The Annunciation of our Most Holy Lady Theotokos and Ever-Virgin Mary Synaxis of the Archangel Gabriel, Vesperal Divine Liturgy of St. John Chrysostom

"Lord I Call..." Tone 3

Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me. Hear <u>me</u>, O Lord. Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me. Receive the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call</u> upon You.// Hear me, O Lord.

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>in</u>cense, and let the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice.// <u>Hear me</u>, O Lord.

- V. (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name!
- V. (9) The righteous will surround me; for You will deal bountifully with me.

Tone 3 *Idiomelon* (from the Lenten Triodion)

Let us perform a <u>spir</u>itual fast!
Let us <u>loose</u> every tie!
Let us flee from the <u>pit</u>falls of sin!
Let us forgive our <u>brother</u>'s debts
that our transgressions may also be forgiven!
Then we will be <u>a</u>ble to sing://
"Let my prayer arise in Thy <u>sight</u> as <u>in</u>cense, O Lord!"

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

Tone 8 (from the Lenten Triodion, by Joseph) (What shall we call you)

To <u>what</u> shall you be likened, O <u>wretched</u> soul? You are lazy in good deeds, but watchful for <u>e</u>vil! Repent, for <u>judg</u>ment is <u>at</u> the door: Cleanse yourself by prayer and <u>fasting</u>, and cry out to the <u>Mas</u>ter: "I have <u>sinned</u> against You;// pardon me in Your compassion and grant me for<u>give</u>ness!"

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

Your <u>lov</u>ing kindness is <u>wider</u> than the sea!
Dry up the sea of my evil and sin, O <u>Christ</u> my God, for You a<u>lone</u> are <u>sin</u>less.
Grant my heart compunction, and restrain the tempest of my <u>wick</u>edness that I may <u>sing</u> Your <u>praises</u> and glorify Your infinite compassion,//
O Benefactor of our souls Who are long-suffering!

V. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

Tone 8 (from the Lenten Triodion, by Theodore) (The Paradise of Eden)

You <u>lead</u> us through the time of the holy <u>Fast</u>, O God, and have enabled us to enter into its <u>sec</u>ond week. Grant, O <u>Lord</u>, that in the <u>weeks</u> to come we may run the race with <u>all</u> our might. Give our souls and bodies <u>grace</u> and strength that we may complete the <u>course</u> with <u>courage</u> and joy and come to the royal day of Resur<u>rec</u>tion,// that wearing crowns of victory we may ceaselessly <u>praise</u> You!

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

Tone 4* *Idiomela* (from the Menaion, for the Feast)

In the sixth month, the Archangel was sent to the pure <u>Virgin</u>; and with his <u>greeting</u> "Rejoice," he an<u>nounced</u> the good news that the Deliverer was to come <u>forth</u> from her. Therefore, having received the salu<u>tation</u> with faith, she conceived You, the <u>pre-eternal God</u>, Who were well-pleased ineffably to be<u>come</u> man// for the sal<u>vation</u> of our souls.

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

The Theotokos heard a tongue that <u>she</u> knew not, for the Archangel addressed to her the words of glad <u>tid</u>ings; therefore, accepting the salu<u>ta</u>tion with faith, she conceived You, the pre-e<u>ter</u>nal God. And so, rejoicing exceedingly, we <u>too</u> cry a<u>loud</u> to You: O God, made flesh from <u>her</u> without change,// grant peace to the world, and great <u>mer</u>cy to our souls!

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

Behold, our restoration has now been re<u>vealed</u> to us: in a manner beyond understanding, God is u<u>nit</u>ed to mankind; at the <u>voice</u> of the Archangel, de<u>lu</u>sion is destroyed, for the Virgin re<u>ceives</u> joy; things of the earth have be<u>come heaven; and the world is freed from the <u>ancient curse</u>. Let creation rejoice exceedingly and sing with <u>voi</u>ces of praise://"O Lord, our Maker and Deliverer, <u>glory</u> to You!"</u>

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

Tone 1[†] (from the Menaion, for the Archangel) (O all-praised martyrs)

<u>Ga</u>briel, the greatest of the <u>spi</u>ritual powers, shining with heavenly <u>bright</u>ness, who with the <u>hosts</u> on high gazes upon the light of the <u>Three</u>fold Sun, came to the Virgin and announced to her the good news of the divine and <u>awe</u>some <u>mys</u>tery,// and he intercedes for our souls.

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

The great <u>mys</u>tery till then unknown to the <u>angels</u> and hidden from all e<u>ter</u>nity has been con<u>fid</u>ed to you alone, O <u>Ga</u>briel; and you have come to Nazareth and entrusted it to <u>her</u> who a<u>lone</u> is pure.// Pray with her that our souls be granted peace and great <u>mer</u>cy!

V. He makes His angels spirits, and His ministers a flame of fire. (Ps. 103:5)

Tone 6 *(for the Feast, by John the Monk)*

The Archangel Gabriel was sent from <u>heaven</u>, to announce to the Virgin the good news of her con<u>ceiving</u>. And coming to Nazareth, he was filled with wonder at the <u>mir</u>acle, and reasoned with<u>in</u> himself:

"How is it that He Who dwells on high, Whom none can <u>com</u>prehend, is to be born of a <u>Virgin?</u>

How is He, Whose throne is Heaven and Whose <u>foot</u>stool is the earth, to be contained in the womb of a woman?

He upon Whom the six-winged Seraphim and the many-eyed Cherubim are not <u>a</u>ble to gaze

is well-pleased to be made flesh from her at a <u>single</u> word.

It is the Word of <u>God</u> Who is to come.

Why then do I hesitate, and not say to the <u>Maid</u>en:

'Rejoice, O Lady, full of grace, the Lord is with you!

Rejoice, pure Virgin!

Rejoice, Bride without Bridegroom!

Rejoice, Mother of the Life!//

Blessed is the <u>Fruit</u> of your womb!""

The Lord, strong and mighty! / The Lord, mighty in battle! (Ps. 23:8b)

V. The earth is the Lord's, and the fullness thereof. (Ps.23:1a)

Reading from Genesis (3:21-4:7)

Tone 6 Prokeimenon

Look upon me, and have mercy on me / for I am lonely and afflicted. (Ps. 24:16)

V. To You, O Lord, do I lift up my soul. (Ps.24:1)

Reading from Proverbs (3:34-4:22)

And two readings for the Feast:

Old Testament Readings

Exodus 3:1-8 (Theotokos)

Proverbs 8:22-30 (Theotokos)

The readings are followed by the Little Litany and the Trisagion, and the rest of the Liturgy of St. John Chrysostom.

Tone 4 Prokeimenon (Annunciation)

From day to day / proclaim the salvation of our God! (Ps. 95:2a)

V. Sing to the Lord a new song; sing to the Lord, all the earth! (Ps. 95:1)

(306) Hebrews 2:11-18 (Annunciation)

Tone 1

Alleluia, Alleluia!

V. He descends like rain upon the fleece, like raindrops that water the earth. (Ps. 71:6)

V. May His Name be blessed forever; may His Name continue as long as the sun! (Ps. 71:17)

Gospel

(3) Luke 1:24-38 (Annunciation)

(Instead of "It is truly meet...," we sing:)

The Hymn to the Theotokos

O earth, announce good tidings of great joy: O heavens, praise the glory of God!

Since she is a living Ark of God let no profane hand touch the Theotokos. But let the lips of believers unceasingly sing to her, praising her in joy with the angel's song: "Rejoice, O Lady, full of grace, the Lord is with you!"

The Lord has chosen Zion; He has desired it for His habitation. (Ps. 131:14) Alleluia, Alleluia!
