### APRIL 4 Ven. Joseph the Hymnographer Liturgy of the Presanctified Gifts (sung on Wednesday)

#### "Lord I Call..." Tone 4

Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! <u>Hear</u> me, O Lord! <u>Lord</u>, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! Receive the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call</u> upon You!// <u>Hear me</u>, O Lord!

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>incense</u>, and <u>let</u> the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice!// Hear me, O Lord!

- **V.** (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your name!
- V. (9) The righteous will surround me; for You will deal bountifully with me.
- V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

### **Tone 4** *Idiomelon* (from the Lenten Triodion)

Like the **Prod**igal,

I recklessly squandered my Father's <u>rich</u>es.

For<u>lorn</u> and destitute, I dwelt in a land of <u>e</u>vil men.

In my foolishness I became like the <u>sense</u>less beasts,

stripped of <u>all</u> divine grace.

But now I have returned and cry to You,

the compassionate and merciful Father://

"I have sinned, O God, but receive me in repentance, and have mercy on me!"

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

# **Tone 4** *(for the Martyrs)*

O <u>Mar</u>tyrs of the Lord,

living sacrifices, spiritual oblations,

perfect victims, sheep who know God and are known by Him,

whose fold no wolf can <u>en</u>ter;//

pray that we too may graze with you beside still waters!

**V.** (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

### **Tone 6** (from the Triodion, by Joseph) (Having placed all their hope)

O Apostles, eye<u>wit</u>nesses of God, rays of light from the <u>spir</u>itual Sun: entreat Him to enlighten our souls and deliver us from the dark night of <u>pas</u>sions!

Pray that we may see the day of sal<u>va</u>tion!

By your prayers and intercessions.

By your prayers and inter<u>ces</u>sions, may our hearts, which the Evil One has <u>wounded</u>, be cleansed, so that, saved by faith, we may always <u>hon</u>or you,// who save the world by your wise <u>preaching</u>.

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

Like the Prodigal, I wandered off into an evil land.

I recklessly squandered the riches that You gave me.

Now I pine with hunger, starved of good deeds.

Stripped of divine grace, I am clothed with the shame of sin.

I have sinned, and yet I know Your goodness.

Receive me as one of Your hired servants, O compassionate Christ,//by the prayers of the Apostles, who loved You!

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

# **Tone 6** (from the Triodion, by Theodore) (At the right hand of the Savior)

O Apostles of the <u>Sav</u>ior, lights of the world, its benefactors and its <u>sav</u>iors, like the heavens you tell the <u>glo</u>ry of God, adorned with stars of miracles and signs of <u>heal</u>ing. Fervently intercede before the <u>Lord</u> for us, that He may accept our prayers as <u>in</u>cense, and make us worthy to behold and kiss the life-giving <u>Cross</u> with fear! As we venerate Your Cross, O <u>Sav</u>ior,// send down on us great mercy in Your <u>love</u> for mankind!

**V.** (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

### **Tone 2** (from the Menaion, for Ven. Joseph) (Joseph of Arimathea)

You followed in the footsteps of the <u>Word</u> of God, Who created all from <u>nothingness</u>, shaking a<u>way</u>, as He commanded, love of <u>world</u>ly things together with love of all <u>passions</u>.
You took up the Cross on your <u>shoul</u>ders and were <u>crucified</u> to the <u>world</u>.
Therefore, O Father, shining forth with virtues through <u>god</u>ly works,// you received an eternal inheritance.

#### V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

You were revealed to be a mystical <u>trumpet</u>, calling all on high with <u>spir</u>itual hymns.
You were a di<u>vine</u>ly-sounded harp, praising the <u>ar</u>mies of God, glorifying all the saints and proclaiming their <u>vic</u>tories.
You drew a depth of words from the fountain of sal<u>va</u>tion,//enriching the <u>house</u> of God.

### **V.** (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

Crucified with love, you were shown to be a treasury of <u>vir</u>tues. Aflame with love and chanting <u>sa</u>cred hymns, you <u>sought</u> all those who were well-<u>pleasing</u> to God through their faith and re<u>pen</u>tance. By these you were yourself a participant in the divine <u>image</u>,// and were revealed as a partaker of <u>sweet</u>ness.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

### Tone 2 (Theotokion)

Rejoice, O Mary Theo<u>to</u>kos, Temple which can<u>not</u> be destroyed; Holy <u>Tem</u>ple, indeed, as the <u>Proph</u>et cries:// "Holy is Your Temple, wonderful in righteousness!"

#### Tone 4 Prokeimenon

I will trust in the mercy of God / for ever and ever. (Ps. 51:8b)

**V.** Why do you boast, O mighty man, of mischief done against the godly? (Ps. 51:1)
