Tone 5 *(for the Resurrection)*

By Your <u>pre</u>cious <u>Cross</u>, O Christ, You have put the <u>dev</u>il to shame. By Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion, You have blunted the <u>sting</u> of sin and <u>saved</u> us from the <u>gates</u> of death.// We glorify You, O <u>on</u>ly begotten One.

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

<u>Christ</u> was led as a sheep to the <u>slaughter</u> in order to grant Resurrection to the <u>human race</u>. The <u>princes</u> of hell were <u>fright</u>ened by this, for the <u>gates</u> of sorrow were <u>lift</u>ed. Christ the King of glory had <u>en</u>tered, <u>say</u>ing to those in <u>chains</u>: "Go forth!"// And to those in darkness: "Come to the light!"

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

O great wonder!

The Creator of the invisible suffered in the flesh in His <u>love</u> for man and <u>rose</u> again im<u>mor</u>tal.

Come, O sons of nations,

let us worship Him,

for delivered from error by His compassion,//

we have learned to sing of one <u>God</u> in three <u>Per</u>sons!

V. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

(Resurrection stichera by Anatolius)

We offer You our evening worship,

O never setting Light,

Who came in these last days to the world in the flesh;

Who even descended to hell to dispel its darkness.

Who has revealed the light of Resurrection to the <u>nations</u>.//

Glory to You, O Lord and Giver of light!

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

We <u>glorify</u> the Leader of our sal<u>va</u>tion; by His Resur<u>rec</u>tion from the dead, the <u>world</u> was <u>saved</u> from deceit. The as<u>sem</u>bly of Angels rejoices as the deceit of demons is <u>ov</u>erthrown.// Fallen Adam rises as the devil falls.

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

The guards were instructed by the <u>law</u>less ones:

"Hide the rising of Christ, take money and say:

'The body was stolen from the tomb while we were asleep.'"

But who has heard of a body being stolen,

a body embalmed and naked,

with its grave clothes left behind in the tomb?

Do not be deceived, O Jews,

study the words of the Prophets and understand://

Christ is the Redeemer of the world and all powerful!

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

Tone 6* (from the Lenten Triodion) (Having placed all their hope)

You stood before the <u>doors</u> of the Church, polluted with evil and unable to <u>en</u>ter. Accused by your own conscience, O <u>wise</u> one of God, you converted to a <u>bet</u>ter way of life. Looking upon the icon of the blessed <u>Moth</u>er of God, you condemned all your past sins, O Mother <u>Mary</u>,// and went to bow before the <u>pre</u>cious Cross.

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

Having worshipped at the holy places with <u>great</u> joy, you received saving grace for your journey of <u>vir</u>tue. You set out in haste to follow the <u>nar</u>row path, crossing the river <u>Jor</u>dan, and going to live where the <u>Bap</u>tist had dwelt. Through self-denial you tamed the savagery of the <u>pas</u>sions; through violence you broke the re<u>bel</u>lion of your flesh,//taking the Kingdom of <u>God</u> by force.

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

You lived alone in the <u>wil</u>derness, and as you erased the images of <u>sin</u> from your soul, God marked it with the imprint of <u>ho</u>liness. Filled with the spirit, O Blessed <u>Mo</u>ther, you walked on the surface of the <u>wa</u>ters; by your prayers you ascended from earth to <u>heav</u>en. Since you stand before Christ, O glorious <u>Mary</u>,// entreat Him with boldness to save our souls!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

The power of Your Cross has worked a <u>won</u>der, O Christ. Through it a harlot became a champion of the as<u>cet</u>ic life. She cast a<u>side</u> her weakness and bravely fought the <u>dev</u>il, and having won the prize of <u>vic</u>tory,// she ceaselessly <u>prays</u> for our souls.

Tone 5 (*Theotokion – Dogmatikon*)

In the Red Sea of old, a type of the Virgin Bride was prefigured. There Moses divided the waters; here Gabriel assisted in the miracle. There Israel crossed the sea without getting wet, here the Virgin gave birth to Christ without seed. After Israel's passage, the sea remained impassable; after Emmanuel's birth, the Virgin remained a Virgin. O ever-existing God Who appeared as Man,//O Lord, have mercy on us!

Aposticha

Tone 5 *(for the Resurrection)*

We <u>magnify</u> You in <u>songs</u> of praise,
O incarnate Christ and <u>Savior</u>.
By ac<u>cepting</u> the Cross and <u>death</u> for our sake,
as the <u>Lord</u> and <u>Lover</u> of man,
You overthrew the <u>gates</u> of hell,//
and arose on the <u>third</u> day, <u>saving</u> our souls.

V. The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty!

By being <u>pierced</u> in the side, O <u>Lov</u>er of man, You have poured out drops of life and sal<u>va</u>tion for all. By ac<u>cepting</u> death in the flesh, You have granted us immor<u>tal</u>ity. You have <u>freed</u> us by being <u>placed</u> in the tomb, and have resurrected us with Yourself in <u>glo</u>ry, as God.// Glory to You, O <u>Lord</u> and <u>Lov</u>er of man!

V. For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved.

Your crucifixion and descent into hell are awesome, O Lover of man. You have captured it, releasing the ancient prisoners. You have opened Paradise and given it to us.

Grant us purification of sins, who glorify Your Resurrection on the third day!

Make us worthy of Paradise// and save us, O Lover of man!

V. Holiness befits Your house, O Lord, forevermore!

For our <u>sake</u>, You accepted <u>death</u> in the flesh, to rise from the dead on the <u>third</u> day. <u>Heal</u> us from our earthly <u>passions</u>, and re<u>store</u> us from our evil trans<u>gressions</u>;// and save us, O Lover of man!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 2 (from the Lenten Triodion)

With the sword of <u>ab</u>stinence, you cut down the corrupt desires of your soul and the <u>pas</u>sions of your flesh. With the <u>si</u>lence of the wilderness you strangled your sinful <u>words</u> and thoughts. You watered the desert with the <u>streams</u> of your tears, and made the fruits of repentance to <u>grow</u> for us.// We celebrate your memory, O <u>ho</u>ly one.

Tone 2 (Theotokion)

A new miracle surpasses all ancient <u>miracles!</u>
Who knows of a Mother who gave birth with<u>out</u> a man, who <u>car</u>ried in her arms her Creator?
This birth is the <u>will</u> of God!
Since you carried Him as an infant in your arms, O most <u>pure</u> one, and since <u>you</u> possess motherly boldness be<u>fore</u> Him, do not cease praying for us who <u>hon</u>or you,//
that He may be bountiful and <u>save</u> our souls!

Tone 5 Troparion (*Resurrection*)

Revealing the <u>Resurrection</u> as God, do not despise the <u>work</u> of Your hand!

Reveal Your <u>love</u> for <u>man</u>, O Merciful One, and accept the Theotokos <u>pray</u>ing for us,//

and save the despairing people, O our Savior!

Tone 5 Troparion (Resurrection)

Tone 3 Kontakion (St. Mary of Egypt)

Having <u>been</u> a sinful <u>wo</u>man, you became through repentance a <u>bride</u> of Christ. Having attained angelic life, you defeated demons with the <u>weap</u>on of the Cross.// Therefore, O most glorious Mary, you are a <u>bride</u> of the <u>King</u>dom.

Tone 5 Prokeimenon (Resurrection)

You, O Lord, shall protect us / and preserve us from this generation forever. (*Ps.* 11:7)

V. Save me, O Lord, for there is no longer any that is godly! (Ps. 11:1a)

Tone 4 Prokeimenon (St. Mary of Egypt)

God is wonderful in His saints, / the God of Israel. (Ps. 67:35a)
