SUNDAY, MARCH 24 TONE 1 First Sunday of Great Lent: Sunday of Orthodoxy, Forefeast of Annunciation

"Lord I Call..." Tone 1

Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! <u>Hear</u> me, O Lord! Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! Receive the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call</u> up<u>on</u> You!// Hear me, O Lord!

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>in</u>cense, and <u>let</u> the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an <u>evening sac</u>rifice!// <u>Hear me</u>, O Lord!

V. (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name!

Tone 1 *(for the Resurrection)*

Ac<u>cept</u> our evening prayers, O <u>ho</u>ly Lord! Grant us re<u>mis</u>sion of sins,// for You alone have manifested the Resur<u>rec</u>tion to the world.

V. (9) The righteous will surround me, for You will deal bountifully with me.

En<u>cir</u>cle <u>Zi</u>on and surround her, O <u>people</u>! Give <u>glo</u>ry in her to the One Who <u>rose</u> from the dead! For <u>He</u> is <u>our</u> God,// Who has delivered us from our trans<u>gres</u>sions!

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

<u>Come</u>, O <u>people</u>, let us hymn and fall <u>down</u> before Christ, <u>glo</u>rifying His Resur<u>rec</u>tion from the dead! For <u>He</u> is <u>our</u> God,// Who has delivered the world from the <u>En</u>emy's deceit!

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

O Lord, Whom nothing can con<u>tain</u> or grasp, from all eternity You shone forth from the <u>Fa</u>ther before the <u>morning star</u>. The Prophets, inspired by the Holy <u>Spir</u>it, foretold that You would take flesh and assume the <u>form</u> of a child, from her who is ever-v<u>irg</u>in. You <u>lived</u> among men; You were seen by material cre<u>a</u>tion. Through the prayers of the Prophets, O com<u>pas</u>sionate One, make us worthy to re<u>ceive</u> Your light,// for we sing praises to Your glorious Resur<u>rec</u>tion!

V. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

The Prophets bore the fruit of e<u>ter</u>nal life; they prepared the <u>way</u> of the Lord. By their words they proclaimed You; by their deeds they <u>hon</u>ored You: they would not worship creation instead of You, the Cre<u>a</u>tor. As Your Gospel commands, they re<u>nounced</u> the world. They foretold Your Passion by <u>suf</u>fering themselves. Through their <u>prayers</u>, O Lord,// enable us to pass over the battlefield of Lent without sin!

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

You are infinite in Your divine nature, O <u>Mas</u>ter; in these latter days You accepted the limi<u>ta</u>tions of the flesh. By assuming our body, You accepted all its <u>weak</u>nesses. Therefore we make <u>images</u> of Your form; we venerate them, having <u>You</u> in mind. We fall down be<u>fore</u> You in love; by so doing we follow the tradition of the A<u>pos</u>tles// and are given the grace of healing.

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

Today the Church of Christ receives honorable a<u>dorn</u>ment: the holy icons of Christ our Savior, the Theotokos, and <u>all</u> the Saints. The Church ex<u>ults</u> in their grace! We lift them up with joy and <u>glad</u>ness! We glorify God, the <u>Lov</u>er of man,// Him Who patiently <u>suf</u>fered for our sake!

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and *He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.*

Tone 4 (from the Menaion, for the Forefeast) (As one valiant among the martyrs)

The mystery hidden from all e<u>ter</u>nity, unknown even by the <u>Ang</u>els, is now en<u>trust</u>ed to the Archangel <u>Ga</u>briel. He will come to you, O precious <u>ves</u>sel; he will sa<u>lute</u> you and <u>cry</u> in joy: "Rejoice, pure dove! Rejoice, all-<u>ho</u>ly one!// Make ready by your word to conceive the <u>Word</u> of God!"

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

The palace of light is ready for You, O <u>Mas</u>ter, the womb of the undefiled <u>child</u> of God. Come <u>down</u> to her; come to visit Your <u>fallen</u> world, which is held in bitter slavery to the jealous <u>En</u>emy! Many ages have passed since its <u>beauty was</u> destroyed. Make haste to descend to <u>earth</u>, O Lord!// Come to deliver us from the <u>way</u> of death!

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

Gabriel the Archangel comes to you, O all-<u>blame</u>less one; he will greet you, <u>cry</u>ing with joy: "Rejoice, deliverance from condem<u>na</u>tion! Rejoice, chosen vessel made <u>per</u>fect for God! Rejoice, life-bearing <u>dawn</u> of the <u>end</u>less day!// The Lord, Whom the heavens cannot contain, is pleased to <u>dwell</u> in you!"

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 2 (from the Lenten Triodion)

Grace and <u>truth</u> have shone forth.

The predictions of old have been <u>clearly</u> fulfilled. Be<u>hold</u>, the Church adorns herself with the form of Christ in<u>car</u>nate! The icons of the new creation transcend the <u>adorn</u>ments of the old. As the Ark of the Covenant held the <u>presence</u> of God, so <u>now</u> the icons reveal the presence of the <u>One</u> we adore. By honoring them we will <u>never</u> go astray. It is our glory to fall down and worship <u>Christ</u> in the flesh. <u>Come</u>, O faithful, venerate His <u>im</u>age and cry out:// O Lord, save Your people, and bless Your in<u>her</u>itance!

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 1 (*Theotokion – Dogmatikon*)

Let us <u>praise</u> the Virgin <u>Mary</u>! The gate of heaven, the <u>glo</u>ry of the world! The <u>song</u> of the angels, the beauty of the <u>faith</u>ful! She was born of <u>man</u>, yet gave <u>birth</u> to God! She was re<u>vealed</u> as the heaven, as the temple of the <u>God</u>head! She destroyed the wall of <u>en</u>mity! She com<u>menced</u> the peace; she opened the <u>King</u>dom! Since she is <u>our</u> foun<u>dation</u> of faith, our de<u>fen</u>der is the <u>Lord</u> Whom she bore! Courage! Courage! O <u>People</u> of God! For <u>Christ</u> will destroy our <u>en</u>emies// since He is all <u>pow</u>erful.

Aposticha

Tone 1 *(for the Resurrection)*

We have been <u>freed</u> from <u>suf</u>ferings by Your <u>suf</u>fering, O Christ. <u>We</u> have been delivered from cor<u>rup</u>tion by Your <u>Resurrec</u>tion.// O Lord, <u>glo</u>ry to You!

V. The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty!

Let creation rejoice! Let the <u>heavens</u> be glad! Let the <u>nations</u> clap their hands with <u>gladness</u>, for Christ our Savior has <u>nailed</u> our <u>sins</u> to the Cross. Slaying <u>death</u>, He has given <u>life</u>.// He has resurrected fallen Adam as the <u>Lov</u>er of man.

V. For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved.

As <u>King</u> of <u>heav</u>en and earth, You were voluntarily crucified in Your <u>love</u> for man. <u>Hell</u> was angered when it <u>met</u> You below. Adam rose seeing You, the Cre<u>a</u>tor, <u>un</u>der the earth. O <u>won</u>der! How has the Life of all <u>tast</u>ed death? You enlightened the <u>world</u> which cries:// O Lord, Who rose from the dead, <u>glo</u>ry to You!

V. Holiness befits Your house, O Lord, forevermore!

The <u>myrrh</u>bearing women came with <u>haste</u> to Your tomb, bearing myrrh and la<u>ment</u>ing. Not <u>find</u>ing Your most pure <u>bo</u>dy, they learned from the angel of the new and <u>glo</u>rious <u>won</u>der. They <u>told</u> the A<u>pos</u>tles:// "The Lord is risen, granting the world great <u>mercy</u>."

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 2 (from the Lenten Triodion)

Advancing from false doctrine to <u>true</u> faith, illumined with the light of <u>know</u>ledge, let us <u>clap</u> our hands and offer grateful praise to <u>God</u> in song! With due honor let us venerate the holy <u>ic</u>ons of Christ, of the all-pure Virgin, and of <u>all</u> the saints, de<u>pict</u>ed on walls or panels or sacred <u>ves</u>sels, rejecting the godless teaching of the <u>her</u>etics! For as Saint <u>Bas</u>il says: "The <u>hon</u>or shown to the image passes to its <u>pro</u>totype." By the prayers of Your pure Mother and of <u>all</u> the saints,//

we beseech You, O Christ our God, to grant us great mercy!

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 4 (Forefeast)

The Theotokos heard a tongue that <u>she</u> knew not, for the Archangel addressed to her the words of glad <u>tid</u>ings; therefore, ac<u>cept</u>ing the salu<u>ta</u>tion with faith, she conceived You, the pre-e<u>ter</u>nal God. And so, rejoicing exceedingly, we <u>also cry aloud</u> to You: "O God, made flesh from <u>her</u> without change,// grant peace to the world, and great <u>mer</u>cy to our souls!"

(at Great Vespers)

Tone 1 Troparion (*Resurrection*)

When the <u>stone</u> had been sealed by the <u>Jews</u>, while the soldiers were guarding Your most pure <u>bo</u>dy, You <u>rose</u> on the third day, O <u>Sav</u>ior, granting <u>life</u> to the world. The <u>pow</u>ers of heaven therefore cried to You, O <u>Giv</u>er of Life: "Glory to Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion, O Christ! <u>Glo</u>ry to Your <u>King</u>dom!// Glory to Your dispensation, O <u>Lov</u>er of mankind!"

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit,

Tone 2 Troparion (*Sunday of Orthodoxy*)

We <u>ven</u>erate Your most pure image, O <u>Good</u> One; and ask forgiveness of our transgressions, O <u>Christ</u> our God. Of Your own <u>will</u> You were pleased to ascend the <u>Cross</u> in the flesh and deliver Your creatures from bondage to the <u>En</u>emy. <u>There</u>fore with thankfulness we cry a<u>loud</u> to You: "You have filled all with joy, O our <u>Sav</u>ior,// by <u>com</u>ing to <u>save</u> the world."

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 4 Troparion (Forefeast)

Today is the prelude of joy for the <u>u</u>niverse! Let us anticipate the feast and celebrate with exul<u>ta</u>tion: Gabriel is on his way to announce the glad tidings to the <u>Virgin</u>; he is ready to cry out in fear and <u>won</u>der:// "Rejoice, O Full of Grace, the <u>Lord</u> is with you!" (at the Divine Liturgy)

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Tone 8 Kontakion (Sunday of Orthodoxy)

No one could de<u>scribe</u> the <u>Word</u> of the <u>Fa</u>ther; but when He took <u>flesh</u> from <u>you</u>, O Theotokos, He accepted to <u>be</u> described, and restored the <u>fallen image</u> to its former state by uniting it to divine <u>beauty.//</u> We confess and pro<u>claim</u> our sal<u>va</u>tion in words and <u>images</u>.

Tone 8 Kontakion (Forefeast)

You are the be<u>gin</u>ning of sal<u>va</u>tion for all of us on earth, Virgin <u>Mo</u>ther of God. For the great Arch<u>ang</u>el <u>Gab</u>riel, God's minister, was sent from heaven to stand

before you to <u>bring</u> you joy:// Therefore, we all <u>cry</u> to <u>you</u>: "Rejoice, O un<u>wed</u>ded Bride!" Tone 4 Prokeimenon (Song of the Fathers)

Blessed are You, O Lord God of our fathers, / and praised and glorified is Your Name forever! (Song of the three Holy Children, v. 3)

V. For You are just in all that You have done for us! (v. 4)

Epistle (329-ctr) Hebrews 11:24-26; 32-12:2

Tone 4

Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia!

V. Moses and Aaron were among His priests; Samuel also was among those who called on His Name. (Ps. 98:6)

V. They called to the Lord and He answered them. (Ps. 98:7a)

Gospel (5) John 1:43-51

(Instead of "It is truly meet...," we sing the following)

Hymn to the Theotokos

All of creation rejoices in you, O Full of Grace: the assembly of angels and the race of men. O sanctified temple and spiritual paradise, the glory of virgins, from whom God was incarnate and became a Child our God before the ages. Communion Hymn
