Third Sunday of Great Lent, Veneration of the Cross Repose of St. Tikhon, Patriarch of Moscow and All Russia, Enlightener of North America

"Lord I Call..." Tone 3

Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me. Hear <u>me</u>, O Lord. Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me. Receive the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call</u> upon You.// Hear me, O Lord.

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>incense</u>, and let the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice.// <u>Hear me</u>, O Lord.

V. (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name!

Tone 3 *(for the Resurrection)*

By Your Cross, O Christ our <u>Sav</u>ior, death's dominion has been <u>shat</u>tered; the devil's de<u>lu</u>sion destroyed. The race of man, being <u>saved</u> by faith,//always offers You a song.

V. (9) The righteous will surround me; for You will deal bountifully with me.

All has been enlightened by Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion, O Lord. Paradise has been <u>opened</u> again. All creation, <u>prais</u>ing You,// always <u>of</u>fers <u>You</u> a song.

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

I glorify the power of the <u>Fa</u>ther and the Son. I praise the authority of the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit: the undivided, uncreated <u>God</u>head,// the consubstantial Trinity which <u>reigns</u> for<u>ever</u>.

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

Tone 5 (from the Lenten Triodion) (Rejoice, O Life-giving Cross)

Shine, O Cross of the Lord!

Illumine the hearts of those who honor you!

With love inspired by God, we embrace you, for you are the only hope of the world.

Through you our tears are wiped away, the snares of death are sprung, and we pass over into everlasting joy.

Through the Cross reveal Your beauty to us, O Lord!

Help Your servants who ask for mercy in faith!//

Bestow upon us the fruits of abstinence!

V. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

Rejoice, O life-bearing Cross:

bright paradise of the Church, the tree of incor<u>rup</u>tion!

You have obtained for us the joy of everlasting glory.

Through you, the hosts of demons are <u>driv</u>en out;

the choirs of angels are amazed and rejoice;

the company of the faithful gathers in celebration.

O unconquerable weapon, unbroken stronghold,

triumph of Orthodox Christians and pride of priests,//

by following you may we witness the Passion and Resur<u>rec</u>tion of <u>Christ</u> our God!

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

invincible triumph of godliness,
gate of Paradise, and protection of the faithful!

The Cross is the might of the Church,
through which corruption is abolished,
through which the power of death is crushed,
and we are raised from earth to heaven.

O invincible weapon, the adversary of demons,

the <u>glory</u> of martyrs, the true adornment of <u>ven</u>'rable saints,

and the haven of salvation,//

Rejoice, O life-bearing Cross:

which grants the world great mercy.

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

Tone 1* (from the Menaion, for St. Tikhon) (Joy of the Heavenly Hosts)

You en<u>dured</u> great suffering, O Father <u>Tikh</u>on: defamation, slander, and im<u>prisonment</u>; false accu<u>sations</u> and the <u>threat</u> of death, vicious attacks by the <u>en</u>emies of the <u>Church</u> of Christ. But you cou<u>rageously</u> and humbly endured these, <u>say</u>ing://"Despair not in your hearts, but have <u>faith</u> in the Lord!"

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

War, famine, and <u>civ</u>il strife were the burdens you bore, O our <u>Hi</u>erarch. Yet you <u>cried</u> to the enraged people, <u>say</u>ing: "Love your neighbor, and re<u>turn back</u> to the Lord!"// calling them onto the path of salvation through re<u>pentance</u>.

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

Your <u>life</u> was illumined by the light of your <u>great</u> deeds, which enlightened all the <u>faithful</u>, and destroyed the darkness of earthly <u>passions</u>; for you appeared as the <u>radiant sun</u>, O most <u>blessed Hierarch Tikhon</u>.

And now you abide in the heavenly <u>mansions</u> where the ever<u>lasting Light shines in glory</u> through the presence of the Son and the grace of the <u>Holy Spirit</u>. <u>There</u>fore, with ceaseless <u>hon</u>or and praise,// we venerate your holy and radiant <u>memory</u>.

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

Tone 6 *(from the Menaion, for St. Tikhon)*

You appeared as a light, O God-bearing <u>Fa</u>ther, chosen by the Holy Spirit and a<u>nointed</u> by God. And now you enter into the brilliance of the Holy of <u>Ho</u>lies; and being illumined by the Uno<u>riginate</u> Light, you ever partake of the Divine <u>Mys</u>teries as a truly glorified <u>Hi</u>erarch.//
Pray for the salvation of our souls!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 3 *(from the Lenten Triodion)*

Wishing to restore <u>all</u> men to life,
You accepted crucifixion, O <u>Christ</u> our God.
Burning with boundless <u>love</u> for man,
You took the quill of the <u>Cross</u> in Your hand;
dipping it in ink of royal <u>crim</u>son,
You signed our release with blood-stained <u>fingers</u>.
Though temptations as <u>sault</u> us,
may we never for <u>sake</u> You again!
Have mercy on Your despairing <u>people</u>,
O long-suffering <u>Mas</u>ter!//
Arise and fight Your enemies in Your al<u>mighty power!</u>

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen. **Tone 3** (Theotokion – Dogmatikon)

How can we not wonder at your mystical childbearing, O exalted Mother? For without receiving the touch of man, you gave birth to a Son in the flesh, O immaculate Virgin. The Son born of the Father before eternity was born of you at the fullness of time, O honored Lady. He underwent no mingling, no change, no division, but preserved the fullness of each nature. Entreat Him, O Lady and Virgin and Mother, to save the souls of those who, in the Orthodox manner, confess you// to be the Theotokos.

Your life-bearing Resur<u>rec</u>tion, O Lord, enlightened the whole universe, recalling Your cre<u>a</u>tion. Delivered from Adam's <u>curse</u>, we sing://

V. For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved.

You are the <u>change</u>less God,

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 1 (from the Menaion, for St. Tikhon)

"I <u>call</u> upon you, archpastors and <u>pas</u>tors,"
were the words of our holy Patriarch <u>Tikh</u>on.

"and <u>you</u>, my sons and my <u>daugh</u>ters in Christ,
to go forth into the world with the <u>mes</u>sage of re<u>pent</u>ance,
to stand <u>firm</u> against the <u>en</u>emies of our faith.
I call upon you to suffer together with me, remembering the words of the

Apostle://

'No one can separate us from the love of God!'"

Tone 4 *(from the Lenten Triodion)*

The humble <u>Da</u>vid defeated his enemies by Your <u>help</u>, O Lord.

Now <u>come</u> to the aid of Your Orthodox <u>people</u>; show us Your power as You <u>did</u> of old, and our adversaries will <u>know</u> that <u>You</u> are God!

And we will be victorious, for we <u>hope</u> in You.

Through the constant intercessions of Your all-pure <u>Mother</u>,//grant us Your great <u>mer</u>cy!

(at Great Vespers)

Tone 1 Troparion (St. Tikhon)

Tone 2 Kontakion (St. Tikhon)

A gentle manner adorned you:

you showed kindness and compassion to those who re<u>pented;</u> you were <u>firm</u> and unbending in confessing the <u>Or</u>thodox Faith, and zealous in <u>lov</u>ing the Lord.

O holy <u>Hier</u>arch of Christ and Confessor <u>Tikh</u>on, pray for us that we may not be separated from the <u>love</u> of God,//which is of Christ <u>Je</u>sus, our Lord!

Tone 7 Kontakion (Cross)

Now the <u>flaming</u> sword no longer guards the gates of <u>Eden</u>; it has been mysteriously quenched by the <u>wood</u> of the Cross. The <u>sting</u> of death and the victory of hell have been <u>van</u>quished; for You, O my Savior, have come and cried to <u>those</u> in hell:// "Enter again into <u>Par</u>adise!"

(Instead of the Trisagion, we sing:)

Before Your Cross, we bow down in worship, O Master, and Your holy Resurrection we glorify.

Tone 6 Prokeimenon (Cross)

O Lord, save Your people, / and bless Your inheritance! (Ps. 27:9a)

V. To You, O Lord, will I call. O my God, be not silent to me! (Ps. 27:1a)

Tone 1 Prokeimenon (St. Tikhon)

My mouth shall speak wisdom; / the meditation of my heart shall be understanding. (*Ps.* 48:3)
