Ven. Hilarion the New Liturgy of the Presanctified Gifts (sung on Wednesday)

"Lord I Call..." Tone 1

Lord, I call upon You, hear me! Hear me, O Lord!
Lord, I call upon You, hear me!
Receive the voice of my prayer, when I call upon You!//
Hear me, O Lord!

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>incense</u>, and <u>let</u> the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an <u>evening sacrifice!//</u> Hear me, O Lord!

- **V.** (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name!
- **V**. (9) The righteous will surround me; for You will deal bountifully with me.
- V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

Tone 1 *Idiomelon* (from the Lenten Triodion)

Let us <u>keep</u> a spiritual fast, O <u>breth</u>ren! Let us speak no lies or de<u>ceit</u> with our tongue! Let us <u>not</u> give each other cause for <u>stum</u>bling, but by repentance let the lamp of our <u>soul</u> shine <u>bright</u>ly!// Forgive us our sins in Thy love for mankind!

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

Tone 1 (to the Martyrs)

O <u>Mar</u>tyrs, truly <u>wor</u>thy of praise, although you were dis<u>hon</u>ored on earth, the <u>heavens</u> re<u>ceived</u> you.
The gates of <u>Par</u>adise <u>opened</u> to you, and <u>now</u> you enjoy the <u>Tree</u> of Life.// Entreat Christ to grant us peace and His great <u>mer</u>cy!

V. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

Tone 3 (from the Lenten Triodion, by Joseph) (Great is the power of Your Cross)

Through the prayers of Your divine Apostles, O Lord, grant us to spend this time of fasting with compunction of heart,//that being saved we may glorify You, O compassionate One!

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

Great and awesome is Your <u>coming</u>, O Lord, when You will sit in righteous <u>judg</u>ment.

Despite my guilt, do not con<u>demn</u> me, O God,//but by the prayers of Your Apostles, <u>spare</u> me!

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

Tone 6 (from the Lenten Triodion, by Theodore) (Having placed all their hope)

O Apostles of Christ, lights for those born on earth, rich treasuries of the knowledge of God, by your holy prayers deliver from temptations us who praise you. Guide us safely through the course of the Fast, and keep our lives in peace, so that we may reach Christ's Passion unharmed// and with boldness offer hymns of praise to our God.

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

Tone 4* (from the Menaion, for Ven. Hilarion) (You have given a sign)

O Father, you lived as an angel on <u>earth</u> in the flesh. You acquired a life of <u>chas</u>tity, with <u>pa</u>tience, meekness and im<u>par</u>tial love, great abstinence, watchfulness, divine com<u>punction</u>, faith, true <u>hope</u>, and com<u>passion</u>,//
O blessed Hilarion, inter<u>ces</u>sor for our souls.

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

O <u>ven</u>erable one, you were an earthly angel and <u>heav</u>enly man, a <u>foun</u>tain of compunction, a stream of compassion, a deep well of <u>mir</u>acles. You are surety for <u>sin</u>ners, an olive tree of God with the fruit of your labors fitting to a<u>noint</u> the head.// We praise you in faith, O wondrous Hi<u>larion</u>.

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

Your mind was illumined with the <u>know</u>ledge of God, overcoming the <u>passions</u> of the flesh.

You did <u>not</u> participate in the <u>things</u> of this earth; you bore the true imprint of divine <u>good</u>ness; you were known to <u>all</u> to <u>be</u> like God through cooperation with the Holy <u>Spirit</u>,// our Father Hilarion, the adornment of the monastic life.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 4 (Theotokion)

With the showers of the all-holy <u>Spir</u>it, bedew my thoughts, O all-<u>pure</u> one! You gave <u>birth</u> to Christ, the <u>Dew</u>drop, Who by His compassion washes away the innumerable <u>sins</u> of mankind. Dry up the <u>spring</u> of my <u>pas</u>sions,// and by your supplications grant me an abundant stream of the <u>food</u> of life!

Tone 6 Prokeimenon

Be glad in the Lord, / and rejoice, O you righteous! (Ps. 31:11a)

V. Blessed is he whose transgression is forgiven. (Ps. 31:1a)

Tone 1 Prokeimenon

Let Your mercy, O Lord, be upon us / as we have set our hope on You! (Ps. 32:22)

V. Rejoice in the Lord, O you righteous! Praise befits the just! (Ps. 32:1)
