Come, let us rejoice in the Lord, Who destroyed the dominion of death! Let us sing to Him with the bodiless hosts, for He enlightened the race of man!// O our Maker and Savior, glory to You!

V. (9) The righteous will surround me; for You will deal bountifully with me.

You en<u>dured</u> the Cross and <u>bur</u>ial for our sake. By Your <u>death</u>, You destroyed <u>death</u> as God. We fall <u>down</u> before Your Resurrection on the <u>third</u> day,//O <u>Sav</u>ior, <u>glo</u>ry to You!

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

When the Apostles beheld the Resurrection of the Maker, they were amazed and sang the angelic praise.

This is the glory of the Church.

This is the richness of the Kingdom.//
O Lord, crucified for our sake, glory to You!

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

(Resurrection stichera by Anatolius)

You were <u>held</u> by lawless <u>men</u>, O Christ, but to <u>me</u>, You are God, and I am <u>not</u> ashamed. You were <u>smit</u>ten on the cheek, but I do not de<u>ny</u> You. You were <u>nailed</u> to the Cross and I do not con<u>ceal</u> it, for I <u>glo</u>ry in Your Resurrection: Your <u>death</u> is my life.// O Almighty Lord and Lover of <u>man</u>, <u>glo</u>ry to You!

V. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

Fulfilling the prophecy of <u>David</u>,

<u>Christ</u> manifested His greatness in Zion to the dis<u>ci</u>ples. He is <u>praised</u> and always <u>glo</u>rified,
to<u>get</u>her with the Father and the Holy <u>Spir</u>it.

At <u>first</u> as the Word, He was <u>bod</u>iless,
but <u>then</u> He took flesh and was <u>slain</u> for our sake.//
He rose in <u>power</u> as the <u>Lover</u> of man!

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

You des<u>cend</u>ed into hell as You <u>willed</u>, O Christ, over<u>throw</u>ing death as God, and rising on the third day as <u>Mas</u>ter! With Your<u>self</u> You raised Adam from the bonds of hell and from cor<u>rup</u>tion!//Glory to Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion, O only <u>Lov</u>er of man!

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

Tone 6* (from the Lenten Triodion) (Having placed all their hope)

O Righteous Judge of <u>all</u> mankind, You will come, enthroned in glory and escorted by <u>ang</u>els, to judge the <u>liv</u>ing and the dead. Every man will stand in <u>fear</u> before You, trembling at the river of fire flowing <u>past</u> Your throne,

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

The books will be opened, and the works of all <u>men</u> laid bare; the vale of tears will echo with the <u>gnashing</u> of teeth; the sinners will mourn in vain, as they depart to eternal dam<u>na</u>tion. Your judgments are just, O Lord Al<u>mighty!</u> We beg You, O Master full of goodness and com<u>passion</u>,// take pity on us who sing to You, O most <u>mer</u>ciful One!

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

The trumpet shall sound, and the graves shall be opened; all mankind will arise in trembling; the righteous will rejoice, as they receive their reward, but the wicked will depart to eternal fire with wailing and horror. O Lord of Glory, have mercy on us!

Number us with those who love You,// for You alone are good, O Master!

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

I shudder in terror when I think of that <u>dreadful</u> day; I weep as I consider the darkness that will <u>nev</u>er see light: there the worm shall not cease, or the <u>fire</u> be quenched; the pain of those who reject You will <u>nev</u>er end.
