> of death, and rescued the <u>har</u>lot from re<u>peated</u> sins.

Tears justified the Publican instead of the <u>Phar</u>isee.

I <u>pray</u> You, O Lord://

"Number me with the former, and have <u>mer</u>cy on me!"

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

## **Tone 5** (*Theotokion – Dogmatikon*)

In the Red Sea of old, a type of the Virgin Bride was prefigured. There Moses divided the waters; here Gabriel assisted in the miracle. There Israel crossed the sea without getting wet, here the Virgin gave birth to Christ without seed. After Israel's passage, the sea remained impassable; after Emmanuel's birth, the Virgin remained a Virgin. O ever-existing God Who appeared as Man,//O Lord, have mercy on us!

## **Aposticha**

## **Tone 5** *(for the Resurrection)*

We <u>magnify</u> You in <u>songs</u> of praise,
O incarnate Christ and <u>Sav</u>ior.
By ac<u>cepting</u> the Cross and <u>death</u> for our sake, as the <u>Lord</u> and <u>Lover</u> of man,
You overthrew the <u>gates</u> of hell,//
and arose on the <u>third</u> day, <u>sav</u>ing our souls.

**V**. The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty!

By being <u>pierced</u> in the side, O <u>Lov</u>er of man, You have poured out drops of life and sal<u>va</u>tion for all. By ac<u>cepting</u> death in the flesh, You have granted us immor<u>tal</u>ity. You have <u>freed</u> us by being <u>placed</u> in the tomb, and have resurrected us with Yourself in <u>glory</u>, as God.// Glory to You, O <u>Lord</u> and <u>Lov</u>er of man!

**V**. For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved.

Your cruci<u>fix</u>ion and descent into hell are awesome, O <u>Lov</u>er of man. You have captured it, releasing the ancient <u>pris</u>oners. You have <u>opened Paradise</u> and <u>giv</u>en it to us. <u>Grant</u> us purification of sins, who glorify Your Resurrection on the <u>third</u> day! Make us <u>wor</u>thy of <u>Paradise</u>// and <u>save</u> us, O <u>Lov</u>er of man!

**V**. Holiness befits Your house, O Lord, forevermore!

For our <u>sake</u>, You accepted <u>death</u> in the flesh, to rise from the dead on the <u>third</u> day. <u>Heal</u> us from our earthly <u>passions</u>, and re<u>store</u> us from our evil trans<u>gressions</u>;// and save us, O Lover of man!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

#### **Tone 5** *(from the Lenten Triodion)*

The <u>weight</u> of my transgressions <u>bur</u>dens mine eyes: I cannot lift my gaze to the heights of <u>heav</u>en, O Lord. Ac<u>cept</u> me in repentance, as You accepted the <u>Pub</u>lican;//have mercy on <u>me</u>, O <u>Sav</u>ior!

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

#### **Tone 5** (*Theotokion*)

O most <u>pre</u>cious <u>Virgin</u>, you are the gate, the <u>tem</u>ple, the <u>pal</u>ace, the <u>throne</u> of the King.

From <u>you</u>, my Redeemer, <u>Christ</u> the Lord, appeared to those asleep in <u>dark</u>ness.

<u>He</u> is the Sun of <u>Right</u>eousness,

Who de<u>sired</u> to enlighten His image, whom He had created.

Since you possess motherly boldness before Him, O all praised <u>La</u>dy,// pray un<u>ceas</u>ingly that our <u>souls</u> may be saved!

#### (at Great Vespers) Tone 5 Troparion (Resurrection)

Let <u>us</u>, the faithful, praise and <u>wor</u>ship the Word, co-eternal with the Father and the <u>Spirit</u>, <u>born</u> for our salvation from the <u>Virgin</u>; for He <u>willed</u> to be lifted up on the <u>Cross</u> in the flesh, to en<u>dure</u> death, and to <u>raise</u> the dead// by His <u>glorious</u> Resurrection.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

#### **Tone 5** Resurrectional Dismissal Theotokion

Rejoice, Impassable <u>Gate</u> of the Lord!
Rejoice, Wall and Protection of those who <u>run</u> to you!
Rejoice, Unshakable <u>Re</u>fuge!
Rejoice, you who knew not <u>wed</u>lock,
who gave birth in the flesh to your Creator and God!//
Do not cease praying for those who <u>praise</u> and <u>wor</u>ship your Son!

#### (at the Divine Liturgy)

#### Tone 5 Troparion (Resurrection)

Let <u>us</u>, the faithful, praise and <u>wor</u>ship the Word, co-eternal with the Father and the <u>Spirit</u>, <u>born</u> for our salvation from the <u>Virgin</u>; for He <u>willed</u> to be lifted up on the <u>Cross</u> in the flesh, to en<u>dure</u> death, and to <u>raise</u> the dead// by His <u>glorious</u> Resur<u>rec</u>tion.

# Tone 4 Kontakion (from the Lenten Triodion)

Let us flee from the pride of the <u>Pharisee!</u>
Let us learn humility from the <u>Publican's tears!</u>
Let us cry to our <u>Savior:</u>
"Have <u>mercy on us,//</u>
O only <u>merciful One!"</u>

You, O Lord, shall protect us / and preserve us from this generation forever. (*Ps.* 11:7)

V. Save me, O Lord, for there is no longer any that is godly! (Ps. 11:1a)
